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DIRECTORS REPORT

Standing Together for LGBTQIA+ Youth in Australia

This year, LGBTQIA+ youth in Australia have faced an unprecedented rise in challenges and attacks. As the nation's leading champion for queer youth, Minus18 has been at the forefront of these, and we have felt their full impact.

For those who have followed us through our newsletters, social media, and public appearances, this is not new information but it does serve as a reminder of the urgency and necessity of our mission.

Despite these obstacles, we have stood tall, responding with resilience and determination. When confronted with adversity, we rose above. We increased our investment in youth safety, extended the reach of our free inclusion programs, and openly shared our experiences to ensure the voices of LGBTQIA+ youth are heard, and the evolving climate does not go unnoticed.

Yet, our work is far from over and is becoming increasingly challenging. Most of our supporters are surprised to learn that less than 8% of our total revenue comes from state or federal government sources. We have faced the rising cost of delivering our essential programs, however despite these headwinds we remain committed to ensuring that every LGBTQIA+ young person has access to safe, empowering spaces. To all of our steadfast supporters - we thank you - we could not do this without you.

This past year alone, we've continued to make a profound impact. Here are some highlights:

4,363 LGBTQIA+ youth were uplifted through free life-affirming programs.

17,738 new allies were educated through our initiatives 16% of whom were located in regional or rural areas.

10,039 schools and workplaces held inclusion activities using free Minus18 resources and reached over 1.9 million individuals.

Despite a year of adversity, we have only deepened our resolve. These experiences fuel our commitment to expanding our reach and creating spaces where young people can be unapologetically themselves.

We also call upon our allies to step up and join us in this critical work.

As always, Minus18 thrives because of you—our community. Your social media shares, hosting activities, and every donation, no matter the size, enables us to continue building an Australia where every LGBTQIA+young person feels safe, supported, and celebrated.

Together, we are making this vision a reality. If you're in a position to do so, help us to champion this work in your school, workplace or community.

YOUTH VOICE

953 LGBTQIA+ youth shared their voice with Minus 18 to inform our programs.

Our youth-driven approach is powered by the voices of LGBTQIA+ youth across Australia. As Minus18 grows, we remain committed to not only listening to their experiences but also using our platform to amplify them, ensuring LGBTQIA+ youth are better represented in communities nationwide.

YOUNG LEADERS

The Young Leaders Program is a 10 month course for 20 LGBTQIA+ youth aged 18-25.

Through fortnightly development sessions this program builds the skills, confidence and social connection of 20 LGBTQIA+ youth to be the next generation of LGBTQIA+ leaders and bring Minus18 youth programs to life.



LIFE-AFFIRMING EVENTS

We created spaces for 4,363 LGBTQIA+ youth to finally be themselves, safely.

Minus 18 events provide a life-affirming space for LGBTQIA+ young people to make friends, and truly be themselves without fear of judgement. These spaces are designed with youth safety experts, and brought to life by the Minus 18 Young Leaders.

Events Breakdown

QUEER FORMAL®

Queer Formal is Minus 18's flagship event, providing hundreds of LGBTQIA+ youth with the inclusive high school formal experience they otherwise would not have.

→ 1,925 LGBTQIA+ youth attended Queer Formal across Melbourne, Sydney and Adelaide this year.

DISCORD

This year we launched the Minus 18 Discord Server, a safe, supervised online space for LGBTQIA+ youth. Discord allows young people to build connection no matter their location, especially supporting regional and rural young people to make friends.

→ 567 young people joined Discord sessions this year.

YOUTH EVENTS

From high-energy Pride March and Pride Parties to low-sensory Crafternoons - Minus18 offers spaces for all young people to celebrate their identity safely. Many of these spaces are also provided online to ensure accessibility across Australia.

→ 1,870 young people joined our other Youth Events this year.

EMERGING ARTISTS

We created 85 paid opportunities for emerging LGBTQIA+ artists.

Through our youth programs, we created 85 paid opportunities for emerging LGBTQIA+ artists and performers.

- → 87% of these artists were under 30 years old.
- → 55% of artists were trans, non binary or gender diverse.
- → 50% of artists booked were people of colour.
- → 20% of artists booked were Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander people.

100% of event tickets were sponsored, allowing us to provide them to LGBTQIA+ youth free of charge.



EMERGING ARTISTS

We prioritised young people for paid performer opportunities, especially People of Colour, First Nations people and Trans and Gender Diverse people.



YOUTH WORKERS

All events were supported and supervised by trained youth workers.



DIVERSE EVENT TYPES

We catered to a diverse range of energies, including high-energy music events and low energy chill



DIGITAL AND IN PERSON

We maintain digital spaces for those who prefer or need them.













LGBTQIA+ EDUCATION

It's not enough to simply create our own safe spaces for LGBTQIA+ youth - we empower schools, families and workplaces with the tools to create LGBTQIA+ inclusive spaces too.

We do this through:

- → Free Digital Resources

EDUCATION SESSIONS

302 LGBTQIA+ Education Sessions were delivered this year.

Minus 18 provides industry-leading training on LGBTQIA+ inclusion, delivered by LGBTQIA+ presenters.

These sessions equip schools, services and workplaces across Australia with the skills needed to better understand and support the next generation of young people.

Each campaign has its unique focus. Here's how they went:



IDAHOBIT

We Go Rainbow on May 17, the International Day Against LGBTQIA+ Discrimination and start creating ongoing change. This year:

- → 5,568 Inclusion Activities held.
- → 1.2 million people attended in total.



WEAR IT PURPLE® DAY

We go purple on the last Friday in August to raise awareness for the disproportionate rates of bullying LGBTQIA+ young people still face. This year:

- → 3,052 Inclusion Activities held.
- → 612,497 people attended in total.



TRANS AWARENESS WEEK

Trans Awareness Week brings visibility to the experiences of the trans community, through story sharing, celebration and advocacy. This year:

- → 1,419 Inclusion Activities held.
- → 146,927 people attended in total.



This Is The Way We "Walk the Walk"

PRIDE PACKS

We sent 7,561 Pride Packs to help schools and workplaces build LGBTQIA+ inclusion.

Minus 18 creates Pride Packs containing everything needed to spread LGBTQIA+ inclusion in schools, workplaces and family homes. Whether it's posters, education cards, rainbow flags, or pronoun pins - Pride Packs make visible inclusion easy.


WHERE THE MONEY CAME FROM

Year-on-year revenue growth has slowed due to reduced giving amid economic challenges and Minus18's focus on program expansion and strategic initiatives.

Demand for paid LGBTQIA+ inclusion services also declined, with additional resources needed to support schools and workplaces in addressing resistance to DEI.

Grants remain steady at 18% of total revenue - while state and federal government grants accounts for less than 8% of total revenue.

Despite these challenges, sponsorship of youth programs has grown, now representing 18% of total revenue.




WHERE THE MONEY WAS SPENT

This year, we utilised our 2023 surplus in line with our 2023-2026 strategic plan, launching ambitious investments in youth and community programs. This included scaling up our program delivery teams, particularly in youth programs and education strategy.

In response to rising attacks on LGBTQIA+ youth and communities, we significantly invested in safety initiatives, including dedicated safety roles, security, risk mitigation, and psychosocial support.

Notably, consultancy and accounting expenses decreased as we built internal capacity through our new Business Services team.
