Our Executive Chef, Ty Hes, prepares a fresh, from scratch and ever changing menu at our riverside dinner site. Chef Ty has over 17 years of professional culinary experience in world class restaurants and is excited to be on the river cooking outdoors. The cuisine hails from the Low Country of Charleston, S.C., where Ty studied his craft. Our Chef brings a bit of the South to the Mountain West and the Snake River using fresh local ingredients. The menu changes from week to week but you can expect gourmet meals like Cornmeal Crusted Catfish with Spicy Red Pepper Remoulade , Curry Crusted Utah Steelhead Trout, Grilled Bavette Steak with Horseradish Cream served with Dutch oven buttermilk biscuits, Currant and farro "ragout", Honey Glazed Heirloom Carrots, Balsamic Grilled Asparagus and Mixed Berry cobbler. You can only get there by raft, so let us show you the finest dining in Jackson Hole.

The Snake River Canyon is rich in geological history and your guide will point out some of the features that make this canyon unique. You may see river otters, osprey and bald eagles on your trip. CHECK-IN & TRANSPORTATION:

This trip requires check-in 30 minutes prior to launch time. The check-in location is at Mad River located at 1255 S HWY 89, just 2 miles south of the town square, between Whole Grocer and Smith's Grocery. Transportation from the Mad River boathouse to the river and back is provided on every Mad River trip.

WHAT TO WEAR/BRING:

- Synthetic layers + bathing suit
- Shoes that can get wet (and won't fall off-no flip flops!)
- -A sweatshirt/towel for the bus ride home - Snacks/water bottle for your bus to and from the river
- Hats and sunglasses are recommended
- Don't forget sunscreen!

COURSE OF TRIP:

All whitewater trips launch from West Table Boat Ramp in the Snake River Canyon and winds its way south toward Alpine, WY, exiting the river at Sheep Gulch Boat Ramp. Guests travel 8 river miles from start.to finish. There are about 8 sets of rapids, ranging from class I to III. Rapids include Station Creek, Double Draw, Blind Canyon, Big Kahuna, Lunchcounter, Ropes, Champagne, and Cottonwoods.

Small Boat: This raft is an AIRE inflatable, self-bailing, 15'6"raft. This is an 8 man raft. There are 6 paddling positions and 2 non-paddling positions in this raft.

Super Small Boat: This raft is an AIRE inflatable, self-bailing, 13'6" raft. This is a 6 man raft. There are 6 paddling positions in this raft.

Inclusions: Dinner, transportation to and from the river, wetsuits, river booties, splash gear, helmets (when required)
