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IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS

WARNING!

When using electrical appliances, basic precautions should always be followed to reduce the risk of fire, electric shock, and injury to persons, including the following:

1. Read all instructions before installing or using this heater.
2. This heater is hot when in use. To avoid burns, do not let bare skin touch hot surfaces. Keep combustible materials, such as furniture, pillows, bedding, papers, clothes, etc. and curtains at least 3 feet (0.9 m) from the front of the heater and keep them away from the sides and rear.
3. Extreme caution is necessary when any heater is used by or near children or invalids and whenever the heater is left operating and unattended.
4. Do not operate any heater after it malfunctions. Disconnect power at service panel and have heater inspected.
5. Do not use outdoors.
6. To disconnect heater, turn controls to off, and turn off power to heater circuit at main disconnect panel (or operate internal disconnect switch if provided).
7. Do not insert or allow foreign objects to enter any ventilation or exhaust opening as this may cause an electric shock or fire, or damage the heater.
8. To prevent a possible fire, do not block air intakes or exhaust in any manner.
9. A heater has hot and arcing or sparking parts inside. Do not use it in areas where gasoline, paint, or flammable vapors or liquids are used or stored.
10. Use this heater only as described in this manual. Any other use not recommended by the manufacturer may cause fire, electric shock, or injury to persons.
11. SAVE THESE INSTRUCTIONS.
12. Ensure clearances to combustibles are maintained when building a mantel or shelves above the appliance. Elevated temperatures on the wall or in the air above the appliance can cause melting, discolouration or damage to decorations, a T.V. or other electronic components.
13. Amantii reserves the right to update and change the specifications and instructions in this manual as needed. If in doubt, please visit our website at www.amantii.com for the most recent version of the manual.
14. To reduce the risk of fire, do not store or use gasoline or other flammable vapors and liquids in the vicinity of the heater.
15. See directions in Figure 1. This heater is for use on 120 volts. The cord has a plug as shown in figure 1. See Figure 1 for grounding instruction. An adapter as shown at C is available for connecting three-blade grounding type plugs to two-slot receptacles. The green grounding plug extending from the adapter must be connected to a permanent ground such as a properly grounded outlet box. The adapter should not be used if a three-slot grounded receptacle is available.

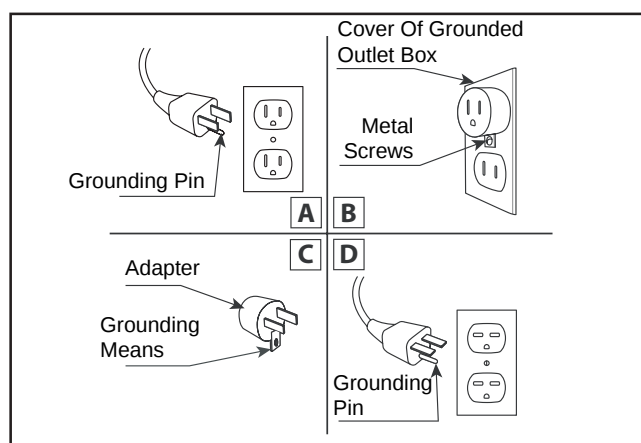

INSTALLATION OVERVIEW



SITE SELECTION

Your new fireplace may be wall mounted, installed into existing framing or built into a wall.

Review and consider all of the following conditions for installation:

- Dimensions of the unit
- Unit requires a minimum of two (2) wall studs in order to ensure a secure installation.

NOTE: A 15 Amp, 120 Volt circuit is required. A dedicated circuit is preferred but not essential in all cases.



WARNING:

Ensure the power cord is not installed so that it is pinched or against a sharp edge and ensure that the power cord is stored or secured to avoid tripping or snagging to reduce the risk of fire, electric shock or injury to persons.

Construction and electrical outlet wiring must comply with local building codes and other applicable regulations to reduce the risk of fire, electric shock and injury to persons.

To reduce the risk of fire, do not store or use gasoline or other flammable vapors and liquids in the vicinity of the heater.



