Ukiyo-e is a traditional Japanese art form that emerged during the Edo period (1603 to 1868) and is still beloved across the globe to this day. This book carefully examines its multifaceted appeal through its masterpieces.

The book includes 115 representative works by 55 renowned ukiyo-e artists, from *bijin-ga* (portraits of beautiful women) by Harunobu and Utamaro, *yakusha-e* (actor prints) by Sharaku, landscape paintings by Hokusai and Hiroshige, *giga* (satirical prints) by Kuniyoshi, to *shin hanga* (new prints) by Hasui.

Each work is accompanied by a detailed explanation of the historical background, techniques, and the meaning behind its motif.

The book is structured in a way that readers will naturally learn about the personalities of the artists and the history of ukiyo-e through their masterpieces, making it perfect both as an introductory guide to art appreciation and as an informational nonfiction book.

Toshusai Sharaku

Date of birth and death unknown

Between May of 1794 and the New Year of the following year, ukiyo-e artist Sharaku left more than 140 artworks through the publisher Tsutaya Juzaburo. His works can be divided into four periods, and particularly in the first period, all prints were in large format with black mica printing for the backgrounds—28 yakusha okubi-e (large-headed portraits of actors) in total—published all at once. It was an unprecedented innovative project by Tsutaya. The second period was made up of only full-body portraits, while from the third period onward, most of the prints were smallformat vakusha-e (actor prints), marking a significant change in publishing format and style. While his artistic style was based on the traditional vakusha-e painting techniques of the Katsukawa school, he had his own painting style. It is believed that his portraval of faces was influenced by Kamigata artist Ryukosai Jokei and his portrayal of bodies by Torii Kiyonaga. There are many theories surrounding Sharaku's true identity, but in recent years, the theory that he was actually Saito Jurobei, a Noh actor from Awa Province. has gained traction.

Sharaku's unforgettable masterpiece

Against the dark background of black mica, the characteristic facial features of Ichikawa Ebizo I stand out. Together with his easygoing expression, the painting leaves a strong impression. It took inspiration from the materials gathered in May of 1794 from the play Koi Nyobo Somewake Tazuna performed at the Kawarazaki theater. The former name of Ichikawa Ebizo I was Ichikawa Danjuro V. Since taking on the name Danjuro in November of 1770, he led the Kabuki scene in Edo and was depicted in numerous yakusha-e as one of the most prominent actors of the day. He played the role of Takemura Sadanoshin, a Noh actor working for the Yurugi family

Portraying the stylish performance of Koshiro

Matsumoto Koshiro IV is said to have been a handsome actor with good character and eloquence. Manly characters, such as the one depicted in this illustration, are roles that Koshiro excelled at. Sharaku masterfully captures the stylish aura of the actor, who is holding a pipe with a handkerchief wrapped around his head. This illustration was based on the materials Sharaku gathered in May of 1794 from the play Katakiuchi noriyaibanashi performed at the Kiriza theater. Koshiro's character informs the sisters Miyagino and Shinobu, who wish to avenge their father, about the existence of their enemy, Shiga Daishichi, who is engaged in merrymaking.

Waves and Mt. Fuji

The Contrast Between Movement and Stillness

Among the 46 prints of the series Thirty-Six Views of Mount Fuji, which depicts Mount Fuji from various locations throughout Japan, this is the most recognized one in the world. It perfectly captures the moment a giant, towering wave is about to come crashing down. There is nothing those on board the ferry can do, except cling desperately to the vessel and surrender themselves to the ruthlessness of nature. Beyond the great wave stands snow-capped Mount Fuji in the distance. The stark contrast between the raging wave and the calming presence of Mount Fuji is the highlight of this masterpiece by Hokusai.

Scared of crossing it?! A suspension bridge in the midst of a stunning view.

Part of a collection comprised of 11 prints depicting unique bridges from all over Japan. Hietsu refers to the border between Hida (northern Gifu Prefecture) and Etchu (Toyama Prefecture). In the picture, a woodcutter couple can be seen crossing the suspension bridge without handrails, as if tightrope walking in a circus. Despite the bridge sinking under their weight, they seem quite accustomed to it. There is no sign of anxiety for their precarious footing as they walk calmly. In the distance, clouds are gathering against the backdrop of navy blue mountaintops soaring above, creating an otherworldly, stunning vista. Given the mystical nature of the scenery, it must have been inspired by Hokusai's own imagination to a degree.
