

Karimu fights poverty by trusting the poor to understand what they need.

Dear Friend of Karimu,

We wanted some good news before sending this newsletter—and now we have it!

Clean water is finally being piped to within easy walking distance of 15,000 people in the Tanzanian villages Karimu serves. Children as young as eight—mainly girls—are no longer forced to miss school in order to walk many miles every day to carry water to their homes. We wish you could have been with us this summer as the water project neared completion and hundreds of people swarmed over us in celebration.

Karimu sends heartfelt thanks to hundreds of individuals and a handful of grantors for the almost \$300,000 that funded this project, and to our Chief Operating Officer, Nelson Mattos, who spearheaded the fundraising.

The project involves six miles of underground pipes, three huge waterstorage tanks, and faucets in sixty-five public locations.

We were also honored to take part in the inauguration of Bacho Primary School after its reconstruction from the ground up. Bacho Primary had been a nearly unusable eyesore, but attendance has risen dramatically since its rebuilding. Karimu volunteers helped landscape the grounds for presentation of the new school to distinguished representatives of the

Tanzanian government.

Karimu's June/July trip to Tanzania followed a visit in March by President Marianne Kent-Stoll, Treasurer Don Stoll, and Nelson Mattos. In applying Karimu's principle that the poor understand their needs better than outsiders can, they met with dozens of locals to work on Karimu's five-year Strategic Plan. Jasson Kahembe, Chair of Karimu's newly registered Tanzanian Board, led the planning.

The local people made it clear that sanitation and education for all children, including girls, are their highest priorities. Karimu therefore pursued a Girls Empowerment Campaign (https://tinyurl.com/yaxftj8q)—just funded by a single generous donor's gift of \$55,000—to build new girls' toilets and add private washrooms to existing toilets, thus preventing large numbers of girls from missing a week of school every month.

Two Matching Grants

In support of the projects crucial to the villagers, the Santa Cruz business Quantaphy is again offering a \$20,000 matching grant, good through December 31, and Nelson and Claudia Mattos are offering a \$50,000 matching grant for the same period.
