This is a park with a remarkably large open space that was opened in commemoration of 150th anniversary of the Yokohama Port.




## Yokohama Port

## Shin-yokohama Ramen Museum


Eight popular ramen restaurants from different regions of Japan can be found here. The museum features a re-creation of the old town in the year 1958, when instant noodles first went on sale.

A new cinema complex with various shops and restaurants. Its motif is drawn from a town in Italy.






## Fujiko·F·Fujio Museum

### **Enoshima Island**


Enoshima is a charming inshore island by Shonan beach. The Island is known in the area as a marine-leisure haven and attracts many tourists.


## Autumn in Oyama Mountain

## **OISO**



A park full of Japanese atmosphere that was created at the site where there used to be a villa of the Mitsui Zaibatsu (a family-run conglomerof the Mitsui Zaibatsu (a family-run congiomerate). You can obtain a panoramic view of the range of mountains of Hakone and the Mt. Fuji, and Izu Peninsula and Sagami Bay from its observation platform. The place is also well known for autumn leaves and you can enjoy lit-up leaves in the evening during autumn season.









## Kamakuraguu

## Lake Festival on Lake Ashi (Kosuisai)


At the festival, people dedicate festive red rice and rice wine to the nine-headed dragon god, the protectoral god of Lake Ashi.

The hot springs in Yugawara have been a people's favorite since the old days. Its beautiful scenery, especially, has attracted many literary figures.


## Manyo Park

## Doppo Spa

People along the street such as visitors and local people douse the Mikoshi (portable shrine) with hot spring water contained in barrels.



## Makuyama Park

From the beginning of February to the beginning of March, about 4,000 Japanese plum blossoms cover all of the mountain slopes in white and red, and the park is perfumed by the blossoms.



### Daimyo-Gyoretsu (Feudal Lord's Procession)

One of the most famous parades in Japan. It re-creates a Feudal Lord's Procession in the Edo period.




## Hakone Jinja Shrine
