CHANGES IN ADULT

EDUCATION.

A COMPREHENSIVE LOOK AT THE INTERNATIONAL REQUIREMENTS OF FURTHER EDUCATION AND ITS PAIN POINTS IN THE AGE OF DIGITALISATION.

Education is in high demand, especially among adults. For many people, lifelong learning is the be-all and end-all. And it's the key factor driving further education. But for what purpose do people want to continue their education now-adays? First and foremost, it's about personal development. But one in two people would also like to continue their education in a professional context. The main goal here is to develop professionally and keep up with technological advancements and the topics of the future.

So there is generally a high level of interest in further education. Two thirds already know exactly what knowledge they want to acquire. By contrast, one third do not know exactly what further education opportunities are actually available. What's problematic is that 40 % of the respondents who have already specifically looked into further education courses were unable to find any opportunities that were suitable for them. The reasons for this? The content of the courses on offer does not exactly match the further education they are looking for – and

they also feel that the courses are not flexible enough.

Once these hurdles are overcome, the feedback is quite positive: two thirds of those surveyed internationally have had very good experiences with further education. The reasons for the positive feedback were, in particular, the content of the further education programme and the specialist support.

Increasing digitalisation also plays a major role in further education. Nowadays, online teaching is the clear preference. In particular, students want online teaching with flexible lessons.

All in all, digital further education courses are more relevant than ever before. They offer students the opportunity to integrate personal and professional further education and development into their everyday (working) lives in a modern and individual way. And they want to be able to do this remotely and flexibly.

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FURTHER EDUCATION. A PERSONAL MATTER.

Further education is important, there's no doubt about that. Even though one in two people would like to continue their education for professional reasons, there is one thing that is most important to the majority of respondents, and that is personal further education – regardless of their profession.

Simply because they are interested

in a particular subject.

POSITIVE EXPERIENCES.

More than two thirds of those surveyed have already had very good experiences with further education. For more than half, the curriculum perfectly matched their own personal goals. The quality of the learning content and the professional approach of the specialist staff also ranked highly among 46.9% of respondents.

INFORMATION IS EVERYTHING!

Well over half of those surveyed internationally have already found suitable further education courses. The rest are still looking. Those who have already looked into it but have not yet found anything are primarily concerned about the lack of flexible courses with suitable content.

MORE FLEXIBILITY WITH ONLINE LEARNING.

Even further education is influenced by current trends: online teaching is generally preferred internationally.

Best of all with flexible, self-determined scheduling or in a virtual classroom online at fixed times.

In contrast, only very few people want face-to-face teaching.

ADDED VALUE SHOULD NOT BE EXPENSIVE.

Flexibility, quality, individuality – we expect a lot from further education, especially when it comes to expanding soft skills. However, most people are not prepared to spend a lot of money on private further education. Students in European countries are somewhat more willing to do this than in other countries, but even here, the maximum they are willing to pay is €500.

THE MEANING AND PURPOSE OF UPSKILLING.

A PERSONAL MATTER.

PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT COMES FIRST.

The majority plan to continue their personal education – without any professional background, but on very specific subjects that interest them. One in two would also like to continue their education professionally.




FURTHER EDUCATION? IT'S VERY IMPORTANT.

How important do you personally consider it to undertake further education / further training to extend your knowledge on a regular basis?



AND WHAT REASONS SPEAK AGAINST IT? THE TOP FOUR REASONS ARE...



The main reason for not pursuing private further education is that the costs are too high. Almost a quarter say that further education is not an option for them because of their age. In third place is a lack of time. There is also a lack of concrete personal benefits among those who have no interest in private further education.


Another reason is that they already have the necessary skills and therefore do not need further education.

INTEREST IN PRIVATE PROFESSIONAL TRAINING? **GENRALLY HIGH.**

More than 40% are interested in private further education and have already looked into specific options. Precisely one third are interested but do not know exactly what options are available to them.


What do you think about private professional training, i.e. further training that is organised and financed completely by you and not by your employer?








