Kouri Island [Nakijin Village] MAP F | 3

A small island surrounded by emerald green ocean. It has an Okinawan version of the story of Adam and Eve, and is also called by its another name, "Island of Love." There is a beautiful view from Kouri Ohashi Bridge, which links to the main island, and due to publicity from being used as a location for TV series and commercials, it is now a popular sightseeing spot in northern Okinawa.

OKINAWA MAIN ISLAND

NORTHERN AREA

As typified by the village of Kunigami, the northern area of Okinawa's main island is full of nature, with a spreading mysterious forest that has remained unchanged since olden times! The area is also notable for Okinawa Churaumi Aquarium and the cluster of resort hotels on its west coast, and is an area where you can experience tropical resorts and beaches and diving spots with exceptionally clear waters. In July 2021, the area extending Kunigami, Higashi, and Ogimi villages in the northern part of the main island of Okinawa was registered as a World Natural Heritage site.



Okinawa Churaumi Aquarium [Motobu Town] MAP D | 3

An aquarium with the theme of "Encounters with Okinawa's Oceans," this is where you can experience Okinawa's oceans, from shoals with coral reefs to the deep sea. Featuring tanks with coral and tropical fish, the Kuroshio Sea Tank - one of the largest aquarium tanks in the world where whale sharks and manta rays swim, and the mysterious Deep Sea Tank. Take a tour that lets you feel as if you are diving in the oceans of Okinawa.

World Heritage

Nakijin Castle Site [Nakijin Village] MAP E | 3

A castle belonging to the king who ruled the Hukuzan area before the unification of the Ryukyu Kingdom, it boasts a structure described as impregnable and a size second only to Shurijo Castle itself. It is a popular tourist destination in January and February due to its fame as a location where Japan's earliest blooming cherry blossoms (*cerasus campanulata*) can be seen.



Cape Manzamo [Onna Village] MAP D | 6



Cape Manzamo is an area with picturesque scenery in the resort zone on the west coast of the main island. Amongst the 20m-high cliffs formed from a coral rock, there is a rock formation shaped like an elephant's trunk, which has become a symbol of the area. It is famous as a location for movies and TV series, and is also popular for its beautiful sunset views.


Mihama American Village [Chatan Town] MAP C | 8

A resort and amusement facility built in the image of America's west coast.



Shurijo Castle Park [Naha City] MAP C | 9

Shurijo Castle, an eminently majestic royal castle of the Ryukyu Kingdom. The park includes the world-heritage-listed Shurijo Castle site and Sonohyan-utaki stone gate, as well as many historic buildings, allowing you to get a feel for the splendid kingdom's history and culture.



*The main hall and other facilities were destroyed by fire, work is currently underway to restore it. The area is open to the public.

REMOTE ISLANDS MIYAKO ISLANDS

Surrounded by the beautiful ocean, Miyako Island is a marine resort treasure-trove where you can enjoy a variety of ocean fun. It also has many scenic locations, including Yonaha Maehama Beach, Irabu Ohashi Bridge, and Cape Higashi-henna, which is one of the 100 Landscapes of Japan.

REMOTE ISLANDS YAEMAMA ISLANDS

The Yaeyama area is dotted with unique islands. Popular options include seeing the Okinawa of old on Taketomi Island, or a tour to enjoy nature to your heart's content on Iriomote Island, which is also called the Amazon of the Orient. In July 2021, Iriomote Island was registered as a World Natural Heritage site.

The abundant coral reefs nurtured by the Kerama Blue waters here have captured the attention of divers from all over the world, many of whom come to visit. The area is also famous for whale-watching in winter.



OKINAWA MAIN ISLAND

SOUTHERN AREA

This area imbued with a sacred atmosphere, includes many sites that are related to the religion of the Ryukyu Dynasty, sites that were told in Ryukyu mythology, as well as places of worship for peace. With many picturesque locations and stylish cafes with views of the ocean, this area is perfect for enjoying a drive or leisure activities.



Yachimun Pottery Village [Yomitan Village] MAP C | 7

"Yachimun" means pottery in the Okinawan language. With a calm, and simple appearance, these items are popular for daily use and as souvenirs. Yachimun Pottery Village is a collection of Okinawan pottery galleries and workshops. Why not find your perfect piece of pottery in this tranquil hamlet of spreading greenery?




Kaichu-doro Drive [Uruma City] MAP E | 8

A 4.75km bridge stretching from the main island to Hamahiga Island, Henza Island, Miyagi Island and Ieki Island. With beautiful ocean spreading out on both sides, a drive here is definitely recommended. The area is also popular for swimming and marine sports.



Okinawa Prefectural Peace Memorial Park [Itoman City] MAP B | 11

The Okinawa Prefectural Peace Memorial Park is located in Mabuni, Itoman City, in the southern part of the island, which saw the final fighting in the Battle of Okinawa. The park includes a memorial tower and monument, as well as the Cornerstone of Peace, and is a place to pray for perpetual peace and to commemorate the spirits of those who lost their lives in the fighting.



World Heritage Katsuren Castle Site [Uruma City] MAP D | 8

Katsuren Castle is famous for being the castle where Lord Amawari resided in the 15th century. The castle walls utilize a natural cliff, defining elegant curves that lend a sense of feminine beauty. Its summit offers a sweeping view of the Pacific Ocean, and is one of Okinawa's leading scenic locations.



Umikaji Terrace Senagajima [Tomigusuku City] MAP A | 10

Umikaji Terrace on Senaga Island was built in the image of a Mediterranean seaside town. It is lined with fancy stores and places to eat and drink, and bustles with a great number of visitors. You can also watch airplanes as they land and take off from at Naha Airport, or enjoy one of the beautiful sunsets the island is famous for.
