Please write a few sentences about why you are interested in being a Working Ranch Intern at HorseWorks Wyoming indicating that you understand that this is a rustic, working horse ranch without amenities such as TV, texting and other digital media (internet only), that you have reviewed the packing list and understand that you need to bring your own sleeping bag, pillow, and other items, including a riding helmet, that you will participate in deciding the calendar of on-ranch and off-ranch activities after your arrival with the other members of your group and all will be expected to participate in these activities, that the price includes only on-ranch activities and that you will be charged and need to budget funds to cover entrance fees and transportation costs to off-ranch events (\$250 is recommended). Intern openings are limited on a first come first served basis.

**REQUIREMENTS: WORKING RANCH – WRANGLER INTERNSHIP**

Interns must be eighteen years of age or older or be accompanied by an adult. In a working ranch environment, learning is a hands-on process. Schedules are flexible due to weather, grass and livestock conditions and some activities (including cattle work) are only seasonal and may not be available during your stay. Responsibility rests with the Intern to observe our policies and take advantage of the opportunities at hand. Ranch policies will be reviewed in detail as part of the in-depth orientation upon arrival at the ranch. Your insurance must cover extensive horseback riding and helmets are strongly recommended, so bring your own – your insurance may not be valid if you are not wearing a helmet. In compliance with the Certified Horsemanship Association, a helmet release **MUST** be signed if you choose not to use a helmet within the vicinity of the corrals or while horseback.

Applicants to the Internship Program should indicate your willingness and ability to endure long hours of physical activity (riding, fence fixing and other chores) and to get along with members of a group. Be candid with yourself and with us about your goals and your limitations.

No prior experience is required. There are no right or wrong answers to why you want to be an Intern. Goals are as varied as the individual Interns who come here. However, you must know your goals, even if they evolve while you are here, and be self-motivated to achieve them under our close supervision. We will discuss with you whether your goals are realistic and work with you to achieve them.

The undersigned, a participant and visitor to HorseWorks Wyoming, LLC, acknowledges that he/she has been advised of the Laws of the State of Wyoming and the United States with regard to the use of alcohol, illegal drugs, and other items which may lead to substance abuse. The undersigned agrees that he/she will abide by the terms of said Laws and will not violate the conditions thereof.
