## WELCOME TO THE OZARK FOLK CENTER STATE PARK

Located in Mountain View, Arkansas, the Ozarks region offers densely forested plateaus cut through by streams and rivers in deep valleys. Stone County remains a unique living Ozark culture. Residents enjoy sharing their love of music, making things by hand, and visiting with folks from around the world. The state park is fully open April – October, with additional events, workshops, and the Cabins at Dry Creek open year around.

shops making, demonstrating, and selling their handcrafted works. Crafts featured include pottery, blacksmithing, printing, quilting, woodcarving, weaving, leatherworking, and much more.

Folk music is the heartbeat of the park. During the season there are six live music shows a day in the Craft Village featuring talented local musicians.

The Ozark Highlands Theater comfortably seats 1,000 people and the acoustics are excellent for concerts of all types. Concerts are held several times a year featuring Americana, Roots, Folk, Bluegrass, and traditional Old-Time String Bands.

Ozark Highlands Radio, an award-winning radio program and podcast, is recorded and produced

in the park. The show offers music, interviews, and special segments about the Ozarks by the people who live here. The show is available through affiliate stations across the nation and online worldwide.

The Heritage Herb Garden is a living repository of Ozark knowledge located throughout the Craft Village. The garden areas showcase a living collection of pass-along plants, medicinal herbs, native plants, culinary herbs, and old-time vegetables. Plants are available to purchase from the Plant Arbor and the Herb Education Center offers interpretive displays of the plants of the Ozarks and how people have used them. Displays vary with the season. Herb and garden workshops are offered throughout the year.

The Homespun Gift Shop is open during the season, offering souvenirs and a variety of handcrafted works from artisans around the state of Arkansas.

The Cabins at Dry Creek, located in the park just downhill from the Skillet Restaurant, provide modern. comfortable accommodations for individuals, couples, families, and groups. The rooms are all ground level, in duplex pods. All rooms sleep 2–4 people and have a private bathroom, telephone, microwave, minifridge, coffee pot, WiFi, and satellite television. The Cabins Office offers a gathering space and an outdoor swimming pool is open May 1 to October 1.

The park offers conference space and set ups for groups of up to 150 people year around. The Bois d'Arc Conference Center, located in the woods below the park, is a private space for retreats, workshops, receptions, and parties.

The Skillet Restaurant, located between the Cabins at Dry Creek and the Visitor Center, serves award-winning southern cooking using seasonal local produce and herbs grown in the park. The dining room is surrounded by floor-to-ceiling windows that offer a unique view of the surrounding forest. Wildlife viewing is a favorite mealtime treat. Open to the public during the season, the Skillet is available to groups and conferences year around.