A little more than a third would like to pursue professional development. One in five would like a change of direction. Advances in technology play an important role when it comes to further education courses. Especially as a way to prepare for future tasks.

** Here, too, it is clear that for respondents from emerging nations, professional change/development is even more important: India (54.7%), Pakistan (49.2%), Nigeria (47.0%).



Have you ever participated in any further training/further education programmes you really liked? * In %




QUALITY THAT INSPIRES. AND MATCHES PERSONAL GOALS.

For more than half of those surveyed internationally, the curriculum perfectly matched their own personal goals. The quality of the learning content and the professional approach of the specialist staff also ranked highly among 46.9% of respondents. Many were also impressed by the support during their course. **Flexibility was another plus point.** 27.4% said they liked the fact they could study independently – whenever and wherever they wanted.

Skill gaps and shortages of skilled workers are also an increasing challenge worldwide. Proper upskilling and reskilling plays a key role in all economic systems. But when it comes to individualisation, learning formats and how they are combined are also important points. There are now many innovative formats that make high-level education easily accessible. This helps to get even more people interested in further education and to combat skills gaps and the shortage of skilled workers.




WELL INFORMED. BUT NO LUCK.

Almost 40 per cent of those who have already looked into it have not yet found a suitable course in terms of content. They are also concerned about the lack of flexible courses that fit their circumstances. Another quarter have not yet looked for specific courses. One in five also feels that the costs are too high.


Why have you not found any suitable offers so far?

FLEXIBILITY? PLAYS AN IMPORTANT ROLE!

ACHIEVE A LOT. WITHIN A SHORT TIME.


The international respondents prefer single courses in particular. **60**% want individual courses that last a maximum of two months and do not involve more than 10 or 20 hours of work per week. Around 30% think it is okay if the training only lasts one day. But 33.9% of respondents also see longer-term courses, such as certificates, as a possible option. This option is preferred by respondents in India (49.0%) and Brazil (40.0%) in particular.


Imagine a training program that is as flexible as possible and can be carried out online whenever you want and at your own pace. To what extent could you imagine undertaking further training?

TIME INVESTED IN FURTHER EDUCATION.

Just over a third of respondents are able to invest up to five hours a week in further education, while a quarter are able to invest up to eight hours. There is a preference for a smaller amount of learning over several days rather than a large amount over just a few days. As far as the time of day is concerned, 54.8% prefer the evening hours. It is also convenient for many at weekends (25.4%) and during the day (26.7%).

CONTENT IN REAL TIME.

Around 60% of those surveyed internationally consider it important that further education content is taught live. Both flexible online teaching and events at fixed times are popular.


How important is it to you that educational content is conveyed to you in real time (live)?


NETWORKING IS PREFERRED.

A large proportion of respondents generally value contact with other course participants. Online networking is a particularly important requirement on an international level.



STRUCTURES AND SUPPORT ARE IMPORTANT.

A predefined structure, professional learning support and exchange with like-minded people are most important for the international respondents. This is followed by a permanent contact person and help with personal time management in order to make learning as efficient as possible.



Direct contact and professional exchange are important for the individual learning process.

Through the questions and perspectives of others, students not only learn the course content, but also basic skills for life. A clear structure and regular feedback provide peace of mind. This is just as true in further education as it is in working life.

MORE OFFERS. FOR INDIVIDUAL SUCCESS.

Almost half of the respondents would like to receive individual advice to help them find a suitable further education course. This is primarily in order to adapt the course even more closely to the students' existing skills and personal goals. International respondents in particular also place job application training, career coaching, networking and professional support at the top of their wish list.

Just under a third would like to receive a certificate for passing a final test. Only after that comes a certificate confirming successful participation.





Spain, Italy, France, Poland, India, Pakistan, Nigeria, South Africa, Brazil and Mexico.





PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE INCLUDED.

The majority of respondents are in employment. There are also a number of self-employed people among the respondents (17.8%).


What is your professional position?

Where do you live? * In %






