## A MESSAGE FOR YOU

### A former sponsored child said to us recently, “When World Vision came to our village, everything changed”.

Some of those changes were obvious. Things like clean water coming from taps – radically reducing childhood illness and death. Like classrooms that could fit all the students. And like parents starting businesses and being able to provide for their families.

But some were less obvious. The belief and confidence the community built that it doesn't have to be the norm to have babies malnourished or children not getting a proper education.

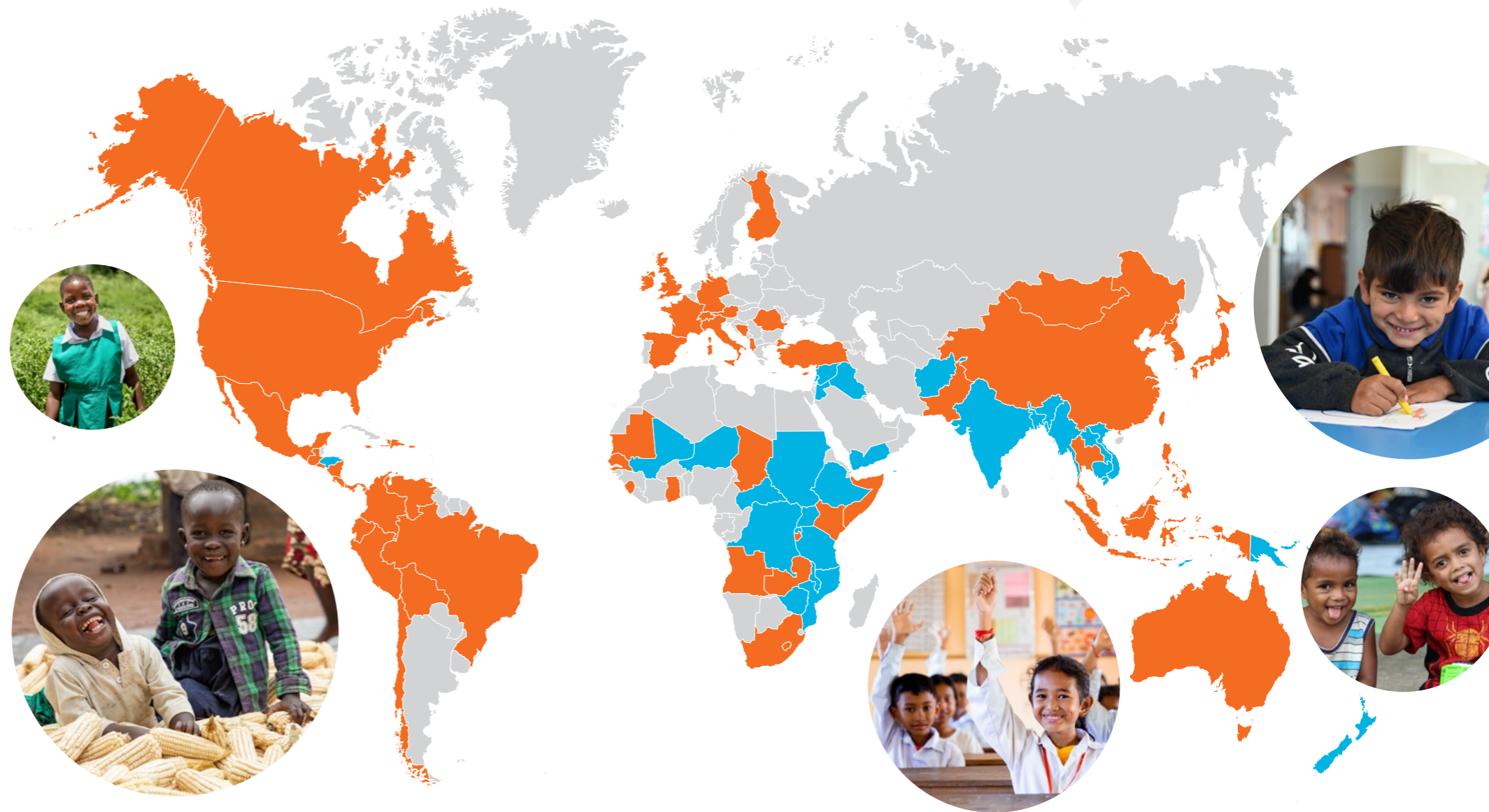
## You are helping the world's most vulnerable children to overcome poverty and experience fullness of life.

