Atop the Ozark Mountains on over 450 acres, Turpentine Creek Wildlife Refuge in Eureka Springs, Arkansas is one of only a handful of legitimate large carnivore sanctuaries in the nation. Since 1992, our mission has been to rescue and care for Big Cats and other dangerous animals that have been bought or sold — by individuals and organizations – through one of the most lucrative global industries in the world: the exotic animal trade.

While at the Refuge you'll learn about our mission, and have the opportunity to hear large carnivore vocalizations, view natural predatory behaviors, and watch our animals as they explore their large, grassy habitats.
