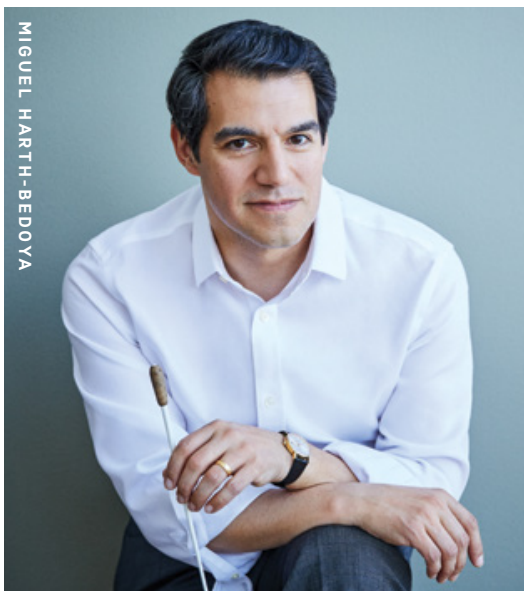

We can't wait to share this music with you.



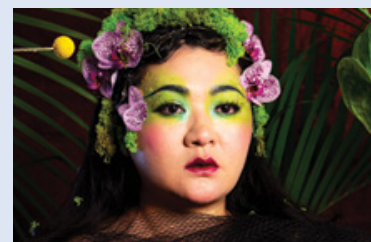

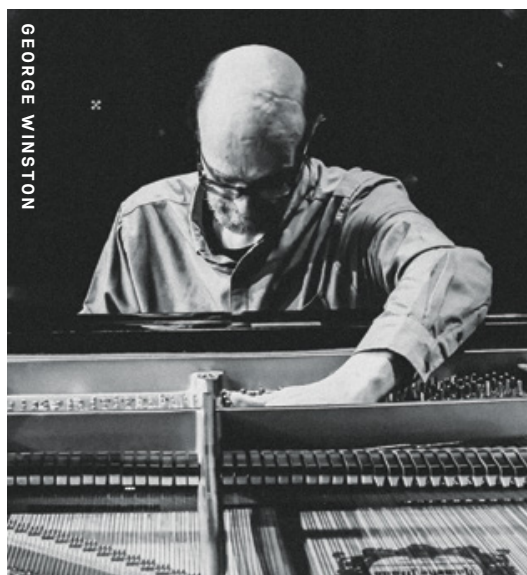

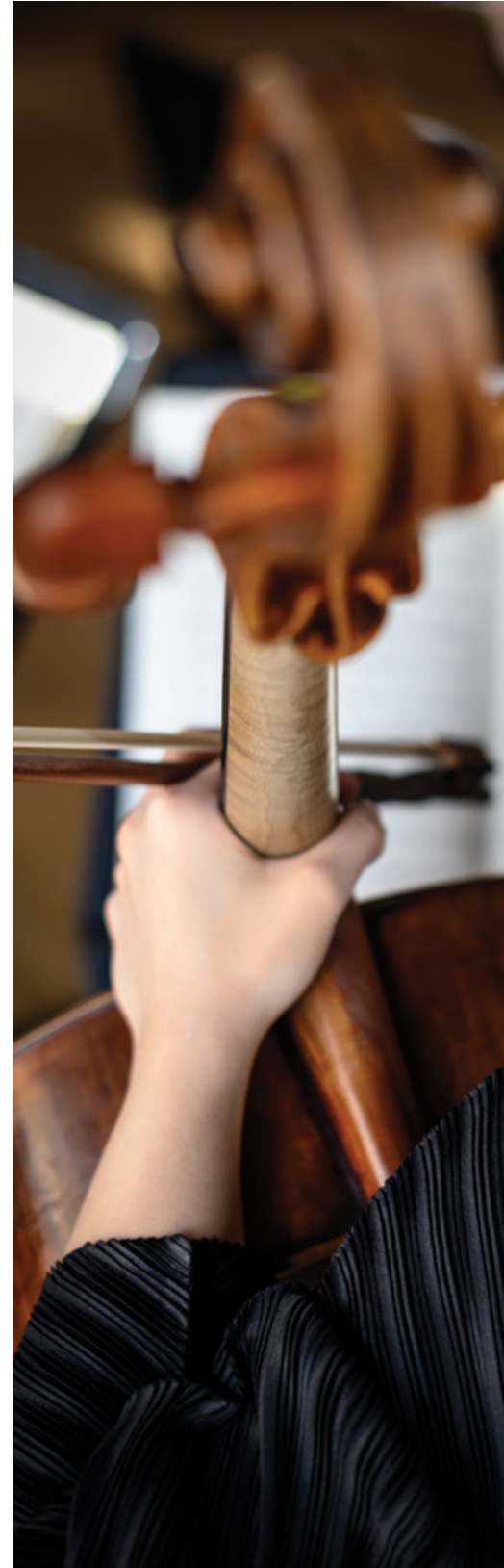
