The same elements that contribute to the unique character of this activity can be causes of loss or damage to my equipment, or accidental injury, illness, or in extreme cases, permanent trauma or death. Therefore, I assume full responsibility for personal injury to myself, and for loss or damage to my personal property and expenses thereof as a result of my negligence of participating in said activity. I further understand that Mule Shoe Outfitters, LLC reserves the right to refuse any person it judges to be incapable of meeting the rigors and requirements of participating in hunting activities.

I have read, understand, and accept the terms and conditions stated herein and acknowledge that this agreement shall be effective and binding upon the parties during the entire period of participation of said hunting activities.

RISKS, HAZARDS, AND DANGERS

The following describes some, but not all of said Risks, Hazards, and Dangers.

- The propensity of the riding and pack animals to behave in ways that may result in injury, harm, or death to persons on or around them.
- The unpredictable of the animals' reaction to such things as sounds, sudden movement, and unfamiliar objects, persons, or other animals.
- Certain hazards such as surface and sub-surface conditions.
- Collision with other animals or objects.
- The potential of the participant to act in a negligent manner that may contribute to injury to the participant or others.
- Encounters with variations within the terrain; including creeks, water, bridges, traveled roads, stumps, forest growth, debris, rocks, cliffs, and other obstacles whether they are obvious or not obvious, manmade or natural.
- Hiking in rugged country.
- · Encounters with wildlife and insects.
- Temperature extremes.
- Adverse unpredictable weather conditions.
- The unavailability of immediate professional (EMTs, MDs) medical attention in the wilderness area.
- The risk of handling firearms and being near others that have firearms in their possession
