A Deep Dive into Japan Travel Trends of the Singapore Market in 2024

Highlights:

- 1. There had been a strong growing interest among Singaporean travellers towards Japan's hidden gems (also known as Japan's lesser-known areas). Okinawa and the Kyushu region had seen the highest percentage growth in terms of the number of overnight stays by regions and prefectures.
- 2. Singaporean travellers were the biggest spender on Japanese foods among travellers from Asian countries.
- 3. 76% of correspondents during an interview survey revealed that they have visited Japan at least twice.

SINGAPORE, 27 May 2025 - Following the record-breaking number of over 691,000 Singaporean travellers in Japan in 2024, Japan National Tourism Organization (JNTO) also did a deeper dive into the data collected over the year. JNTO Singapore Office has observed

several trends in Singaporean travellers' travel patterns when they visited Japan in 2024. The key trends include Singaporean travellers' growing interest in the hidden gems (also referred to the lesser-known regional areas) of Japan, and they were the biggest spender on Japanese foods among travellers from the Asian countries.

Key Observations from the Number of Overnight Stays

The **first key trend is Singaporean traveller's growing interests in Japan's hidden gems**, evident with the strong increase in the number of their overnight stays in the regional areas in 2024 over the numbers in 2023.

For the number of overnight stays by regions, it is clear that Okinawa and the Kyushu region have seen the largest percentage growth -210% and 62.3% respectively. This can be largely attributed to the increase in the awareness of these areas with unique local culture and charms, and the availability of direct flights to Okinawa and Fukuoka from Singapore.

A further look into the top ten prefectures with the highest growth, half of which were prefectures in Kyushu. Singaporean travellers had been increasingly travelling to Fukuoka, Saga, Oita, Kumamoto and Nagasaki as these five prefectures saw sharp increase in the number of overnight stays. Other notable prefectures with relatively strong growth were Yamaguchi in the Chugoku region and Aomori in the Tohoku region.

Delving deeper and when comparing with travellers from other Southeast Asian countries and India, the top five prefectures with the highest share of overnight stays made by Singaporean travellers during their travel were as follows:

With the above, it is even more evident that Singaporean travellers were more ready and had been more adventurous in traversing different parts of Japan and exploring the deeper pockets of Japan away from the main international airport of Fukuoka, Kansai, Haneda and Narita.

Key Observations from an Interview Survey

The International Visitor Survey was conducted in 2024 on foreign visitors who were visiting Japan at the time of the interview. Based on travel expenditure spent per trip, it was observed

that the second key trend was Singaporean travellers, among travellers from Asian countries, were the biggest consumer of Japanese foods in 2024 with a spend of over JPY66,000 (about SGD600) over a stay of 8.4 nights in Japan on average. This amount is almost 25% of the overall spend during a Japan trip of a Singaporean traveller and is the next highest consumption category immediately after accommodation and shopping.

It was also revealed that 76% of correspondents - about every 3 in 4 persons in Singapore – have visited Japan at least twice, and 21% - about every 1 in 5 persons - have visited at least 6 times.

Comments from JNTO Singapore Office

On these key trends and observations, Mr Takuya Shiraishi, Executive Director of JNTO Singapore Office, shared his opinion and commented, "As JNTO, we are certainly thankful and happy to see that more and more Singaporean travellers are having growing interests in and visiting the hidden gems of Japan. However, there are still so many undiscovered charms in Japan awaiting Singaporean travellers' exploration. Since there are 47 prefectures, Japan lovers should certainly try visiting all to witness for themselves what each prefecture can offer them. How about checking out the Expo 2025 which is held between 13 April and 13 October 2025 in Osaka, then explore beyond Osaka into the hidden gems?"

Regarding JNTO Singapore Office's promotional efforts, Mr Shiraishi added, "We also appreciate Singapore's love for Japan travel and Japanese foods. In 2025, we will continue to share more on mouthwatering Japanese foods via our social platforms. While the focus will be on showcasing the different charms unique to Japan's various areas and prefectures, Japan lovers in Singapore can also look forward to an upcoming major campaign whereby they are not just able to learn more about the hidden gems, but participants stand to win a huge prize. Hence, please keep a look out for these activities by the JNTO Singapore Office!"
