WHEN TO FILE FOR THIS EXEMPTION

- Applicants must file by the end of the year for the tax year in which they are seeking relief.
- For example, an applicant who receives their Veterans Administration rating letter in April 2020 must file an exemption claim by December 31, 2020.
- To receive the full exemption for a supplemental bill (if any), the claim must be filed within 30 days of the Notice of Supplemental Assessment.
- Claims received after these dates are still eligible for exemption, but at a reduced amount for the initial filing.
- Low-income exemptions require an annual application by February 15 each year (the basic exemption is a one-time filing; no annual claims are required after the initial filing).

★ WHO MAY QUALIFY? ★

Veteran homeowners who suffered injury or disease while serving in the military may be eligible for a *Disabled Veterans' Property Tax Exemption* on their primary residence. California law also extends this tax savings to the unmarried spouse of a qualifying veteran.



QUALIFICATIONS

- The U.S. Veterans Administration or the military service from which the veteran was discharged has rated the disability at 100-percent or has rated the disability compensation at 100 percent by reason of being unable to secure or maintain a substantially gainful occupation.
- Unmarried surviving spouses of a deceased veteran who qualified for this exemption or whose death was shown to be service-connected.

★ TWO EXEMPTION LEVELS ★

BASIC EXEMPTION

The basic exemption for 2025 is \$175,298 which at a 1% tax rate, is a \$1,752 savings off a primary residence's 2025 tax bill. Once granted, the Basic Exemption remains in effect until canceled, and once canceled, a new claim must be filed.

LOW-INCOME EXEMPTION

The *low-income exemption* for 2025 is \$262,950 which at a 1% tax rate is a \$2,629 savings off the primary residence's 2025 tax bill. The low-income exemption is based on total household income and requires an annual filing each year by February 15 for the full exemption.

Please note: The amount of the exemption may never exceed the assessed value of the claimant's residence.

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★ REQUIRED DOCUMENTS ★

- 1. A completed *Claim for Disabled Veterans'*Property Tax Exemption BOE-261-G / EXM-32 form (one time filing).
- 2. A complete copy of the *Veteran's Rating Decision Letter** from the Dept. of Veterans' Affairs with the effective date. This may be an electronically generated letter.
- 3. A copy of the *Veteran's DD-214** showing discharged in other than dishonorable conditions.
- 4. If you are filing for the Disabled Veteran Low Income Exemption, a Low-Income Supplemental Worksheet (Form EXM-137) must also be completed and filed annually.

In addition to the items above, surviving spouses also must include:

- a. A copy of the marriage certificate.
- b. A copy of the death certificate or Report of Casualty (if the veteran died in active service).
