Takato, with magnificent views of a crimson-painted Wakato Bridge and industrial areas, the Regular Night View Cruise, highlighting the area's development as an industrial city, and the Tobata Gion Festival, characterized by its pyramids of lights.

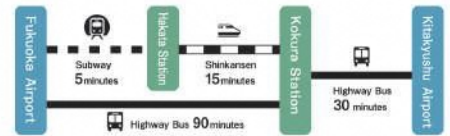
