

## Meeting Your Responsibilities as a Senior Manager under SMCR

### Course outline and objectives

Ever since assuming their powers in 2013, the PRA and FCA have clearly signaled, and acted upon, their intention to subject senior management to a more intense and intrusive level of scrutiny. The Senior Manager & Certification Regime applies across all regulated firms. Fines and actions against individuals are beginning to pick up, along with a broader focus on the actions of senior management and how they translate into the day-to-day running of firms.

The regime has two key aspects which are both examined in this course:

- **The implementation of the regime itself within the firm**
- **What Senior Management needs to do in order to show the essence of the regime is at the heart of governance**

While implementation of the new regime may be complex, the consequences of failing to comply with the enhanced requirements are likely to be damaging for the approved individual and highly disruptive for the organisation.
