- Recent concertos for instruments less frequently spotlighted: a Latin dance-flavored trumpet concerto by Arturo Márquez and a saxophone concerto by Billy Childs, co-commissioned by the Minnesota Orchestra, that highlights Black experiences in America.
- Michael Abels' score for the Oscar-winning film Get Out, as part of our Movies & Music series.
- The Sphinx Virtuosi share the stage with the Orchestra in a program that includes Carlos Simon's meditative *Breathe* and an energetic concerto for two basses written by Xavier Foley. Also on the program, Michael Abels' piece *Global Warming*-a nod to the Great Northern festival.
- Through our ongoing Listening Project, we spotlight the music of historically underrepresented composers and collaborate with a broader group of today's composers.

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

The 2023-24 season leaps into action with Strauss' heroic *Don Juan* and epic *Alpine Symphony*. At the center of the program, Principal Oboe Nathan Hughes makes his solo debut playing Mozart's Oboe Concerto.

Juraj Valčuha returns to Orchestra Hall to lead this monumental symphony. He brings with him Jörgen van Rijen, principal trombone of the Royal Concertgebouw Orchestra, for the Minnesota Orchestra's first performance of James MacMillan's Trombone Concerto.