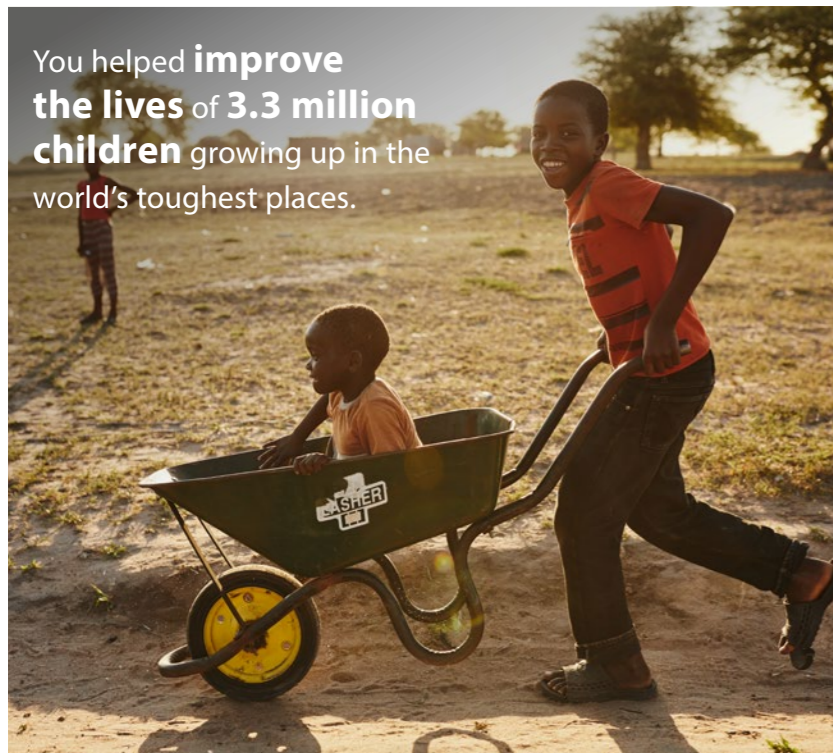

# YOUR EMERGENCY RESPONSE

## As children and families in Afghanistan faced heart-breaking hunger, you and others like you across Aotearoa unleashed your generosity in incredible ways.


Ruby may only be 8 years old, but she's already raised \$600 to help children in need in Afghanistan.

She set up a stall at her church with her brother Timmy, selling some of her precious possessions and marmalade, fudge, soaps and candles made by her granny. Ruby's community got right behind her.

"When kids stand up and say, 'we need to help people', adults are really inspired," says her proud mum Sarah.

Your kindness-in-action has been making a life-saving difference to children and families in Afghanistan. Since our Afghanistan Appeal in September 2021 following the change of government, you have helped:

 **120,000 people** with life-saving food

 **40,000 people** to access critical health and nutrition services, many of them girls and boys under the age of 5.

One-year-old Ahmad lives in a camp in Afghanistan with around 800,000 internally displaced people who fled their villages in search of food and safety.

His mum passed away when he was 10 days old and he was suffering badly from malnutrition. But thanks to supporters like you, he's now receiving life-saving food and starting to recover his health.

"This clinic is all the help that we get, and we are very grateful for it," says his grandma.

## YOU PARTNERED IN THE PACIFIC



### In Vanuatu, you helped launch a new project to protect women and children from violence, in partnership with the New Zealand Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade.

Because you cared, leaders like Roslyn are teaching men in correctional facilities with a history of violence how to build healthy and peaceful relationships.

“The most powerful part is when participants start to understand the impact of violence on their victims and develop empathy for women and children,” she says.

“I will make everything that I have learned a priority and will use it in my home to make sure that abuse does not happen again. My home will be safe for my family to live in,” says a father who graduated from the 11-week programme last year.

“In the past, I’ve wanted to talk about violence in my community but have been too frightened to talk about it with someone else,” says his wife. “I believe this programme is really good.”

## YOU ADVOCATED FOR CHANGE

### More than 37,000 Kiwis urged our government to end modern slavery in our supply chains.

Thousands of you signed a petition to say that no child or adult should be forced to work and that no matter where they live, people should be paid fairly, treated with dignity and be safe at work. You urged the government to pass a Modern Slavery Act. Some 116 Kiwi companies joined the cause. And the government listened!

Thanks to your efforts, the government is now looking into laws to stop slavery in our supply chains. Public consultations start soon. Together, we will make slavery in our products history!

## HELP FROM A FRIEND

### Thank you, Sanitarium Health Food Company, for being a business with a heart for young Kiwis and children in need.

Last year, more than 50,000 inspiring young Kiwis challenged themselves to raise funds and awareness for children suffering from extreme hunger through the World Vision 40 Hour Famine.

