LAKE DARDANELLE STATE PARK

Bald eagles at Lake Dardanelle State Park display beauty, skill, strength, and speed as we watch them fly, hunt, and soar through the sky.

Lake Dardanelle is home to *resident* nesting eagles and serves as a winter home for *migratory* bald eagles. There are numerous active nests around the lake, providing opportunities for viewing these magnificent birds year round.
