





Totto-chan gets only 15 soybeans to eat in a day. Her mother puts them in an envelope for her to take to school. She has to ration them for herself, even through the stress of waiting in an air-raid shelter after the siren goes off during class. On the way home, she wonders if her house will even still be standing, but thankfully she arrives home to find her family waiting for her, and she can eat the rest of her soybeans for dinner.


















Atsuko Asano
