





HOW WOULD WE EVALUATE THE READABILITY OF LEGISLATION?

I wanted a way to explore changes in detail (by section) too



So I needed a way to visualise changes in text.



I used the SequenceMatcher in the standard python library.

Step 1: Tokenize text into a list of words

Step 2: Compare the list of words using SequenceMatcher

Step 3: Get the opcodes

Step 4: Create the redlines from the opcodes

Step 5: Finish by forming the output

Redlines

Redlines produces a Markdown text showing the differences between two strings/text. The changes are represented with strike-throughs and underlines, which looks similar to Microsoft Word's track changes. This method of showing changes is more familiar to lawyers and is more compact for long series of characters.

Redlines uses SequenceMatcher to find differences between words used.

Example

Given an original string:

The quick brown fox jumps over the lazy dog.

And the string to be tested with:

The quick brown fox walks past the lazy dog.


