


NATURALLY WEST SHERIDAN, WY

A breathtaking vision of the New West, Sheridan is Wyoming's emerald city. Historic downtown doors swing wide open to extend a warm hospitality as legendary as the icons and outlaws that once roamed these parts, while fabled history and dramatic mountain vistas meet western graces and the serenity of wide open spaces.

The ancient Medicine Wheel, at an altitude of 9,462-feet, lords over the mountains with a mystical presence that defies explanation. Indian battle sites like Fort Phil Kearny, Fetterman and Wagon Box, located on the Bozeman Trail, offer endless educational opportunities. Sheridan is home to 27 attractions listed on the National Register of Historic Places, and is less than an hour by car from the Little Bighorn Battlefield National Monument.



This is a place where cowboys convene over craft beer and coffee, where guests marvel at public art and historic Wyoming architecture, and where modern mavericks revel in Old West charm at Sheridan's bistros, cafes and wineries. Entrepreneurs, ranchers and roughnecks kick through the doors of the Mint Bar, coal-hauling trains roar through the Rail District, and Downtown Sheridan remains a beacon of life well lived in the American West.

THE GREAT OUTDOORS



Outdoor opportunities are limitless when you're roaming the open range on horseback, backpacking unchartered Bighorn Mountain territory or fishing pristine waters. Ski some of the country's most remote backcountry, climb to unfathomable heights in the Cloud Peak Wilderness or Tongue River Canyon, and bike miles of country trails as you close in on the mountains. Sheridan is the trailhead to Wyoming's boldest outdoor experiences.



Sheridan's calendar features events like the WYO Rodeo, Big Horn Country USA, Bighorn Mountain Trail Run, Suds N' Spurs Brewfest, Don King Days, Biketoberfest, Bike MS Wyoming, and cultural events at the Whitney Center for the Arts.

>> SHERIDAN CRAFT IS KING



The Koltiska Distillery crafted their Original Liqueur in 2001, kickstarting a nascent regional distilling industry. Then came Black Tooth, a rebel outfit that ushered in sweeping changes to the craft brewing industry. Today, Sheridan's craft scene is among the most robust in the Mountain West, with two breweries, a distillery, a winery, and more.



The Brinton Museum, located on the 620-acre Quarter Circle A Ranch in Big Horn, offers an authentic view into the lifestyle of an art collector who was a patron to many celebrated 19th and 20th century Western artists.
