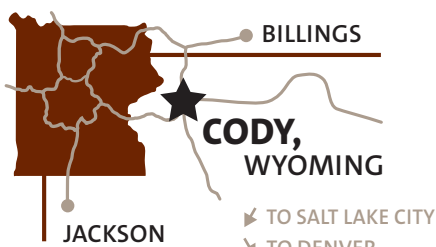


KUYPER DINING PAVILION
