Mount Magazine has a variety of habitats providing resources for a wide variety of plants and animals including birds. This collage of resources, habitats, and species make Mount Magazine a unique and important part of the Arkansas landscape. For its concentration of birds of conservation interest, Mount Magazine State Park has been recognized as an Important Bird Area by the National Audubon Society.

Birding on Mount Magazine can be very rewarding. Hiking through various habitats will lead to wonderful scenery. Looking down into a forest canopy from a high bluff might provide a unique viewing of a bird from above.

This checklist was compiled by Don R. Simons using his records collected since 2000 and from the Arkansas Audubon Society. Taxonomy and nomenclature follow the Checklist of North American Birds, Seventh Edition, AOU, 1998, as amended through the 45th supplement, July 2004.

The following symbols indicate the local status for species on this list:

- C** = Common (frequently observed)
- F** = Fairly common (occasionally observed)
- U** = Uncommon (not ordinarily observed)
- R** = Rare (not expected)
- *** = Nesting in the park

- Sp** = Spring (March–May)
- S** = Summer (June–July)
- F** = Fall (August–November)
- W** = Winter (December–February)



Seasons overlap, thus, some birds may arrive earlier and/or stay later than the months indicated.

NOTICE: To preserve scenic beauty and ecology, fences and warning signs have not been installed in some park locations. Caution and supervision of your children are required while visiting these areas.
