Gloria and Moni have been best friends since childhood – one is rich, the other poor. Half a century later, the two women meet again and Gloria confesses a secret she's kept her whole life: she has never slept with anyone. Gloria was always popular, eccentric and beautiful, a wannabe actress and highly sociable. Gloria and Moni grew up in the stuffy 1960s, confronted with marriage, claustrophobia and violence. How did they become the people they are? What do loneliness and prosperity mean? Once again, Monika Helfer's voice is outstanding in its virtuosity, conveying stories of intimacy and belonging in a sparkling, light-hearted tone. On the heels of Helfer's trilogy about her own family, *The Maiden* is an exhilarating novel about a decades-long friendship between two women.



Her work has won the Austrian Literature Prize, the Solothurn Literature Prize and the Johann Peter Hebel Prize, among others. For *Die Bagage* (novel, 2020), she received the Schubart Literature Prize 2021 from the City of Aalen. Her most recent publications by Hanser are the novels *Vati* (2021) and *Löwenherz* (2022)

Manfred is a very average specimen of the genus Homo sapiens – yet he still manages to set off the intergalactic alarm. Alien Zorrgh takes possession of Manfred's consciousness to find out why. Normally, the alarm only goes off when a human reveals the existence of aliens – humans like Descartes, Einstein, and Hieronymus Bosch. But by no stretch of the imagination does Manfred possess such intelligence. In his early thirties, he's pale and pot-bellied and works alone from home. How could he have discovered what aliens call »true thought«? Zorrgh helps Manfred, who in the blink of an eye achieves wealth and beauty. Soon, he's in touch with his childhood sweetheart Sabine, who suspiciously reminds Zorrgh of Ada Lovelace, the first female programmer in world history. Zorrgh does not realise that Manfred and Sabine will drive him to his limits until the showdown at the bitter end.

Thomas Lehr, born in 1957 in Speyer, lives in Berlin. He has received many awards for his literary work, including the Berlin Literature Prize, the Bremen Literature Prize and the Joseph Breitbach Prize. His most recent publications by Hanser include *September. Fata Morgana* (novel, 2010), *42* (novel, 2013) and *Schlafende Sonne* (novel, 2017).

A celebration of storytelling

Bestselling author Rafik Schami rescues gems of Arabic storytelling from oblivion! In an Arab country in the 19th century, the wise and just King Salih reigns. When the queen is killed in an assassination attempt, their only daughter sinks into deep melancholy. Unbeknownst to her father, she has fallen in love with a poor fisherman. When Karam, the coffee-shop storyteller, learns of her illness, he resolves to heal the princess. Every evening, he gathers gifted storytellers in the palace to bring the young woman back to life with the most beautiful stories: of courage and cowardice, intelligence and superstition, friendship and enmity, love and the wisdom of the heart.

Schami's new novel is a homage to storytelling that will inspire not only readers of Tales from *One Thousand and One Nights*.

Rafik Schami was born in Damascus in 1946 and has lived in Germany since 1971. His work has been translated into 33 languages and has received numerous awards, including the Hermann Hesse Prize, the Nelly Sachs Prize, the Gegen Vergessen – Für Demokratie prize, the Gustav Heinemann Peace Prize and the Carl Zuckmayer Medal. Most recent publications by Hanser include *Die geheime Mission des Kardinals* (Roman, 2019) and *Mein Sternzeichen ist der Regenbogen* (2021).

When the war began in April 1992, Tijan Sila was only ten years old but to this day, he can still remember the smell of lit explosives. As Sarajevo is slowly engulfed in flames, the boy grows into a young man. He wanders through the ruins of the bombed-out city, collecting the things left by those who fled or died, to exchange them for food on the black market. He learns to survive, and accepts the cruel new normal – but at what cost? This is a story of the unexpected, about how poets become murderers and murderers become heroes. It's about people abruptly deprived of all humanity, and how the shrapnel of war is embedded in the brain of every survivor.


Tijan Sila, born in 1981 in Sarajevo, came to Germany in 1994 as a war refugee. He studied German and English language and literature in Heidelberg. His first novel *Tierchen Unlimited* was published in 2017, followed in 2018 by *Die Fahne der Wünsche*, and in 2021 by *Krach*. He has also published essays in Die Zeit, taz and der Freitag. Tijan Sila lives in Kaiserslautern.

Finding the absent father later in life

A story of family bounds and self-discovery – intimate and very relatable »Would I have turned out differently if my father had been around while I was growing up?«

Nina is in her late forties and is separated from her partner with whom she has a son, Lenny. She has never had any contact with her own father. When Lenny writes to him, Hans suddenly comes back into her life. At first, they connect surprisingly quickly, but painful questions soon arise about the past and cracks come to light. Had she missed out, or is quite the opposite true – was everything better the way it was? An answer emerges when she learns of the tragic death of her brother, whom she never met. With honesty and empathy, Tanja Schwarz pens characters whose family relationships are not always simple, but painfully familiar.



