

3. Safety Information

- Operation is subject to the following two conditions: (1) This device may not cause harmful interference, and (2) this device must accept any interference received, including interference that may cause undesired operation.
- To prevent eye damage and personal injury, do not look into the laser. Do not point the laser directly at people or animals or indirectly off reflective surfaces.
- Do not disassemble or modify the thermal device.
- Do not point the imager (with or without the lens cover) at intensive energy sources, e.g. devices that emit laser radiation, or the sun. This can affect the accuracy of the camera, and cause damage to the detector.
- Do not use the imager in an ambient temperature outside of the operation range. High/low temperatures can cause damage to the device.
- Always charge the battery in the special temperature range. The
 temperature range to charge the battery is 0 °C to 40 °C (32 °F to 104 °F).
 Charging the battery at temperatures outside this range can cause the

- After the eyepiece is used for long time, its contrast will be lowered, and the scene will be whitened. You can switch to the LCD display, and switch back to the eyepiece some time later.
- Storage: If you do not use the imager for a long period of time, put the device in a cool and dry environment. Batteries should be stored in an ambient temperature of -20 °C to 20 °C (-4 °F to 67.9 °F). Lithium batteries will discharge time and should be fully charged before storage. It is recommended to fully recharge the batteries every 3 months to prevent damage. Store the device in an ambient temperature of -40 °C to 70 °C (-40 °F to 158 °F).

7. Quick Start Instructions

7-1 Tripod Setup

Α.

Mount the fully charged T-Cam to a tripod using the ¼-20 mount located on the bottom of the device handle.



MAKE SURE TRIPODS DO NOT BLOCK THE DIRECT PATH OF PERSON(S) TO BE IMAGED TO ENSURE THE EQUIPMENT WILL NOT BE MOVED OR KNOCKED DOWN. USING A DIVIDING BARRIER WILL HELP KEEP TRIPODS SEPARATE FROM THE PATH.

TURN ON THE CAMERA BY PRESSING AND HOLDING THE POWER BUTTON FOR AT LEAST TWO SECONDS.

B.

Power on device.



PRESS AND HOLD THE POWER BUTTON FOR MORE THAN 5 SECONDS TO SHUT DOWN THE CAMERA.

THE THERMAL IMAGER NEEDS SUFFICIENT WARM-UP TIME FOR THE MOST ACCURATE TEMPERATURE MEASUREMENTS AND BEST IMAGE QUALITY. THIS TIME CAN OFTEN VARY BY ENVIRONMENTAL CONDITIONS. IT IS BEST TO WAIT A MINIMUM OF 10 MINUTES FOR THE DEVICE TO COMPLETELY WARM-UP.


7-2 Battery Installation

MAKE SURE TO HOLD THE CAMERA FIRMLY IN BOTH HANDS WHEN REMOVING OR REPLACING BATTERY OR ATTACHING OR REMOVING THE BATTERY BAY COVER.

Hold the camera firmly in both hands placing a thumb on the grip lines.

Press the grip lines firmly to create a gap.






Keep pressing the grip lines and pull battery cover up to remove it.

Ensure metal contacts are aligned, then push battery into battery bay.





DO NOT FORCE THE BATTERY INTO THE BATTERY BAY. IF USER FEELS SIGNIFICANT RESISTANCE REMOVE THE BATTERY AND ENSURE METAL CONTACTS ARE ALIGNED BEFORE TRYING TO PLACE BATTERY INTO THE BATTERY BAY.



To replace a battery held in the battery bay push the battery buckle. Battery will be ejected.


Pressing the grip lines, align battery cover to battery bay and press the cover toward the device.



7-3 Memory Card Installation

Α.

Insert the Micro-SD Card into the top of the T-Cam device until a clicking sound is heard.




DO NOT FORCE MICRO-SD CARD INTO THE SLOT. THE SIDE OF THE CARD WITH CONTACT PINS MUST BE INSERTED FIRST. IF THERE IS RESISTANCE FLIP THE CARD AROUND AND TRY AGAIN. TO EJECT THE MEMORY CARD PRESS UNTIL A CLICK IS HEARD AND THEN RELEASE. MEMORY CARD WILL BE EJECTED.

