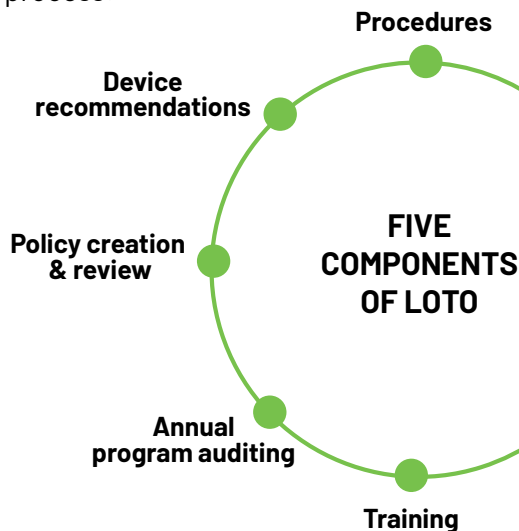

Lockout/tagout package

The lockout/tagout package is a custom modern hazardous energy control program consisting of customized LOTO procedures, complete with the essential elements for compliance with OSHA standard 29 CFR 1910.147.

Annual LOTO Audit Package

Procedure Audits: OSHA requires all lockout/tagout procedures to be reviewed at least once per year. While this might seem excessive, especially for large plants, keep in mind that the number of machine modifications that occur in a year's time averages up to 15% in most industries. And that doesn't account for new equipment that might be installed during the year. The annual audit helps confirm all machines that need one have an updated, written procedure. For older, existing procedures, we review the accuracy of information about energy sources, valves or electrical disconnects, energy source lockout/isolation, devices, and pictures. Deliverables include:

- An audit report documenting audit findings: audited procedures, updated procedures, damaged procedure documents that require reprinting, procedures with missing or damaged isolation point tags, obsolete procedures, and new procedures
- An audit overview detailing the list of audit findings in Microsoft Excel spreadsheet format (includes procedure categories specified above)
