Nierinna Creek Reserve
Monday 20th July 2026

Volunteers present for working bee: Roz Thurn, David Reynolds, Angela Brinkhoff and Morris Worsley.

Total man-hours worked - this working bee: 9

The weather was clear and cool and wet underfoot. Great weather for a working bee.
The creek was flowing well.

Work carried out during this working bee:

Weeding on the reserve and further up the creek riparian zone and beginning of Nierinna Creek track. Scattered patches of forget-me-not, juvenile hemlock, scotch thistle and blackberry. A couple of small Spanish heath from the dam edge on the reserve and 1 in flower further up the creek at the end of Burnaby Drive. A couple of mullein adjacent to the creek near the beginning of the walking track were removed.

An arum lily was removed from under the bridge to 21 Burnaby Drive.

Coots were seen on the neighbouring dam.

3 dead pademelons were seen on different parts of the reserve.

2 car tyres were removed from the reserve at the end of Burnaby Drive and taken to the council depot by David. A small amount of rubbish was also removed.

A picnic on site was enjoyed by all after the working bee.

Future Works:

Weeding on all sites – Nierinna Creek Reserve, Davis Flat, Brinks Link and Tramway Hill.

Next working bee:

Will be at Tramway Hill Reserve, sometime in August. There will probably be a lot of thistles to remove from around the shelter on the site. Date yet to be decided.

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