7-4 Charging Instructions: Option 1

A. B.

While a battery is inside the device, plug the USB Type-C end of the USB cable into the top of the T-Cam device.

Plug the other end of the USB cable into an available USB port on a computer.



WHEN USING A COMPUTER FOR CHARGING THE COMPUTER SHOULD BE POWERED ON. CHARGE THE BATTERY FOR A MINIMUM OF 3 HOURS BEFORE USING FOR THE FIRST TIME.

ICI DOES NOT RECOMMEND CHARGING THE DEVICE WHILE IT IS ON A TRIPOD. LAY DEVICE FACE DOWN ON A FLAT AND STABLE DESK OR TABLE WHILE CHARGING.

ENSURE THE IMAGER IS NEAR ROOM TEMPERATURE BEFORE CHARGING THE DEVICE. DO NOT CHARGE IN EXTREMELY HOT OR COLD AREAS. THE BATTERY CAPACITY MAY BE DECREASED IF CHARGED IN AN EXTREME TEMPERATURE ENVIRONMENT.

IF YOU DO NOT USE THE IMAGER FOR A LONG PERIOD OF TIME, PUT THE DEVICE IN A COOL AND DRY ENVIRONMENT. THE BATTERY WILL DISCHARGE OVER TIME; THEREFORE, THE IMAGER SHOULD BE CHARGED OCCASIONALLY TO PREVENT DAMAGE TO THE BATTERY OR THE DEVICE.

7-5 Charging Instructions: Option 2

REMOVE THE BATTERIES FROM THE DEVICE TO FOLLOW THIS METHOD OF CHARGING.

Plug the USB Type-C end of the USB cable into the battery charger.

Plug the other end of the USB cable the power adapter.

C.

Insert batteries into battery charger.

Plug power adapter into a 110/120V electrical outlet.

WHEN THE BATTERY IS NOT PLACED IN THE CHARGER THE INDICATOR LIGHT FLASHES. THE LIGHT TURNS RED WHEN THE BATTERY IS PLACED AND CHARGING. WHEN THE BATTERY IS FULLY CHARGED THE LIGHT TURNS GREEN.

8. Operation Instructions

8-1 How to Charge the Battery

Before using the imager for the first time, charge the battery for a minimum of 5 hours. The battery status is shown by the indicator in the upper-right corner of the screen.

8-1-1 Charging via Type-C Cable

- 1. Plug the Type-C end of the cable into the T-Cam Device.
- 2. Plug the USB end of the Type-C cable into a computer.
- 3. Turn computer on to start charging.

8-1-2 Charging via Power Adapter (not included)

- 1. Select a charger with 5V 1A or 5V 2A output.
- 2. Plug the Type-C cable into the T-Cam Device.
- 3. Plug the USB end of the Type-C cable into the power adapter.
- 4. Plug the power adapter into a 110v/120V electrical outlet.

ENSURE THE IMAGER IS NEAR ROOM TEMPERATURE BEFORE CHARGING THE DEVICE. DO NOT CHARGE IN EXTREMELY HOT OR COLD AREAS. THE BATTERY CAPACITY MAY BE DECREASED IF CHARGED IN AN EXTREME TEMPERATURE ENVIRONMENT.

8-2 Power On/Off the Device

To turn the camera on, push and hold the Power button for two seconds. Please wait patiently as it can take up to a minute for the heads up display to load.

Repeat and hold for more than 3 seconds to turn the device off.



8-3 Power On/Off the Laser

To turn the laser on, press the Power button. Repeat to turn the laser off.

8-4 User Interface

8-5 Open the Main Menu

Users can access the Main Menu by pressing the OK button or tapping anywhere on the touchscreen display.

8-6 Close the Main Menu

Close the Main Menu by pressing the Previous button or tapping anywhere on the touchscreen display.

8-7 Capture an Image or Video

Save images and videos as follows:

- 1. Find and aim the thermal device at the target.
- 2. Adjust the focus ring till the image is clear.
- 3. Pull the Shutter Trigger button to take a photo. Press and hold the trigger button to start recording a video; a recording icon will appear in the bottom right corner. Finish recording by releasing the Shutter Trigger button.
- Name the image. Using the touchscreen, open the keyboard by tapping the image name. Use the keyboard by tapping the touchscreen to input desired name.
- 5. Press the OK button to confirm the name or tap Enter on the touchscreen.
- Press the OK button to save the image or video. Press the Previous button to cancel.

