THE 2018 40 HOUR FAMINE

Children danced and celebrated in the streets of South Sudan when the country gained independence in 2011. But seven years on, these children's hopes and dreams have turned to despair as famine, drought and conflict robs them of the future they'd dreamed of.

Thousands of South Sudanese children just like us have fled for their lives across the border to Uganda, becoming refugees. They have travelled a long distance, many without parents or families. The things they've seen and experienced are hard to imagine and even harder to forget.

SOME ON RUNNING THE 40 HOUR FAMINE IN YOUR SCHOOL

Get the message out there: Make use of the free World Vision education resources on our website to help educate students on this year's 40 Hour Famine and why we're standing united with the children of South Sudan.

Use the videos and resources on our website and USB to promote the 40 Hour Famine through assembly, your school newsletter or website. Display the posters included in this pack around your school – you can download more from **famine.org.nz/resources**

Set up a time to hand out the 40 Hour Famine Sponsorship books and wristbands included with this pack. Keep track of students' names and fundraising on the Organiser Record Sheet. Encourage participants to sign up online at **famine.org.nz** so we can keep them up to date.

After the 40 Hour Famine weekend (8 - 10 June 2018, end of week 6, term 2), collect the Sponsorship books and fundraising - make sure everyone knows the fundraising can't make a difference if their donations are not returned.

Use the 2018 Deposit Book in your pack to bank your team's donations by **6 July 2018 (end of term 2)**. Alternatively you can transfer the funds to the World Vision 40 Hour Famine account: **06-0101-0323407-02.** Don't forget to include your reference number or school name so we can track your fundraising.

Once you've banked your funds, a certificate acknowledging your school's effort will be on its way! There's also a 40 Hour Famine Participant certificate available at **famine.org.nz/resources** which you can download and hand out to your students.
