Butterflies are fascinating creatures to observe. Each year, as habitats and climates change, butterfly populations fluctuate. Butterfly enthusiasts often provide professionals with much-needed data from checklists. You can help supply data by using this checklist when you visit the park. Simply leave this checklist at the visitor center front desk. Available for purchase is Arkansas Butterflies and Moths by Lori Spencer; along with this checklist it will be helpful when you head to the trails to discover these insects.

#### WHAT TO LOOK FOR:

### Feeding:

Butterflies drink with a long, straw-like tube called a proboscis. Was the butterfly...

- Puddling (drinking liquids from damp ground, sand, or other source)?
- Drinking nectar from flowers? Observe the flower species, color, height, and shape.

### Flight:

Flight slow, graceful, soaring?

\_\_\_\_ Flight short, erratic pattern?

### Thermoregulation:

Butterflies are cold-blooded and must rely on the temperature of their environment to warm flight muscles. Butterflies orient their wings to the sun, a behavior called basking.

\_\_\_\_ Dorsal basking (wings open to the sun)

Lateral basking (wings closed, tilted 90° to sun)

### Mating:

Mating behavior is poorly understood and seldom

- \_\_\_\_ Patrolling down a trail or road—males patrol in search of females.
- Perching—males sit and wait for females to fly by an opening, such as a field.
- Hilltopping—unmated males fly to hilltops in search of females on their way up.
- Courtship—females accepting or rejecting
- \_\_\_\_ Mating—may last several hours, one sex may fly away carrying the mate.

NOTES: To preserve scenic beauty and ecology, fences and warning signs have not been installed in some park locations. Caution and supervision of your children are required while visiting these areas.