NOTE: BEFORE YOU INSTALL

1. Select a location that is not susceptible to moisture, dust and is away from high traffic locations and things that many catch fire or block openings such as drapes, pillows, furniture etc.
2. For the best effect install the fireplace out of direct sunlight and away from overhead lighting.
3. If possible, select a location near an existing electrical outlet for ease of electrical hook up.
4. Remove fireplace, front, fireglass media, and all hardware from box and remove all packaging related materials prior to installation.
5. Plug in the unit, then press the control button on the unit or remote control. (ensure the batteries are installed to remote control.) After this, ensure the LED lights are working correctly.
6. Press ON/OFF key to close the unit, then pull the plug from the socket. Store the fireplace in a safe, dry and dust free location until you are ready to install the fireplace.

HARDWIRE INSTRUCTIONS

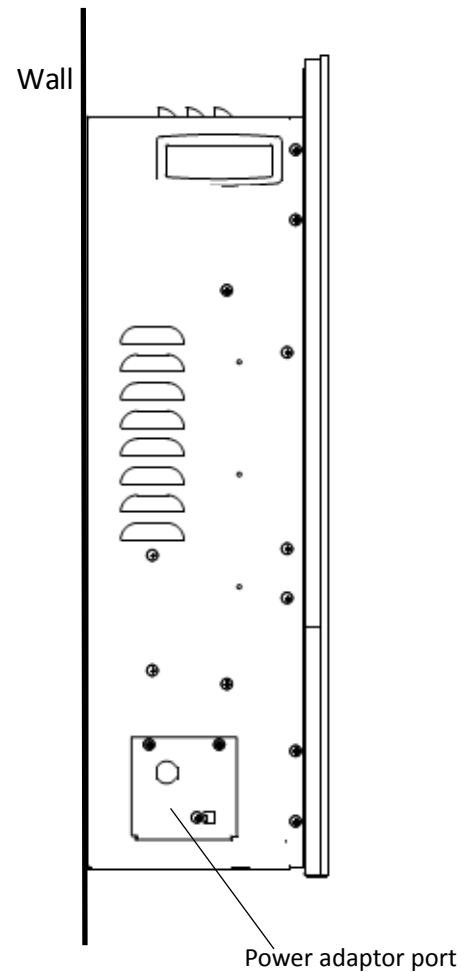


1. Make sure the appliance is switched OFF (refer to page 15 for instruction)
2. Attach the provided adaptor to the power port on the right hand side of the unit.
3. Plug unit into electrical outlet.

HARD-WIRE INSTALLATION

If it is necessary to hard wire this appliance, a qualified electrician may remove the cord connection, and wire the appliance directly to the house hold wiring.

1. Unscrew two screws shown in the below. Remove the cover plate and the power cord fix piece, remove power cord. Remove the knockout.
2. Attach the wiring to the junction block
3. Put the plate back and screw back.

WARNING:

Do not attempt to wire your own new outlets or circuits. To reduce the risk of injury, electric shock or fire, use a licensed electrician.

Appliance has overheated and safety device has caused the thermal switch to discount. Unplug the appliance, allow appliance to cool for 15 minutes, then plug back in.

Inspect for an objects on or adjacent to the heater that may have locked the airflow or otherwise caused high temperatures to have occurred.

INSTALLATION-BUILT-IN



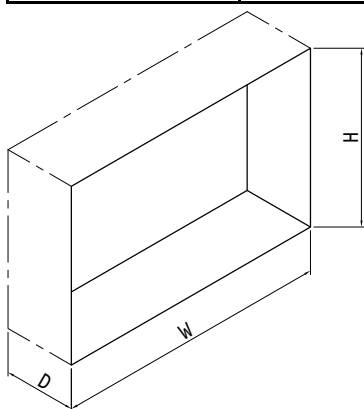
NOTE: BEFORE YOU INSTALL

- The BI-DEEP models are designed to be built-in and allow for the finishing material (drywall, stone, tile, etc) to be built right down to the glass edge. However, that application is not always desirable or available so the surround could be used as an alternate finish option.

