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About the Awards

Why Enter the BC Landscape Awards of Excellence?

The prestigious BC Landscape Awards of Excellence offer recipients an unparalleled opportunity to be recognized by peers, clients, and the broader green industry for exceptional projects and professional achievement. These awards showcase the creativity, expertise, and professionalism that continue to elevate BC's landscape industry while giving your team well-deserved recognition. Award recipients are featured through BCLNA publications, social media, the website, industry events, and other promotional opportunities throughout the year.

The BC Landscape Awards of Excellence include five categories representing different areas of landscape practice. Select the category that best reflects the primary focus of your project.

Projects may be entered in a maximum of two categories. Each submission must be tailored to the specific category and its requirements.

Category Overview

Installation

Recognizes excellence in the **installation and construction of landscape projects**, evaluating the successful integration of design, technical execution, horticulture, and craftsmanship.

Maintenance

Recognizes excellence in the **ongoing care of established landscapes**, evaluating horticultural practices, presentation, and the long-term performance of the site.

Design

Recognizes **innovative landscape designs** that balance creativity, functionality, technical expertise, and site-specific solutions.

Unique Feature

Recognizes projects centred on a **distinctive landscape feature** that demonstrates creativity, technical skill, or innovative use of materials and construction methods.

Landscape Lighting

Recognizes projects that demonstrate how **lighting enhances the landscape** through thoughtful design, technical excellence, and seamless integration, creating a safe and memorable nighttime experience while respecting the surrounding environment.

Green Stamp

The **Green Stamp** provides additional recognition for projects that demonstrate environmental stewardship and a commitment to sustainable landscape practices.

Entrants who wish to be considered should indicate their interest in the application, identify the environmental stewardship practices incorporated into the project, and provide a brief explanation of how those practices support the project's design, site conditions, and client objectives.

Projects may demonstrate environmental stewardship through practices such as:

- Sustainable design and construction practices
- Recycled or recyclable materials and protection of existing mature trees or vegetation



- Water conservation strategies, including smart irrigation, mulch, and rainwater use
- Native, climate-adapted, xeriscaping, or drought-tolerant plant selection
- FireSmart landscaping principles
- Eco-friendly features such as permeable paving, rain gardens, green roofs, or solar-powered elements
- Thoughtful integration of food-producing landscapes

The Green Stamp is awarded alongside the project's primary **Award of Excellence** and recognizes projects that foster environmentally and economically sustainable practices through thoughtful design, construction, or maintenance.

Judging & Awards

- Entries are judged **against a defined standard of excellence**, not one another. Multiple winners per category may be named but an award is not guaranteed.
- Judging is done anonymously and independently by a rotating panel of accredited industry professionals.
- Projects are evaluated using category-specific judging rubrics designed to recognize excellence in design, technical execution, creativity, environmental stewardship, and overall presentation.
- Judges may reclassify entries to a more appropriate category where applicable.

Award Levels

Projects are evaluated out of 100 points.

- 85 points and above = Award of Excellence
- 75 to 84 points = Finalist
- Below 75 points = No award

Grand Awards may be presented to projects demonstrating exceptional achievement beyond the Award of Excellence standard.

National Awards of Landscape Excellence (NALE)

Award recipients in eligible categories may be considered for advancement to the National Awards of Landscape Excellence (NALE), administered by the Canadian Nursery Landscape Association (CNLA). **BCLNA membership is required for national advancement.**

Eligibility & Entry Rules

Eligibility

- Open to all landscape professionals operating in British Columbia. BCLNA membership is not required to enter the BC Landscape Awards of Excellence.
- To be eligible, all required application information, supporting files, and submission fees must be received by the submission deadline.
- Entrants must obtain client permission before submitting a project.
- Projects must be primarily designed, installed, or maintained by the entrant.



Project Partners and Contributors

- If another company or individual made a significant contribution to the design, installation, or maintenance of the project, their permission must be obtained before submission.
- Please indicate which significant project partner(s), if any, should be recognized as co-entrant(s) in the awards program and on the award.
- Other contributors and subcontractors should also be identified within the application, including their role or area of work.

Project Eligibility

- Projects may be entered in a maximum of two categories, provided each submission is tailored to the specific category requirements.
- Projects that have previously received a BC Landscape Award of Excellence may not be re-entered in the same category. *(Maintenance entries are an exception.)*
- Eligibility timelines vary by category. Refer to the applicable category section for project age requirements.
- Artificial or faux plants are not permitted in any award category.

Submission Requirements

- Submission materials must remain anonymous for judging. Company names, logos, or other identifying information must not appear on photographs, videos, plans, or other materials reviewed by the judges.
- BCLNA reserves the right to request clarification or additional information to support the judging process.
- Projects that do not meet the submission requirements or category eligibility may be deemed ineligible or reclassified to a more appropriate category by the judges.

Project Contributors

- Designer (Installation category only)

Written Responses

Most categories require written responses that help judges understand your project and support BCLNA promotional activities.

Project Briefing: A concise overview highlighting the project's purpose, key features, and what makes it noteworthy.

