What is the Big Umbrella Festival?



Big Umbrella Festival is a multi-week series of performances, workshops, and interactive experiences designed with and for the neurodiverse community.

From **April 10–26 2026**, the festival welcomes audiences of all ages to experience dance, theater, music, comedy, visual art, and outdoor installations in **welcoming and accessible** ways.

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What Is This Installation?

Mi Casa, Your Casa 2.0 is a free interactive outdoor installation inspired by the lively street markets of Latin America.

It features a series of three-dimensional red house-shaped frames (“casas”).

Inside each casa, you may find a swing inviting you to pause and sway quietly.

When a casa is empty, it may glow with a welcoming white light.

When someone is inside, the glow becomes brighter gradually to show that someone is “home.”



Getting to Lincoln Center's Plaza

Lincoln Center is between W 62nd–65th Streets and Columbus–Amsterdam Avenues.

By Subway

You can take **1 train** to **66 St–Lincoln Center** (with shorter distance)

You can also take **A / B / C / D / 1 trains** to **59 St–Columbus Circle** (with slightly longer distance)

Both subway stations are accessible via the elevator.



By Bus

You can take: **M5, M7, M10, M11, M20, M66, M104**. (within one block of David Geffen Hall.)

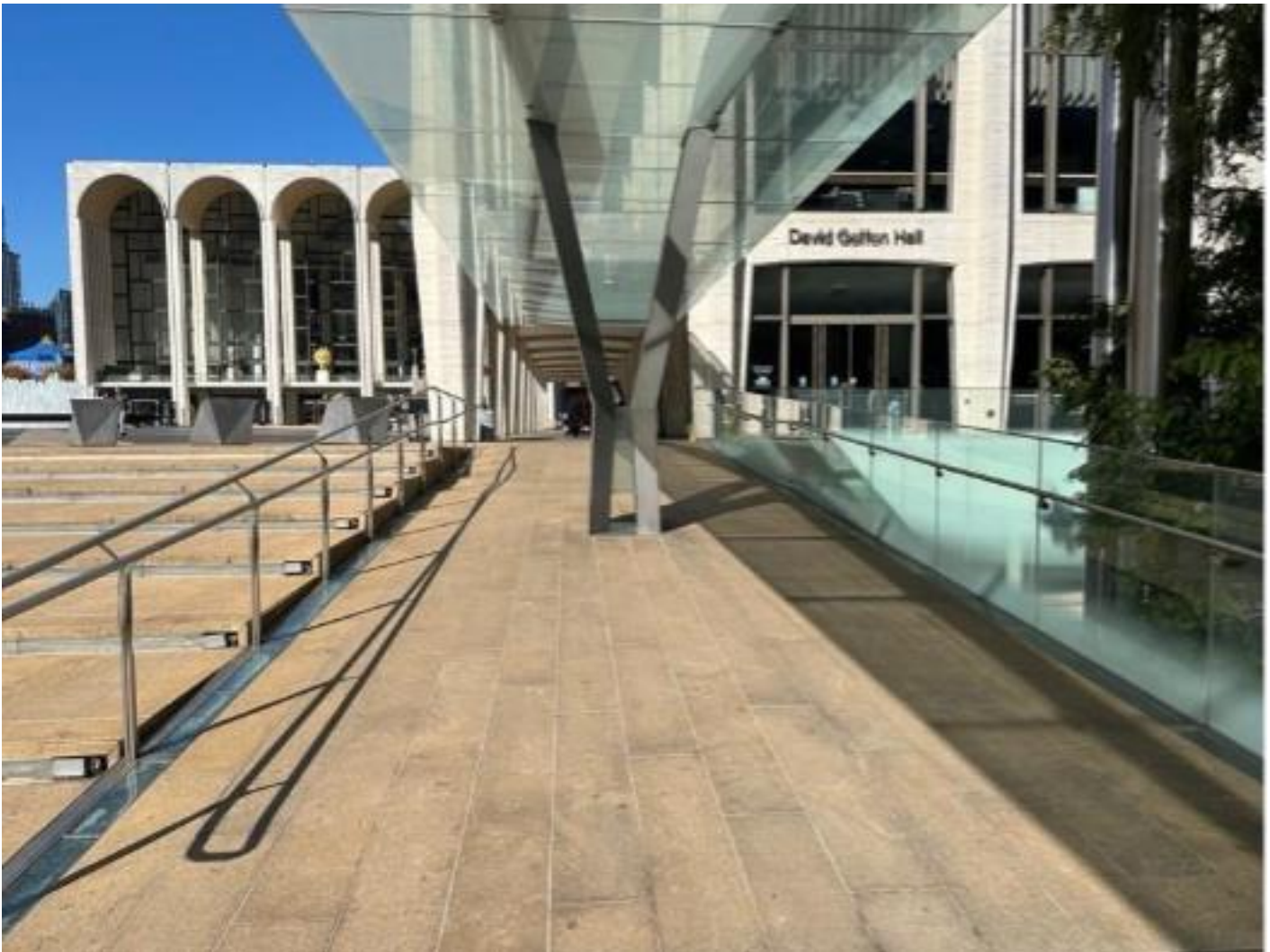
Access-A-Ride Pick-Up/Drop-Off:

If you need an address for Access-A-Ride, 20 Lincoln Center Plaza (Lincoln Center's designated Access-A-Ride stop) is on Columbus at 64th Street.

Entering the Plaza

Josie Robertson Plaza is accessible via ramps from Columbus Ave at W 63rd St and W 64th St.

The installation will either be surrounding the fountain, to the left as you enter the plaza, or in Hearst Plaza, to the right after walking past David Geffen Hall.



What Can I Do?

You can look from the outside, move around, or go inside a casa.

If you want to, you may sit on the swing and sway gently.

You can move at your own pace and leave at any time.

To enter and exit most casas, you will step over a red metal bar.

One casa can be accessed by a ramp. In this casa, you can sit on a bench and experience a rocking sensation.

The bench is created to facilitate a wheelchair transfer. The lighting will not change on this unit.

You can sit by yourself, or there might be space for one other person to sit with you.



Sensory Information

Outdoor Sounds: You may hear the fountain, people, and city sounds.

Light: The casas may have soft, gentle light changes.

Movement: The swing moves back and forth. If motion feels uncomfortable, you can stay outside or move away anytime.

Helpful Tips

If the plaza is busy, you can wait and take turns entering a casa.

If you prefer less activity, try visiting earlier in the day or later in the evening.

Watch your step getting in and out of the casas. You may need to step over a low red bar to enter most casas.

The maximum weight for each swing is 250 lbs (115 kg). We recommend one adult (or one adult and a child) at a time on the swing.

The casas are designed for sitting and swinging, not for climbing.