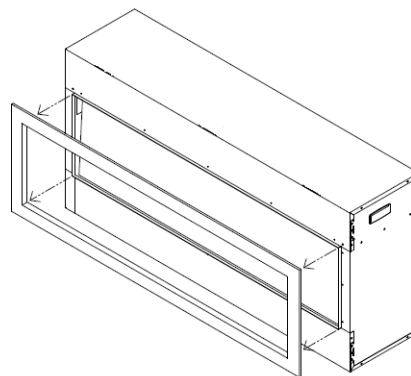
NOTE: The optional trim can be pull out directly from the unit. It will need two person to do it.

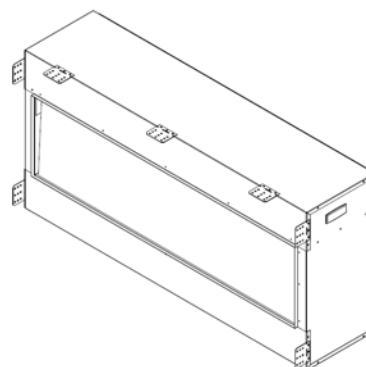

1. Take out the unit from the box. Pull out the optional trim from the unit as show right.

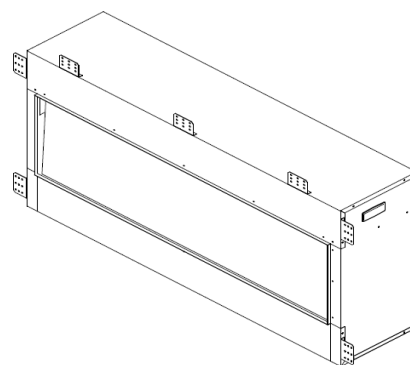


2. Screw the framing plates to the fireplace.

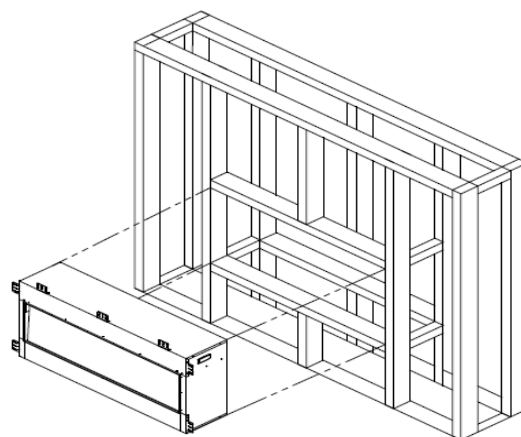




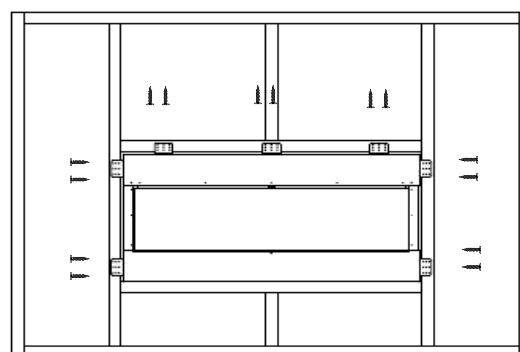
3. Bent up the framing plates.

5. Drive the mounting screws into the framing plates on the units and the wall studs.



Media options



The BI-40-DEEP and BI-50-DEEP and BI-60-DEEP is shipped with 3 large glass nuggets, clear and blue diamond shaped media and 6 piece log set.

The BI-72-DEEP and BI-88-DEEP is shipped with 6 large glass nuggets, clear and blue diamond shaped media and 6 piece log set.