Project Intent: Explains the vision, objectives, and approach behind the project.

Project Description: Provides the technical details judges need to evaluate the completed work.

Future Maintenance Plan (*Installation only*): Describes the recommended maintenance practices needed to preserve the project's long-term health, appearance, and success.

Environmental Stewardship (*Green Stamp applicants only*): Explain how the selected environmental stewardship practices support the project's design, site conditions, and client objectives.

Refer to the category section for the specific prompts, examples, and word limits for each response.



Upload Your Supporting Files

After submitting your application form, a BCLNA staff member will email you a secure upload link within one business day. If you do not receive your upload link, please contact angie@bclna.com.

You may upload or replace files until the submission deadline. After the deadline, the folder will remain available with view-only access.

All entries require:

- Company logo
- Photos
- Videos (optional)

Additional files may be required or recommended, depending on the category:

- Landscape plans or feature drawings
- Plant list
- Lighting plan
- Fixture schedule (optional)

Refer to your category section for specific upload requirements.

Photography & Video Guidelines

Judges can only evaluate what is presented through your submission. High-quality photography, video, and written responses help judges accurately assess your project while supporting BCLNA's promotion of award recipients.

Submission Requirements

Photography

- Accepted file types: **.jpg** or **.png**
- Minimum resolution: **1200 × 1200 pixels at 300 dpi**
- Maximum file size: **2 MB per image**
- Name files using the project stage and sequential numbering to help judges identify corresponding viewpoints.
 - Use the same number for photographs taken from the same viewpoint.

Video

- Maximum **30 seconds** per video.
- Videos may include background music but must not contain narration, commentary, or other identifying audio.

Refer to the applicable category section for the required number of photographs and videos.

Best Practices

Strong visual submissions help judges fully understand the quality, scale, and impact of your project.

Photography Tips

- Photograph the project from the same viewpoints before and after completion or during both daytime and nighttime conditions, where applicable.
- Consider how your project will appear during judging and the Awards Reception. Clean, well-composed images create a stronger presentation.
- Remove tools, hoses, vehicles, construction materials, puddles, and other distractions before taking photographs.
- Professional photography is strongly recommended.
- Drone photography may be included where it helps illustrate the overall layout and scale of the project.
- Prioritize photographs that help judges understand the overall project. Close-up photographs should only be included when they highlight a significant feature or detail that cannot be appreciated in an overview image.

Video Tips

- Move slowly through the landscape, allowing time to appreciate key spaces and features.
- Keep the camera steady and avoid rapid movements or frequent scene changes.



- Capture the project in lighting conditions that best showcase the completed work.



Award Categories

The BC Landscape Awards of Excellence recognize excellence across a range of landscape disciplines. Each category has its own eligibility requirements, submission of materials, and judging criteria. Review the category details carefully to ensure your project is entered in the most appropriate category.

Projects may be entered in a maximum of two categories; however, each submission must be tailored to the specific category requirements.

Installation

Category Description

Recognizes excellence in the installation and construction of landscape projects, showcasing quality workmanship, technical expertise, and the successful execution of the landscape plan from concept to completion.

Subcategories

Installation entries are first grouped by subcategory and may be further organized by project value to support the judging process.

- o Public Space
- o Small Space Garden
- o Interiorscaping

Project Eligibility & Timeline

- o Projects must have been **completed at least six months and no more than three years** before the submission deadline.
- o Projects completed in phases are eligible, provided a substantial portion of the installation was completed within the eligibility period.

National Awards Eligibility

Eligible subcategories: Single Family Residential, Multi-Family Residential, Commercial / Industrial

Maintenance entries are first grouped by subcategory and may be further organized by project value to support the judging process.

- Single Family Residential
- Multi-Unit Residential
- Commercial / Industrial
- Interiorscaping

Project Eligibility & Timeline

- The maintenance work being submitted must have been performed within the past **three years**.
- The entrant must have maintained the project for a minimum of **one year** before the photographs were taken.
- If previously awarded under a different contractor, it may be re-entered after 3 years of continuous maintenance by the current entrant.

Submissions Tips

These tips can help strengthen your submission and make it easier for judges to evaluate your project.

- **Choose the right time to enter.** Many landscapes continue to mature after installation. If your project remains within the eligibility period, consider whether an additional growing season will better showcase the finished landscape. Installation photographs can still be included to demonstrate the completed work.
- **Review your submission for anonymity.** Before submitting, have a second person review your written responses, photographs, videos, plans, and supporting files to ensure there are no company names, logos, or other identifying information visible to the judges.
- **Include comprehensive plans.** There is no limit to the number of plans or drawings you may upload. Additional plans, details, sections, elevations, lighting layouts, or other supporting drawings can help judges better understand the project.
- **Ask questions before the deadline.** If you are unsure about category selection, submission requirements, or the application process, contact Angie Miller Chamaa at angie@bclna.com or 604-575-3500 ext. 102. Questions are welcome, and early clarification can help avoid delays or incomplete submissions.
- **Submit early.** Completing your application before the deadline allows time to upload supporting files and resolve any last-minute questions or technical issues.