Images are captured and stored in the JPG format and videos in the H264 format.

IN AUTO SAVE MODE, PULLING THE SHUTTER TRIGGER SAVES IMAGES/VIDEOS AUTOMATICALLY. IMAGES/VIDEOS ARE NAMED A DEFAULT FILE NAME. IN THE MANUAL SAVE MODE, THE USER MUST CONFIRM OR CANCEL SAVES MANUALLY. AUTO AND MANUAL MODES CAN BE SWITCHED ON OR OFF IN THE SETTINGS.

8-8 Adding Voice Annotations to an Image or Video

Users can add voiced notes to images and videos using the built-in noise canceling microphone. Add annotations to an image as follows:

- 1. Capture an image or video.
- Using the touchscreen, tap the microphone icon. A tool tip on-screen will denote recording is happening.
- Speak clearly, directly, and loudly into the microphone located at the top right of the touch screen.
- 4. Tap the microphone icon again to stop recording.
- Name the image. Using the touchscreen, open the keyboard by tapping the image name. Use the keyboard by tapping the touchscreen to input desired name.
- 6. Press the OK button to confirm the name or tap Enter on the touchscreen.
- 7. Press the OK button to save the image or video. Tap the arrow on the touchscreen to cancel saving.

Audio files are saved separately from images and videos in the AAC format and cannot be played on the T-Cam device. Remove the MicroSD card and insert it into a computer with an application that can play AAC format files to review notes.

8-9 Review Images or Videos

When an image or video is captured it will be stored to the MicroSD card. Media can be viewed at any time as follows:

- 1. Press the Review button to enter the library.
- 2. Use the Navigation buttons to select the image or video to review.
- 3. Press the OK button to view the image or video in full screen. Use the Navigation buttons to cycle left or right between images and videos.
- 4. Press the Previous button twice to exit the menu and return to the imaging interface.

8-10 Playing Videos

Videos can be played at any time as follows:

- 1. Press the Review button to enter the library.
- 2. Use the Navigation buttons to select the video to play.
- 3. Press the OK button to view the video in full screen.
- Tap the touchscreen to play the video. Exit play mode by pressing the Previous button.
- Press the Previous button twice to exit the menu and return to the imaging interface.

8-11 Delete Images/Videos

When an image or video is captured it will be stored to the MicroSD card. Media can be deleted at any time as follows:

- 1. Press the Review button to enter the library.
- 2. Use the Navigation buttons to select the image or video to review.
- 3. Press the OK button to view the image in full screen.
- 4. Using the touchscreen, tap the Delete icon.
- Press the OK button or tap OK on the touchscreen to confirm deletion. Tap Cancel on the touchscreen to cancel deletion.
- Press the Previous button twice to exit the menu and return to the imaging interface.

DELETED IMAGES CANNOT BE RECOVERED.

8-12 Rename Images or Videos

When an image or video is captured it will be stored to the MicroSD card with a default file name. Media can be renamed at any time as follows:

- 1. Press the Review button to enter the library.
- 2. Use the Navigation buttons to select the image or video to review.
- 3. Press the OK button to view the image in full screen.
- 4. Using the touchscreen, tap the Rename icon.
- 5. Using the touchscreen, open the keyboard by tapping the image name. Use the keyboard by tapping the touchscreen to input desired name.
- Press the OK button or tap Enter on the touchscreen to confirm rename.
 Press the previous button to cancel renaming.
- Press the Previous button to exit the menu.

8-13 Center Point Temperature Measurement

The center point measurement gives radiometric temperature information contained in the center of the scene. Measurement results will be displayed in the upper left corner of the screen. If disabled, enable center point temperature measurement as follows:

- 1. Press the Menu button or tap the touchscreen to display the Main Menu.
- 2. Select the measurement icon: Φ
 - 1: [|
- 3. Press the OK button to open Sub-menu.
- 4. Select Center Point icon: 中
- 5. Press the OK button to enable center point measurement. Menu closes automatically. To disable the center point repeat steps 1 5.