And for yet another year, Sanitarium Health Food Company jumped on board to support the next generation of change makers. They generously donated \$50,000 to encourage Kiwis to support young people in their fundraising efforts.

The funds were used in a 24-hour match challenge, meaning anyone who donated to a World Vision 40 Hour Famine participant in that time would have their donation matched by Sanitarium, up to \$50,000. That target was reached in less than 5 hours! An amazing \$128,357 was raised in the 24 hour period, thanks to Sanitarium.

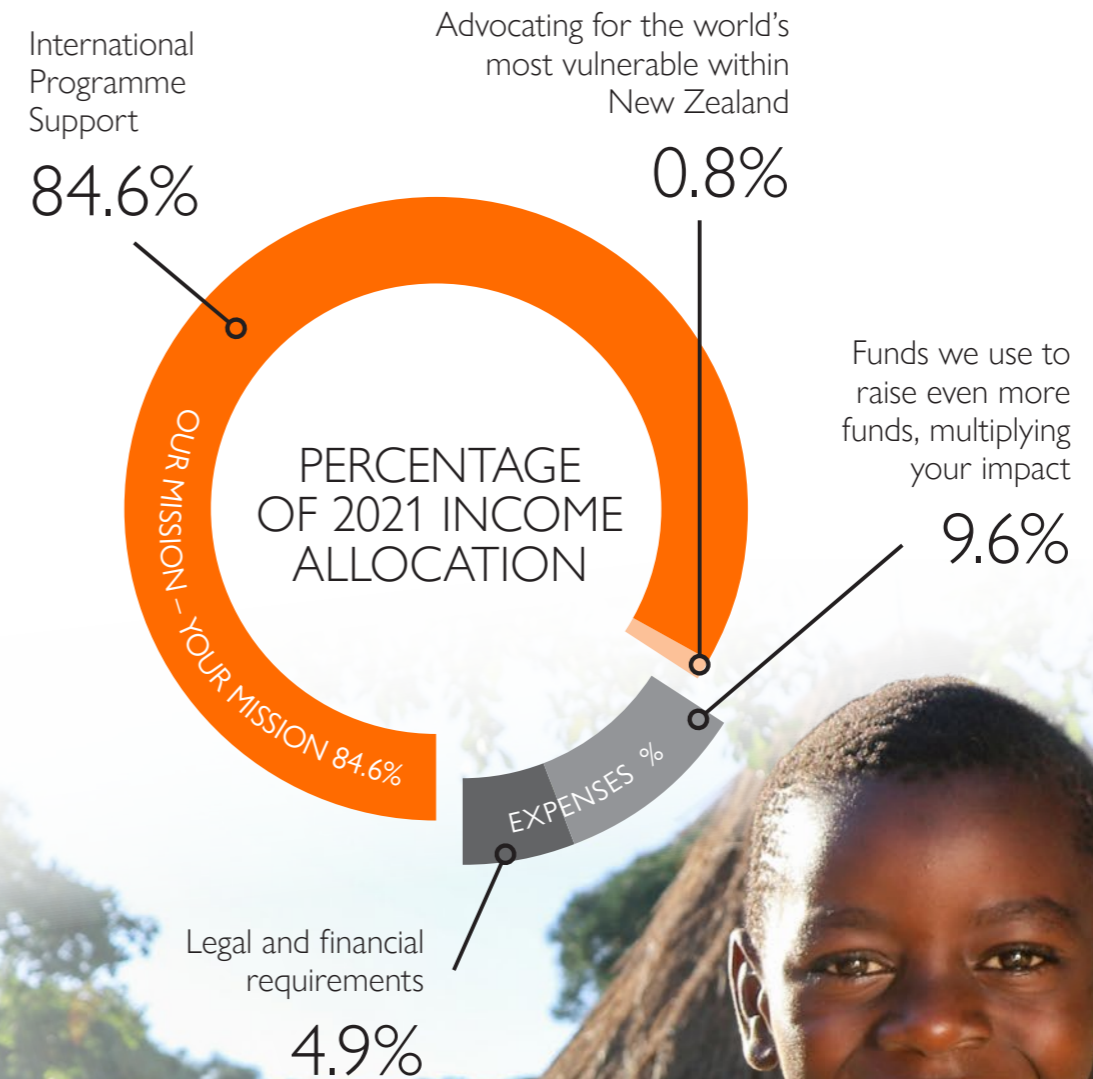
