WHAT IS THIS EVENT?

- This event is held in honour of Wear It Purple Day Learn more here!
- Wear It Purple Pride Party is a social dance party for LGBTQIA+ youth aged 12 to 19
- This is a space to make some amazing queer youth pals, and celebrate who you are
- You can wear whatever you feel comfortable in, but the theme is PURPLE!
- This event is held at the Victorian Pride Centre in St Kilda
- There are high, medium and low sensory areas at this event
- Feel free to bring fidgets, sensory toys, accessibility aids or noise-cancelling headphones
- This is an alcohol-free, drug-free, smoke-free and vape-free event!
- Youth Workers and Minus18 Safety Angels will be present at the event

HOW TO GET THERE

Tram:


- Plan your journey here!
- Flinders St Station: Take the route 16 tram from Melbourne University towards Kew. Alight at stop #133
- Southern Cross Station / Parliament Station: Take the route 96 tram from East Brunswick towards St Kilda beach. Alight at tram stop #132 St Kilda Station, Accessible tram stop
- From East Brunswick / Fitzroy North / Fitzroy: Take the route 96 tram from East Brunswick towards St Kilda beach. Get off at tram stop #132 St Kilda Station, Accessible tram stop
- From Kew / Hawthorn / Malvern / Caulfield North / Balaclava: Take the route 16 tram from Kew towards Melbourne University. Get off at stop#132 St Kilda Station, Accessible tram stop

Car: You can get dropped off at the front of VPC, otherwise there is local street parking close by.



GETTING THERE SAFELY


- Minus18 Youth Workers and Safety Angels will be present at St Kilda Station tram stop, and will walk with you to the Victorian Pride Centre
- Get off at tram stop #132 St Kilda Station/Fitzroy St
- They will help you get home safely at the end of the event!
- We will have a group walking to and from the event! Meet at the Flinders Street Station steps at:
 - **5:20pm -** Meet at St Kilda Station Accessible Tram Stop
 - 8:30pm 8:40pm Meet out the front of the VPC








- Pride Minus18 branded signs
- Rainbow flags

Minus 18 Young Leaders are a group of 20 incredible LGBTQIA+ youth leaders aged 18 to 25!

They will be wearing rainbow pride lanyards. They will be hosting fun activities at this event!

WHAT TO BRING

- Your digital ticket ready to be scanned! This will be in your email inbox
- A fully charged phone (we'll have some chargers at Minus18 HQ if you need!)
- An empty water bottle (that you can re-fill once inside)
- Noise cancelling headphones or earplugs (if you want to)
- A facemask (if you want to wear one)
- A mobility aid (if applicable)
- A fidget toy if you need!
- Snacks (optional)



ENTERING THE EVENT

- I can arrive any time from 5:30pm
- There are <u>no vapes</u> or cigarettes allowed at this event. They will be confiscated at the door by Youth Workers!
- There are no pass outs if you leave you won't be able to come back inside



ENTERING THE EVENT

- I will walk into the Victorian Pride Centre
- There will be Minus18 Youth Workers near the entrance to help guide me to the ticket scanners
- There will be a security guard at the front of the venue
- I will get my ticket ready on my phone for scanning
- I will show my digital ticket to the Minus18 Young Leader
- The Minus18 Young Leader will scan my ticket and I will be able to enter the venue (valid ticket holders)
- If I have a bag, Minus18 Youth Workers will check my bag inside
- I will enter the event

- Some of our amazing Young Leaders will be at Minus18 HQ to say hi and tell you about the event! If I have any questions, I can go to Minus18 HQ
- You can pick up a pronoun pin or name and pronoun tag!

- We will have phone chargers available
- I can pick up some earplugs



SENSORY GUIDE - SOUND (9)))

- Announcements
- Voices & chatting
- Cheering & applause
- Music (live and pre-recorded)
- Camera shutter (photos being taken)
- JENGA tower falling over
- Shouting, whooping and singing



SENSORY GUIDE - TACTILE FEELS WW

- Crowd movement
- Shared personal space
- The Foyer at Victorian Pride Centre will be busy
- Change in ground surface (concrete to carpet)
- Temperature changes
- Vibrations from music depending on how close you are to the stage



SENSORY GUIDE - SMELLS &

- Perfume & body sprays
- Food (there will be snacks and water)
- Textas, POSCA paint pens and PVA glue smells
- Deodorant & people smells (e.g. sweat)
- [ARRIVAL / EXIT] Petrol & exhaust fumes



SENSORY GUIDE - SIGHT ©

- Bright lights on stage
- Large crowds
- Performers in costume
- Lots of colour
- High ceilings
- Camera flashes
- Performers on stage who might display different expressions,
 movements and audience interactions




SENSORY GUIDE - EMOTIONAL SENSES



- Excitement: You may experience anticipation and excitement at different points of the event
- Connection: You may feel connected with the community around you
- Euphoria: You may feel euphoric during the event
- Overwhelmed: You may feel overwhelmed at different points of the event. There are youth workers and quiet spaces to support you!





SENSORY GUIDE - STIMMING

Stimming involves repetitive movements, vocalisation or object manipulation!

- You may see people stimming at this event!
- You may want to stim at this event!

This event is a safe space for stimming and all emotional expression!



WHAT CAN I DO AT THIS EVENT - DANCE FLOOR

- I can listen to the performances
- I can join in a friend making activity
- I can dance the night away!
- I can request a song
- I can join a dance circle
- I can chat to other queer youth
- I can dance with other queer youth
- I can start or join a conga line (there is always at least one)
- I can clap at the end of each performance
- I can sit down on a chair if I need a break



WHAT CAN I DO AT THIS EVENT - HANGOUT SPACE

- I can chat with some queer youth friends
- I can do some drawing
- I can get some water
- I can say hi to Queerspace Youth
- I can speak to a Youth Worker
- I can sit down and take a break if I need it
- I can play some games like JENGA or UNO
- I can walk into the quiet room if I need to





WHAT CAN I DO AT THIS EVENT - ACTIVITY SPACE

- I can get a photo at the DIY Photobooth
- I can get a snack or drink of water
- I can check out the Sportsgirl Station
- I can sit on a chair and relax
- I can speak with some other attendees
- I can speak to a Youth Worker
- I can go to Minus18 HQ



ACCESSIBILITY

- Minus18 Staff are all First Aid trained
- St Johns First Aid will be at this event
- There are Youth Workers available on site
- All event areas have wheelchair ramp access
- This event is has a quiet low sensory space
- There is a Quiet Space I can access with a Youth Worker
- All-gender bathrooms



WHAT IF I NEED HELP?

- I can speak to a Youth Worker and ask for help
- I can tell a friend I need to speak to a Youth Worker
- I can go to the Quiet Space and sit with a Youth Worker
- I can tell the Minus18 crew I need some help
- I can speak to a First Aid if I need medical support
- I can speak to a Young Leader and ask about the event