8-14 Hot Spot Temperature Tracking

Users can turn on hot spot tracking to identify the highest temperature point in the scene. Measurement results will be displayed in the upper left corner of the screen. Enable hot spot tracking as follows:

- 1. Press the Menu button or tap the touchscreen to display the Main Menu.
- 2. Select the measurement icon: 💠
- 3. Press the OK button to open Sub-menu.
- 4. Select Hot Spot icon:
- Press the OK button to enable hot spot tracking. Menu closes automatically.
 To disable the hot spot repeat steps 1 5.

8-15 Cold Spot Temperature Tracking

Users can turn on cold spot tracking to identify the lowest temperature point in the scene. Measurement results will be displayed in the upper left corner of the screen. Enable cold spot tracking as follows:

- 1. Press the Menu button or tap the touchscreen to display the Main Menu.
- 2. Select the measurement icon: Φ
- 3. Press the OK button to open Sub-menu.
- 4. Select Cold Spot icon:
- Press the OK button to enable cold spot tracking. Menu closes automatically.
 To disable the cold spot repeat steps 1 5.

THE CENTER POINT MEASUREMENT IS LOCKED TO THE CENTER OF THE SCREEN AND CANNOT BE MOVED. THE HOT AND COLD POINT TRACKERS WILL MOVE FREELY AROUND THE SCREEN AS TEMPERATURES ARE MEASURED AND CANNOT BE LOCKED INTO A STATIONARY POSITION.

8-16 Spot Temperature Measurement

Detect temperature information from a user designated spot as follows (limit 10):

- 1. Press the Menu button or tap the touchscreen to display the Main Menu.
- 2. Select the measurement icon: 💠
- 3. Press the OK button to open Sub-menu.
- 4. Select Spot icon:


8-20 Polarity

Change the polarity (color palette) to enhance temperature differences on the thermal camera as follows:

8-21 Auto Gain Control (AGC) and Manual Level & Span Adjustment

To the right of the screen are the AGC and Level & Span controls which plot the surface temperature information detected by the system. The maximum temperature is displayed on the top and the minimum temperature on the bottom.



Preferably, any temperature detected by the thermal device falls between the maximum and minimum temperature detected; if a number falls outside this range the image may "wash out", i.e. the extraneous energy in the viewing environment may reduce the perceived contrast of the image. Adjust the numbers to improve contrast.

8-21-1 Auto Gain Control (AGC)

The Auto Gain Control (AGC) function is enabled by default and automatically assists users in fine-tuning image contrast. If the user has manually adjusted the gain controls a reset can be performed by tapping the AGC button twice.

8-21-2 Manual Level & Span Adjustment

The user has control of contrast gain settings and can adjust the Level & Span as follows:

- Using the touchscreen, press and hold the Max Slider on the touchscreen; then, drag up or down on the touchscreen. Gain will be adjusted. When the proper contrast is reached release hold.
- Using the touchscreen, press and hold the Min Slider on the touchscreen; then, drag up or down on the touchscreen. Gain will be adjusted. When the proper contrast is reached release hold.

8-22 Emissivity

The correct emissivity value is important in order to receive the most accurate temperature measurement. Emissivity of a surface can have a large effect temperatures the imager observes.

To more accurately measure materials with a low emissivity, an emissivity correction is necessary. Adjusting the emissivity setting will allow the imager to calculate a more accurate estimate of the actual temperature.

Emissivity is set directly in the imager. The emissivity displays on the LCD screen as E=x.xx

Users can change the emissivity as follows:

- 1. Press the Menu button or tap the touchscreen to display the Main Menu.
- 2. Select the Parameter Settings icon: [[
- 3. Press the OK button to open Sub-menu.
- 4. Select Emissivity.
- 5. Press the OK button.
- 6. Adjust number using Navigation buttons.

- 8. Press the Previous button to exit the menu.

All objects radiate infrared energy. The amount of energy radiated varies based on the actual surface temperature and the surface emissivity of the object. The Thermal imager senses the infrared energy from the surface of the object and uses this data to calculate an estimated temperature value.

