A SPELLBINDING TALE OF MARRIAGE, MADNESS AND Murden

Weddings are stressful. Especially when the bride doesn't want to marry the groom. Lucia's abusive brother, Enrico, is forcing her to marry a man she doesn't love to save their family's failing finances. What's worse, the man she *does* love is Enrico's sworn enemy. Her only option? Murder. Donizetti's moody score masterfully conveys Lucia's isolation and instability as she slips into a terrifying world of madness.

Two extraordinary singers—who launched their careers at LA Opera—will take on the iconic title role: Amanda Woodbury, who's now a star at the Metropolitan Opera, and Liv Redpath, who sang Lucia at the Deutsche Oper Berlin this year to rave reviews. Colombian native Lina González-Granados kicks off the season in her first outing as the company's new Resident Conductor. Acclaimed Australian director Simon Stone creates a powerful new production that moves the story to a presentday world of desperation and decline.



In 1807, a West African scholar was captured and forced onto a slave ship bound for South Carolina. Remarkably, Omar Ibn Said told his story in his 1831 autobiography (the only known American slave narrative written in Arabic), the inspiration for this compelling new opera.

Set in an ever-shifting kaleidoscope of memory and imagination, Omar follows his compelling journey from a peaceful life in his homeland to captivity in a violent, foreign world. Through it all, he somehow remains true to himself and his faith.

The luminous score, composed by multi-GRAMMY winner Rhiannon Giddens in collaboration with Michael Abels (Get Out, Us), incorporates distinctive West African traditions with traditional opera instrumentation. Jamez McCorkle makes his company debut as Omar, with Daniel Okulitch in the double role of two very different slave masters.



Angel Blue STARS IN A CROWD-THRILLING TALE OF PASSION, DECEPTION AND CORRUPTION

Tosca, the famous singer, seems to have it all. Audiences cherish her artistry and adore hearing about her tempestuous offstage romances. But as storms of repression and rebellion rage throughout Italy, the diva is forced to play a role she never imagined. Torn between devotion to her lover and the machinations of a sociopath who'll stop at nothing to break her down, she's trapped in an impossible predicament. But this prima donna isn't going down without a fight.

Angel Blue, one of today's brightest stars, takes on the iconic role of Puccini's glamorous but tough-as-nails heroine, with Gregory Kunde as the rebel who draws the ire of the most dangerous man in Rome. Ryan McKinny is the evil Scarpia, who likes nothing more than seeing his victims suffer. In her company debut, Ukrainian superstar Oksana Lyniv conducts a heart-pounding production staged by legendary director John Caird.





Lost in the forest, a prince encounters an ethereal beauty with a mysterious past (and lush locks that would make Rapunzel envious). But after he brings her home to his family, she begins to grow increasingly close to his handsome younger brother. Debussy's sensual, exquisitely nuanced score casts a hypnotic spell, capturing an enigmatic dream world where forbidden love blossoms.

Conducted by the renowned James Conlon, this lyric masterpiece stars Sydney Mancasola and Will Liverman as the secret lovers, and Kyle Ketelsen as the jealous prince. The magnificent Susan Graham makes her role debut as Geneviève, mother of the two rival brothers, and the legendary Ferruccio Furlanetto is King Arkel, the family patriarch unable to grasp the tragedy unfolding before him.



He's a beloved leader, a distinguished military commander and a devoted husband. But when an envious subordinate introduces the notion-just the slightest whispered hint—that Otello's wife Desdemona might possibly be unfaithful, it's enough to send him into a downward spiral of fury and murder.

Hailed as the crowning achievement of Italian opera, Verdi's extraordinary transformation of Shakespeare's play brilliantly portrays a hero's descent into misguided obsession as he destroys everything that he holds dear.

Verdi master James Conlon takes command of the truly epic musical forces, with a powerhouse cast led by Artist in Residence Russell Thomas in the title role (considered the "Mount Everest" of the dramatic tenor repertoire). Rachel Willis-Sørensen makes a highly anticipated company debut as the doomed Desdemona and Igor Golovatenko is the sadistic lago, slyly exploiting Otello's one fatal flaw: jealousy.


PreShow Talks
