Main routes to Kitakyushu City

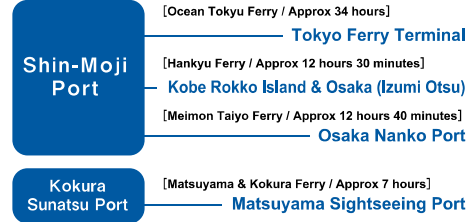

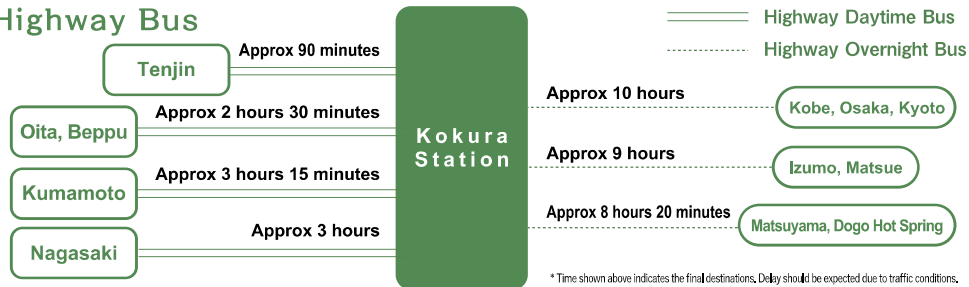

PICK UP 1



Wakato Bridge

Wakato Bridge was a forerunner to Japan's other long suspension bridges, coming before the Seto, Rainbow, Akashi Kaikyo, and Kanmon Bridges. The large-scale bridge is 627 meters long and is admired as a symbol of the two wards it connects, Wakamatsu and Tobata. Its bright crimson color makes such a strong impression that, when it was built in 1962, it was called the dream suspension bridge, the longest in the Orient. At the foot of the bridge on the Wakamatsu side, you can find plenty of retro buildings, such as the Former Furukawa Mining Wakamatsu Building and the Ueno Building.

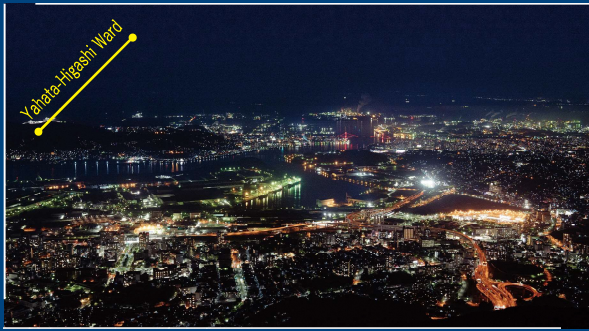

The night views here have been chosen as one of "Japan's 11 Best Factory Night Views," something only the "City of Manufacturing" that led Japanese industry to success could provide.

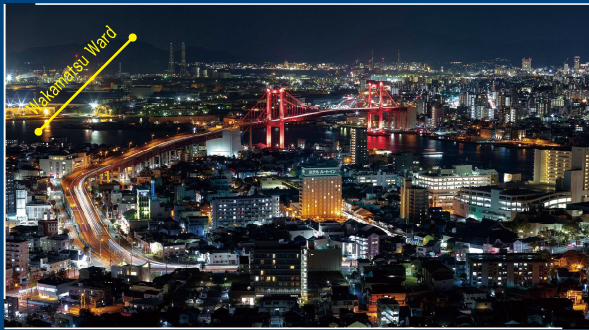


Japan Night View Heritage

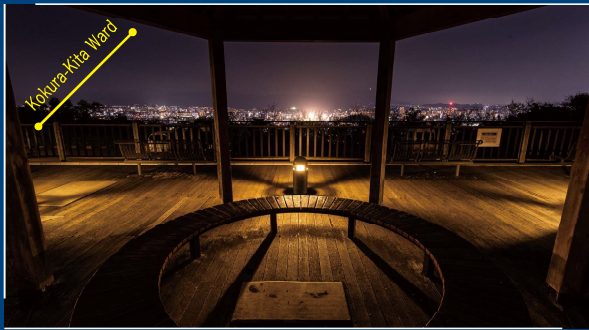

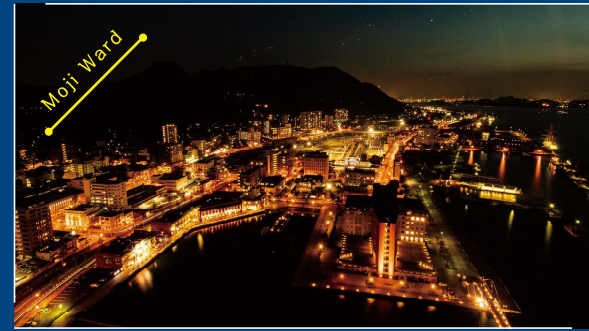

Kokura Illumination

Glittering lights around Kokura Station and the Murasakigawa River are a symbol of central Kokura. Illuminations of various designs and concepts can be found decorating various locales around central Kokura. Don't forget to visit these photo spots. The illumination is held from November to January every winter.