Many common objects and materials such as painted metal, wood, water, skin, and cloth are particularly good at radiating energy and it is easy to get relatively accurate measurements. For surfaces that are good at radiating energy (high emissivity), the emissivity factor is >=0.90. This simplification does not work on shiny surfaces or unpainted metals as they have an emissivity of <0.6. These materials are not good at radiating energy and are classified as low emissivity.

8-23 Non-uniformity Correction (NUC)

Non-uniformity correction (NUC) is used to compensate for the non-uniformity of detector pixels or other optical interference. A common need for NUC correction is to reduce excess noise in an image caused by rapid changes in ambient temperature within an environment.

The T-Cam device features an automatic NUC operation. When performing a correction operation, the user will hear a click from the device and the image will freeze temporarily. The image may clear of some noise grain after the device makes its adjustments.

8-24 Ambient Temperature

The imager has temperature compensation to correct environmental sources of energy as this can affect the measurement results. Temperature readings are especially altered when the emissivity of the object is low or the difference between the object temperature and the ambient temperature is large. It is necessary to compensate the results to eliminate the influence of the environmental temperatures.

To get a more accurate temperature measurements set the ambient temperature as follows:

- Select Unit.
- 5. Press the OK button.
- 6. Select Distance Unit.
- 7. Press the OK button.

- 10. Press the Previous button continuously to exit the menu.

DISTANCE IS MEASURED IN EITHER METERS OR FEET.

8-28 Alarm Settings

8-28-1 Enable Alarms

By default the imager alarm thresholds are turned off. The user will need to enable the high and low temperature alarms individually. Enable alarms as follows:

9 Cleaning and Maintenance

9-1 Cleaning the Germanium Lens

Do not use corrosive chemicals on the optical glass components. The germanium window surface is coated with anti-reflection coating. Dust, grease, and fingerprints will produce harmful substances and lead to a decline in performance, or cause scratches. If dirt is found, please use the following methods:

- Use a blown balloon or a soft brush to clean the lens surface to avoid dust particles scratching the anti-reflection film on lens surface during the wiping process.
- Use a soft cotton or microfiber cloth or lens wiping paper and dip in distilled water. Gently wipe the lens surface from the middle to the edge, paying attention to not crack the lens, or use too much liquid. If the lens is still not clean, replace the cloth and repeat the wiping process.

9-2 Disinfecting the Camera Surface

Do not use corrosive cleaning solutions on the optical glass components. It is recommended to disinfect the camera surface regularly with a non-corrosive sanitizing product. Follow the directions provided by the manufacturer of the cleaning solution. Adhere to the sanitation protocols and cleaning schedule set forth by the employer.

9-3 Device Calibration

It is recommended to have the device(s) re-calibrated annually. Contact customer service to schedule maintenance.

9-4 Storage

When the equipment is not in use, the device should be placed in a dust-free and moisture-free environment with a stable temperature and humidity.

DO NOT USE CORROSIVE CLEANING SOLUTIONS ON THE OPTICAL GLASS COMPONENTS. DISINFECT THE CAMERA SURFACE REGULARLY WITH A NON-CORROSIVE SANITIZING PRODUCT.

CALIBRATE YOUR DEVICES ANNUALLY. CONTACT CUSTOMER SERVICE TO SCHEDULE MAINTENANCE.

10 Troubleshooting

If the user encounters any problems while using the imager, refer to the following options. If the problem persists, disconnect the power and contact the customer support department.

10-1 Thermal imager does not power on

- · Ensure battery is installed
- Replace old battery
- Charge battery

10-2 Thermal imager shuts off unexpectedly

- Replace old battery
- · Charge battery

10-3 No thermal image

- Open the lens cap
- If lens is foggy, use professional equipment to clean the lens

10-4 Unclear or dark visible images

- Turn on lights in imaging area
- Turn on device light
- If lens is foggy, use professional equipment to clean the lens

10-5 Temperature readings are incorrect

- · Turn off the device; then, turn it back on
- Ensure the correct temperature range is selected
 - The default temperature range is -20 °C to 150 °C (-4 °F to 302 °F)
 - When measuring high temperature objects ensure the temperature range is set to the 100 °C to 550 °C (212 °F to 1022 °F) range
- Device is at proper height
- Ensure device is in focus
- Adjust emissivity
- Adjust for ambient temperature
- Perform a NUC operation

• Adjust focus ring

• Insert memory card