Fire Glass Media - Log Installation

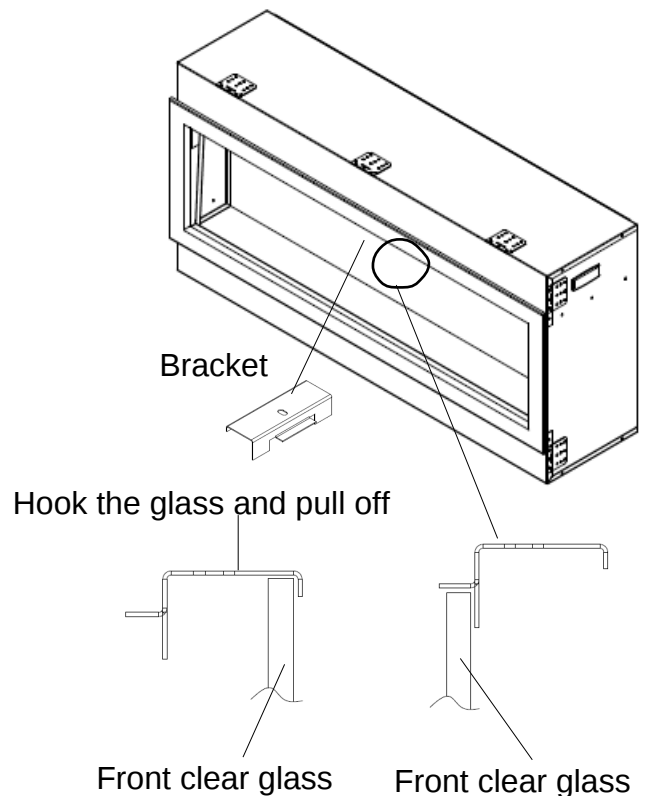


1. Take off the front clear glass.

There is a bracket which hold the front glass. It is show as left. Unscrew the screw and take off the bracket. Turn around and insert to the gap. It can hook the glass and pull out the glass.

2. Installing the fire glass media

Pour the fire glass media into the tray as shown below. Fee free to use any combination of fire glass media that you find most appealing.



OPERATING THE UNIT



The button located at the top position of the remote control is ON/OFF. Press it, the flame and ember will be on. The heater will be off. Press again, the fireplace will turn off.

“DISPLAY ON/OFF”: Switching the fireplace flame and tray light ON/OFF. It has functions of setting memory.

“DISPLAY ORANGE ”: Adjust the orange colour brightness of flame.

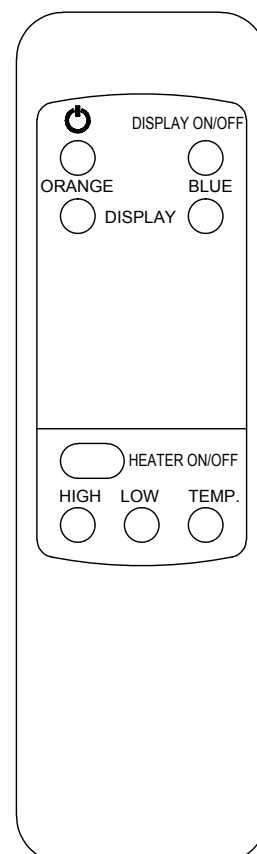
“DISPLAY BLUE ”: Adjust the blue colour brightness of flame.

“HEATER ON/OFF”: Switching the fireplace heater ON/OFF. It has functions of setting memory.

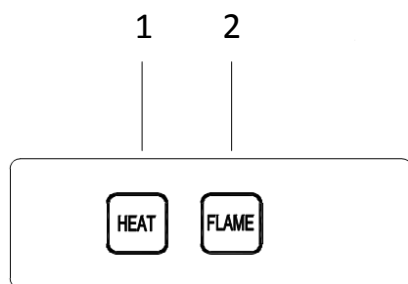
“HIGH”: The heater works at 1500W.

“LOW”: The heater works at 750W.

“TEMP.”: The heater keep working if the room temperature lower than 22°C. The heater not working if the room temperature higher than 25°C.



Main Unit Buttons Operations



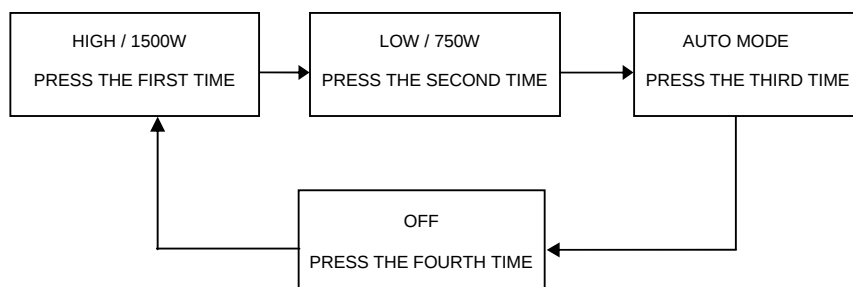
1. Heat control button

2. Flame control button

Plug the heater into a suitable outlet.

