
Lessons learned


- **Don't cache the cache**
- In distributed systems, application state is your enemy
- If it's "sophisticated", you probably shouldn't be doing it
 - **Development** ≠ **production**


Data Complications




Lessons learned

- **Data should be free of code dependencies**

 - **Beware of smelly blobs**


Evaluating Yourself to Death







Formalism and Common Sense as Orthogonal Concepts





 - **Beware all things "meta"**