HISTORICAL DRAMA

Deathly fear, blissful love, the Plague and hopes for the future

Dirk Schümer, The Black Lily

Highly topical

It's 1348. The Plague rages in the financial metropolis of Florence, while the sons of the powerful banker Pacino Peruzzi are being murdered one by one. Wittekind Tentronk, who has moved to the city on the Arno to work as the agent of the patriarch, recognises too late that the murderous race for money and revenge going on here is one he can only lose.

As he did in his much-acclaimed novel *The Black Rose*, Dirk Schümer draws an arc here to the present day. He looks at the biggest banking crisis in history pre-2008, the worst pandemic of all time, and the Crimean War. He also follows Wittekind's romance with the attractive market woman Ciocca, as well as the distinguished group of friends that surrounds Dante's alcoholic son, Jacopo, and the down-and-out poet Boccaccio. The result is a page-turning portrait of an era steeped in history that draws many parallels to the present day.


Dirk Schümer was born in 1962 in Soest, and studied German language and literature, philosophy and medieval history in Hamburg and Paris. In the early 1990s, he worked as an editor and cultural correspondent for the Frankfurter Allgemeine Zeitung in Venice and Vienna, and has worked in the same roles for the Welt Group since November 2014. His first novel *The Black Rose* was published in 2022 by Zsolnay and was a big success.

A race for power set in 1920s Japan

A universal story of power and political intrigue set against the backdrop of a natural disaster A power vacuum that ideologues know how to use. A natural disaster that turns a country on its head. Based on a period of Japanese history, Hans Platzgumer tells a universal, captivating story that feels almost uncanny in its striking resemblance to modern-day political intrigues.

In 1912, Yoshihito, a young man aged only 32, was crowned emperor of Japan in Tokyo. His nearly fifteen-year rule would go down in Japanese history as the Taishō era. Military officer Amakasu, a staunch servant of the Japanese secret police, looks back on the war that shaped his life. For decades, in the shadow of Emperor Yoshihito, who was more interested in poetry and plants than politics and the state of his empire, he fought a bitter battle against the anarchist and insurgent Sakae Ôsugi and his wife Itô. But then the great Kantō earthquake in 1923 not only destroyed Tokyo but ushered in a political zero hour. In the shadow of the natural disaster, Amakasu's police force flouted rules and laws, and the Japanese people were at their mercy.

Hans Platzgumer, was born in Innsbruck in 1969 and lives in Bregenz. After graduating from the Vienna Music Academy he went on to study film music in Los Angeles. He has released electronic music with various partners and writes novels, radio plays, opera, theatre music and essays. *Am Rand* was a big success and longlisted for the German Book Prize 2016. His most recent novels were *Drei Sekunden jetzt* (2018) and *Bogners Abgang* (2021).

Returning to a war-torn home country

Julya Rabinowich, The Smell of Soot And Roses

The book of the hour –
A moving story told from the perspective of a refugee girl

The war is over and Madina risks travelling back to her home country in an agonizing search for her father. She also wants to goodbye to the life she had to leave so quickly. The wounds of war are still fresh and Madina sees great suffering and comes up against mistrust. When she eventually finds her father, she manages to take him back to her new home. At the same time, she realises it's time she stopped being responsible for her family and follow her own dreams.

This is a story about how war plunges so many families into chaos and uncertainty, and how a young woman surpasses herself to discover who she is.

Julya Rabinowich, born in St. Petersburg in 1970, has lived in Vienna since 1977, where she also studied. She is a writer and columnist and has worked as an interpreter for many years. Her first book for teens, *Dazwischen: Ich*, was awarded many prizes. In 2019 her teen book *Hinter Glas* was published, followed by *Dazwischen: Wir* in 2022. The idea for *The Smell of Soot and Roses* was conceived during her countless conversations with war survivors and their families.







His love to Elizabeta, the daughter of a regime critic, is doomed to fail, Kajan's mother, a Communist loyal to the line, knows how to separate the young lovers. For Kajan, an adventurous flight begins across the GDR, to West Berlin and the USA. And yet, the story will inevitably bring the two lovers together again.

A great novel about family and betrayal – and about a love of the century in times of totalitarianism.





Until one day a new kind of intervention is developed, aimed at releasing women from psychological distress. Its side effects can be painful, but then patients start to heal. Meret holds onto this thought, even as she slowly begins to have her doubts about it.

A Simple Procedure is not just the story of a young woman who, in a world of strict hierarchies and dehumanised female patients, begins to lose her belief in the power of medicine. It is also an intense evocation of a love with its own unique rules: Meret falls in love with another female nurse. And in so doing, she oversteps an invisible boundary.







Kurt, in his early thirties and gay, has finally found a job as a teacher and a small flat. At first, the sounds from the flat next door bother him. But when he gets to know Mr Drechsler, who has been living in the block for decades, he can even get used to his toilet flushing. Kurt also quickly befriends Regina, the newcomer on the fourth floor. And when, after a failed relationship, his best friend moves in and one of his students suddenly seeks refuge from world politics, Kurt finally realises what family can mean.

Dominik Barta was born 1982 in Upper Austria, studied in Vienna, Bonn and Florence. He won the ZEIT essay competition in 2009 and an Ö1 literature competition in 2017 and also writes for the theatre. His debut novel *Vom Land* was published in 2020.