1) “Heat control button”

Press the HEAT button repeatedly to set the heater to the desired heat setting. The Heater will work on as shown below.



Auto Mode

In this mode the heater will automatically turn on and off. When the room temperature drops below 71° F. (22° C) the heater will turn on to the high heat setting (1500 watt). When the room temperature is between 71° and 77° F (22-25° C) the heater output will switch to low heat setting (750W). When the room temperature goes above 77° F (25° C) the heater will turn off.

2) “Flame control button”

Press the Flame brightness adjustment button to adjust the flame height and ember bed brightness. Press the FLAME control button to cycle through LO, MED, HI and OFF.

REPLACING THE REMOTE CONTROL BATTERY

When the remote control stops operating or its range seems reduced, it is time to replace the batteries with new ones. Remove the batteries if the remote control won't be used for a long period of time.

1. The battery compartment is located on the back end of the remote.
2. Press the small tab inward as you slide the battery door open and remove the old batteries.
3. Replace with (2) AAA batteries (not included), making sure the + and - sides of the battery match the inside of the battery compartment.
4. Replace the battery door.

CAUTION:

- Always purchase the correct size and grade of battery most suitable for the intended use.
- Replace all batteries of a set at the same time.
- Clean the battery contacts and also those of the device prior to battery installation.
- Ensure the batteries are installed correctly with regard to polarity (+ and -).
- Remove batteries from equipment which is not to be used for an extended period of time.
- Remove used batteries promptly.

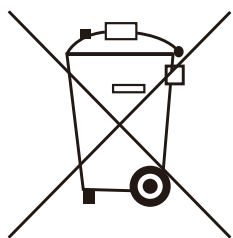
Note: Do not mix old and new batteries.

Do not mix alkaline, standard (carbonzinc), or rechargeable (nicad, nimh, etc) batteries.

DISPOSAL OF USED BATTERIES

Batteries may contain hazardous substances which could be endangering to the environment and to human health.

Note: please operate remote transmitter at a slow measured pace. Press the remote control buttons with an even motion and gentle pressure. Repeatedly pressing buttons in rapid succession may cause the transmitter to Malfunction.

CARE AND MAINTENANCE

CLEARANCE TO COMBUSTIBLES

Keep electrical cords, drapery, furniture and other combustibles at least 3 ft. from the front of the heater and away from the sides.

CLEANING TRIM

Clean the metal trim using a soft cloth, slightly dampened with a citrus oil-based product and buff with a clean soft cloth. Do not use brass polish or household cleaners as these products will damage the metal trim. Citrus oil-based products can be obtained at supermarkets or hardware stores.



WARNING: Make sure the power is turned off before proceeding. Any electrical repairs or rewiring of this unit should be carried out by a licensed electrician in accordance with national and local codes.

If repairing or replacing any electrical component or wiring, the original wire routing, color coding and securing locations must be followed.



WARNING: Electrical outlet wiring must comply with local building codes and other applicable regulations to reduce the risk of fire, electrical shock and injury to persons.



WARNING: Do not use this fireplace if any part of it has been under water. Immediately call a qualified service technician to inspect the fireplace and replace any part of the electrical system.



WARNING: Disconnect power before attempting any maintenance or cleaning to reduce the risk of fire, electrical shock or personal injury.



WARNING: During any service of this appliance, the power to the unit must be turned off. First turn the main power switch to the OFF position. Then remove the electrical plug from the wall outlet.

FIREPLACE MAINTENANCE



WARNING:

Disconnect power before performing any maintenance or cleaning to reduce the risk of fire, electric shock or damage.

LED LIGHT BULB REPLACEMENT

LED light bulbs are to be replaced by the manufacturer, it's service agent or similar qualified person in order to avoid hazard.



