This cross-curricular journey ties in Science, Math, ICT, and Art, encouraging hands-on learning through design, logic, and problem-solving. Each project is guided by a 4Cs rubric – fostering Creativity, Collaboration, Communication, and Critical Thinking.

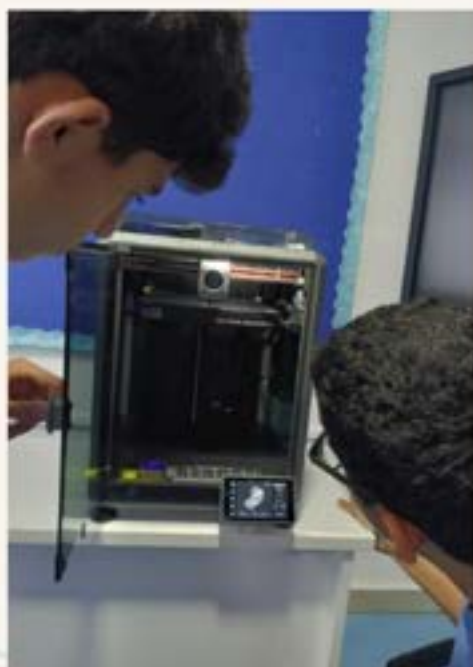
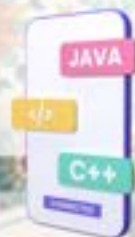

## Coding, Creating, and Taking Flight



Exploring innovation through coding and design! Our young innovators at AAS School took learning to new heights by programming drones and creating custom models using 3D printers. As part of our STEM and Innovation Classes, students learned how to code drone flight paths, troubleshoot challenges, and apply design thinking to bring their 3D creations to life. This hands-on experience is integrated with core subjects such as Science (understanding flight, forces, and materials), Math (using measurements, angles, and coding logic), and PE (connecting movement and coordination through drone control). Projects are assessed using rubric-based evaluations, empowering students to reflect on their growth in critical 21st-century skills like creativity, communication, collaboration, and problem-solving. In support of the UAE's Year of Community, these lessons also nurture life skills such as innovation, perseverance, and teamwork—preparing students to lead and contribute in a rapidly evolving world.
