ABOUT THE ULINE ARENA

Uline Arena is an exciting mixed-use project recently re-developed in the burgeoning NoMa neighborhood of Washington, D.C.


The Arena building, best known for being the venue for the first American concert given by The Beatles, is also architecturally significant due to its concrete barrel vault roof and structural concrete arches.

The Ice House building was originally home to Miguel Uline's ice business, because of the sucess of the business, Mr. Uline built the arena to host ice skating and revue's. Later becoming the arena for the Washington Lions, DC's now defunct Eastern Amateur Hockey League

The single-story Arena building was converted into a single level of retail below three levels of office space. The Ice House building has additional ground level retail space with a portion of the first level being dedicated to office. Above this there are two additional levels of office space. Parking is also available on site.