WARNING:

Allow at least 5 minutes for LED bulbs to cool off before handling bulbs to avoid burns.

UNIT DISPOSAL

Do not dispose with other household wastes. To prevent possible harm to the environment or human health from uncontrolled waste disposal, recycle it responsibly to promote the sustainable reuse of material resources. Contact your local landfill for appropriate disposal instruction.

TROUBLE SHOOTING



WARNING

Disconnect power before performing any maintenance and allow to cool before servicing. Only a qualified service person should service and repair this electric appliance.

SYMPTOM	POSSIBLE CAUSES	CORRECTIVE ACTION
Fireplace doesn't work.	Fireplace inner temperature over heating or home circuit breaker has opened.	Reset switch by turning main power switch off and waiting five minutes, then turning it back on.
Flame is fixed (unmoving).	Wiring may be loose or the flame motor may be defective.	Call a qualified service technician. Inspect all wiring for loose connections. If the wire connections are good, replace the flame motor.
Dim or poorly visible flame or log set and ember is not glowing.	LED Light(s) burnt out or wiring is loose.	Inspect all wiring for loose connections and repair or replace if necessary. Inspect light bulbs and replace if necessary.
Flame sputters. Remote Control does not work.	Flame motor is defective Low batteries. Unit switch and/or wall switch in "OFF" position.	Call a qualified service technician and replace flame motor. Replace AA batteries in remote control. If problem persists, there may have been a loss of power to the unit as a possible result from a power failure (i.e. Breaker tripped). Turn off main power on/off switch (see figure 4) and/or optional wall switch (if applicable).
Circuit Breaker trips or fuse blows when the unit is on.	Improper circuit current rating.	Call a qualified service technician. Check the house circuit to ensure it is on a dedicated circuit with proper amp. rating. If the circuit breaker continues to trip (or blown fuses), inspect wiring for a loose connection or a dead short. Repair or replace wiring and/or connectors as necessary.
Heater does not provide heat when turned on	Thermal switch has been tripped Circuit breaker has been tripped	Turn the unit off and unplug the unit for five minutes. Plug back in and turn the unit on. If plug can be reached, follow directions for tripped circuit breaker. Turn off circuit breaker that supplies electricity to the unit. Wait five minutes then flip circuit breaker back on.
Appliance turns off and will not turn on.	a. Appliance has overheated and safety device has caused the thermal switch to disconnect. OR b. House circuit breaker has tripped.	a. Unplug the appliance, allow appliance to cool for 15 minutes, then plug back in. b. Reset the house circuit breaker

Amantii Imports Corp. ("Amantii") warrants that your newly purchased Amantii electric fireplace is free from manufacturing and material defects for a period of one (1) year from the date of the first purchase, subject to the conditions and limitations contained below.

Warranty Application & Exclusions

This limited warranty applies to your newly purchased Amantii electric fireplace; the limited warranty's application is limited to purchases made in any province of Canada or in any of the 52 States of the United States of America, including the District of Columbia. Only the original purchaser of the product is eligible for coverage under this limited warranty; the warranty is not transferable.

Products excluded from this limited warranty

Light bulbs are not covered by this limited warranty and are the sole responsibility of the owner/purchaser.

Warranty Coverage and Team

Products covered by this limited warranty have been tested and inspected prior to shipment and, subject to the provisions of this warranty, Amantii warrants such products to be free from defects in material and workmanship for a period of one (1) year from the date of the first purchase of such products.

The limited one (1) year warranty period for products also applies to any implied warranties that may exist under applicable law. Some jurisdictions do not allow limitations on how long an implied warranty lasts, so the above limitation may not apply to the purchaser.

All other warranties - expressed or implied - with respect to the product, its components and accessories or any obligation/liabilities on the part of Amantii are hereby expressly excluded.

Limitations to Coverage Under Limited Warranty

This limited warranty does not apply to products that have been repaired, except by Amantii or its authorized service representatives, or otherwise altered. This limited warranty further does not apply to defects resulting from misuse, abuse, accident, neglect, incorrect installation, improper maintenance or handling, or operation with an incorrect power source.