Tobata Gion Festival

It is one of the three major summer festivals in Fukuoka Prefecture along with Hakata Gion Yamakasa Festival and Kokura Gion Festival. The magical pyramids of light are overwhelming. It was registered as Intangible Cultural Heritage with UNESCO in 2016. The gathering of eight large yamakasa is a must-see. *Shifted to the 3rd Friday if that particular July begins with Saturday.

What is Japan Night View Heritage?

Locations are chosen after undergoing rigorous surveys by the Japan Night View Heritage Secretariat and voting by Grade 1 Night View Appreciation Experts ("Nightscape Meisters"). It is a very rare case to have six locations chosen within a single city.

Certified as one of "Japan's New Three Most Spectacular Night Views!"

Along with Nagasaki and Sapporo, in 2018 Kitakyushu was chosen after voting by 5,542 Night View Appreciation Experts from all throughout Japan. Kitakyushu is considered a prime city for night view tourism because of the presence of six recognized night view sites - no other city has as many.

Kaku-uchi

Kaku-uchi is a style of bar where the customer buys a drink and drinks it while standing at the counter in the store. These oases for laborers working in the industrial areas of Kitakyushu are still going strong. Meeting new faces is another charm of taking trips.

AREA 01

Moji

Mojiko, or Moji Port, flourished as an international trade port beginning at the latter half of the Meiji era (1868-1912). The area around Mojiko Station, which features historic buildings lining the streets, and the Mojiko Retro area, which faces the Kanmon Straits, are the most popular tourist spots in the city.

Renovated with Taisho Era look and grand opening in 2019.



Mojiko Station

This Renaissance Revival-style train station, built in 1914, was the first train station to be selected as an important cultural property. In March 2019, after approximately 6 and a half years of preservation and restoration work, the station reopened restored to its original 1914 appearance. There are also cafes and restaurants inside.

This 780 meter long undersea footpath tunnel is very rare even in Japan, and was built to connect Honshu Island and Kyushu Island. The prefectural border inside the tunnel is a very popular photo spot. During its operating season, don't forget to ride the Kitakyushu Bank Retro Line "Shiokaze-go" to get to the tunnel's entrance on the Moji side.

Retro Building Cluster
(Former Osaka Shosen)

Mojiko, or Moji Port, flourished as an international trade port since Meiji era. The former Moji Mitsui Club, former Osaka Shosen and the former Moji Customhouse still stand, looking the same as they did in the past. You can see the Kanmon Straits in one sweep from the Mojiko Retro view lounge. There are also souvenir and variety shops, as well as restaurants and cafes selling sweets, craft beer, and baked curry.

Kyushu Railway History Museum

This building was built in 1891 and used to be the former main office building of Kyushu Railway which was the first railway company in Kyushu. There are real trains that were operated in the past and Railway Cultural Heritage on display. You can also be a motorman and operate a driving simulator inside a life-size replica train cab or inside a mini train.

Moji Red Brick Place

Built in 1913, these buildings were Kyushu's first beer brewing facilities for the Imperial Brewery. You can learn more about the history of beer in the Moji Beer Brick Museum and also experience the former Sapporo Beer Kyushu Brewery via virtual reality. There are also some popular restaurants and cafes inside.

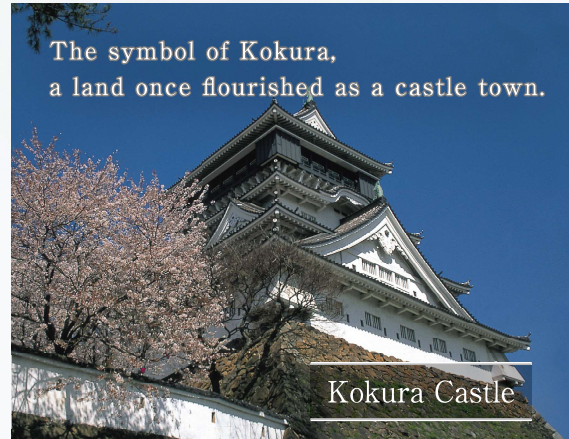

Kokura Castle

The castle was built in 1602 by Tadaoki Hosokawa. The castle tower burnt down in 1837, but was reconstructed in 1959 thanks to the hope of the citizens. Exhibitory inside the castle tower was renovated and the reopened in March 2019. Also, there is a stunning Japanese Garden next to the castle. Here, you can get exposed to Japanese culture such as Japanese manners and a Japanese tea ceremony.

