4. FIRST AID MEASURES

First Aid Measures by likely routes of exposure

Inhalation:	Move to fresh air. If not breathing, give artificial respiration. If breathing is difficult, give oxygen. Get immediate medical attention.

5. FIRE FIGHTING MEASURES

6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

Clean-up methods:

Remove all sources of ignition. Ensure adequate ventilation. Soak up with inert absorbent material (e.g. sand, silica gel, acid binder, universal binder, sawdust). 7. HANDLING AND STORAGE
