

(LEGL 4200) Business Law

Course Description

This course will introduce students to the basic tenets of the legal system in the world market from a North American perspective. Using the case method, this course examines the foundational elements of business law, including dispute settlement procedures; corporate organizations; investment; domestic and international trade; contracts; intellectual property protection; and product liability. Students will learn how to identify and analyze critical legal issues and will develop a broad understanding of international business law.

Learning Objectives

By the end of this course, students will be able to:

- Explain general sources, purposes, and structures of law in the business context.
- Apply tort and contract law in a business context.
- Articulate the basic principles of business organizations, including sole proprietorships,
- partnership, and incorporation.
- Describe property issues in business, including real estate interests, intellectual property, and personal property.
- Discuss the basic legal principles of employment.
- Explain dispute resolution, including international business dispute resolution.
- Analyze a variety of legal risks in common business circumstances, from the commencement of a business to securing a location, hiring staff, purchasing supplies, and selling goods or services.