Tanga Market

This so-called the "kitchen" of Kitakyushu has been operating since the Taisho era (1912-1926). There are about 120 shops providing fresh marine products, side dishes, and also a famous local traditional dish called Nukadaki, which is food rolled with a condiment made from salted rice bran paste.

COLUMN

Kokura Ori: A style of cotton textile that was famous in the Edo era (1603-1868). Production ceased at the beginning of the Showa era (1926-1989), but was revived later on. Its distinctive feature is the beautiful vertical stripes with a stereoscopic look. Small products like purses and pouches can be very attractive souvenirs.

AREA 03

Yahatahigashi & Yahatanishi

The Yahatahigashi area is the gathering place for many informative facilities, such as World Heritage sites and also one of the largest museums in western Japan. Yahatanishi, on the other hand, used to be a post town, and still retains that atmosphere. Both places have their own appealing attractions.



Kawachi Fujien (Wisteria Garden)

The garden was chosen as one of Japan's 31 most beautiful places by America's CNN. A total of 22 types of Wisterias bloom in spring and about 700 colorful trees will fill the garden with crimson foliage in fall.

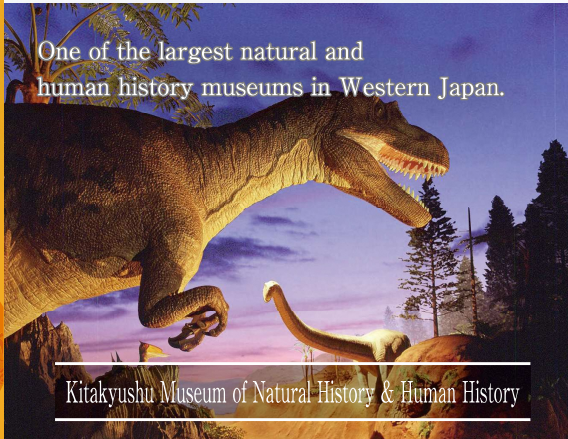
Special area for viewing Imperial Steel Works, Japan First Head Office

The Imperial Steel Works, Japan was registered as a World Heritage site in 2015. Since the site is located in a currently-operating factory, it is not open to visitors but you can enjoy the exterior look of the first head office from a specially set up space. There will be a guide available at all times for explaining (in the order of arrival) and there is also a VR tour guide.

One of the largest natural and human history museums in Western Japan.

Kitakyushu Museum of Natural History & Human History

The museum exhibits everything in a grandiose scale, including the birth of the earth until the present day and the evolution of life and nature. You can feel the full impact of the many world-class dinosaur skeletons on display. The museum does not only exhibit very important historical collections, but also displays the habitats and lifestyles of the people who lived in the Yayoi period (1000BC-300AD), as well as the Meiji (1868-1912), and Showa (1926-1989) eras.

Nagasaki Kaido Koyanose Shuku

Koyanose Shuku once bustled as an inn town of Nagasaki Kaido (roadway). There are buildings scattered here and there preserving the old roadway streetscape such as Nagasaki Kaido Koyanose Shuku Memorial Museum, which was built on the former site of Honjin and Wakihonjin inn, and Old Takasaki Family Residence, a very famous and wealthy merchant family.

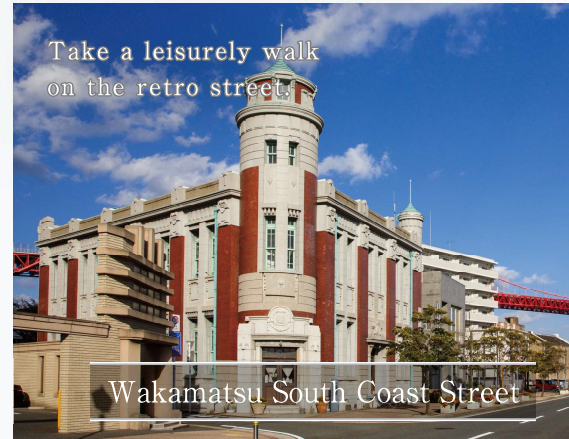

Industrial Tourism: Kitakyushu City was and is still leading Japan's industrial development. Let's get to know the history of industry and feel the atmosphere of actual industrial sites.



Take a leisurely walk on the retro street.

Wakamatsu South Coast Street

Since the Meiji era (1868-1912), Wakamatsu greatly prospered for being Japan's biggest coal shipping port. Along the south coast street of Dokai Bay, there are retro buildings like the Former Furukawa Mining Wakamatsu Building (built in 1919), the Mining Union Hall, and the Ueno Building. Taking a walk while feeling the sea breeze on your skin is also wonderful.

It is the largest park in the city where you can play with cute animals like capybaras, otters, and ponies while being surrounded by flowers that will make you feel the transition of seasons. You can also enjoy the nature by riding unique bicycles on the cycling course or cruise on paddle boats. The Rose Fair is also held in spring and fall.

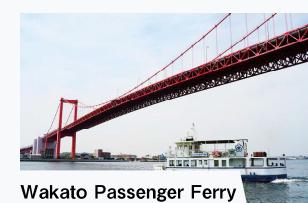
Kitakyushu Municipal Museum of Art

Also called the "hilltop binoculars", this uniquely-shaped art museum was designed by a famous architect, Arata Isozaki, and it eventually became known as one of his early period masterpieces. It has a wide collection of modern art pieces. You can also relax and enjoy the full view of the ocean and the streetscape from the cafe inside the museum.

Wakato Passenger Ferry

How about a short voyage to the south coast of Wakamatsu on this nostalgic ferryboat? It connects Wakamatsu and Tobata for just ¥100 and only takes 3 minutes to go across the Dokai Bay at the foot of Wakato Bridge. Gazing at the Wakato Bridge lit up at night from the ferry is also highly recommended.

Wakamatsu & Tobata

Wakamatsu's south coast once prospered and was well-known as Japan's biggest coal shipping port. And on the north coast, the sandy beach is so beautiful. You can visit a uniquely architected art museum and also old streetscapes built in harmony with nature and culture, overflowing with nostalgia.

Cape Tomigahana

Here, you can observe a very valuable geologic stratum called the Ashiya Group. This was the location of a guardhouse in the Edo era (1603-1868). The sunset view seen from the Myokenzaki Lighthouse is so marvelous, the legends says it even made the Goddess jealous.

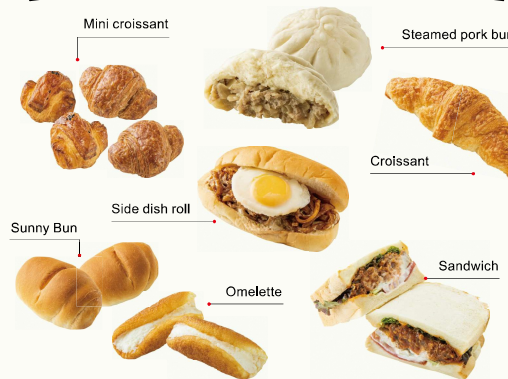

Kitakyushu City, surrounded by beautiful and clean ocean, is a place with a rich supply of a variety of fresh seafood. There are restaurants serving original Kyushu style sushi. Some of them were even chosen as Japan's tastiest sushi on review websites!

Gyoza developed as a stamina-boosting food for local steelworkers. Part of the unique Yahata style involves using a citron and pepper condiment as spice for the gyoza. The true charm of Yahata gyoza is in its varieties of cooking styles. These include the homestyle, mom's cooking type, as well as the professional style, using iron pans.

This cuisine refers to mackerel or sardine boiled with highly nutritious nukamiso, a kind of rice bran paste that has been pickled in salt. Locals usually have this local dish with rice or even liquor since it is rich in umami.

Many original recipes can be enjoyed in a variety of restaurants centered around the Kokura area. It has the unique texture of dry noodles where the surface is crispy but doughy inside. Right before the noodle is done frying, a little bit of rice wine is added to it to enrich its flavor.

The curry is topped with toasted melty cheese and a half boiled egg. Many restaurants around the Mojiko area serve their own unique takes on the dish.

TOPICS 01

Locals love bread and have to line up to get it!

The city is packed with popular bakery products, Sunny Buns by Shiroya, croissants by Mikadukiya, mini croissants by Mignon - the list goes on. If you're not hungry enough for a full meal, you can buy a sandwich that you choose your own toppings for at Sandwich Factory OCM, or get a bread roll at a specialty bakery where you can add side dishes into it, or a steamed pork bun from Yousukou. All in all, why don't you take a food tour and try out the bakery products in Kitakyushu City? You won't regret it.

TOPICS 02

Kitakyushu World Heritage Souvenirs

Chocolates precisely designed, measured, and made into the shapes of nuts and bolts that can be actually screwed into each other make good souvenirs distinctive of this city of steelmaking. The Kurogane hard cookie was the traditional snack and also food storage in case of emergency for the steelworkers. It is hard like steel, but don't miss out on its sweet and gentle taste.
