A FANTASY OF LIFE AT HEIDE

Starring Nikki Shiels (*Home, I'm Darling*), this world premiere Melbourne Theatre Company commission is an audacious fantasy inspired by the stories and myths that surround Heide Museum of Modern Art founder Sunday Reed – the muse and mentor to a circle of artists including Sidney Nolan, Albert Tucker and Joy Hester.

Sunday Reed isn't like most women. In fact, she's not like most men. Outspoken, uninhibited, adventurous, she has a laser eye for the new – in life and in art. When struggling artist Sidney Nolan arrives at Heide, the idyllic utopia Sunday is creating with her beloved husband John Reed on the outskirts of 1940s Melbourne, what ensues will haunt all three to their dying days. And in the aftermath, Australian art will never look the same.

Award-winning playwright Anthony Weigh (2,000 Feet Away) creates a fantasy around this Melbourne icon that captures her passionate and unconventional spirit. Directed by Sarah Goodes (*The Sound Inside*) and also featuring Matt Day (*North by Northwest*) and Ratidzo Mambo (*The Heartbreak Choir*), *Sunday* is an unforgettable story of a bold and complex woman and the price she paid for living and loving on her own terms as a woman in mid-20th century Australia.

Written by Sydney-based former lawyer Suzie Miller, *Prima Facie* is a searing indictment of a legal system that consistently fails women. Reprising her award-winning role, Sheridan Harbridge performs as Tessa Ensler with passion and mesmerising conviction.

Tessa Ensler is a woman at the top of her game: a defence lawyer who commands the respect of her colleagues and clients, with a string of unbroken wins under her belt. She knows the law inside out; she trusts the law. But when she finds herself on the other side of the bench, facing the very system she once put her faith in, she quickly realises that something has to change.

Prima Facie premiered at Griffin Theatre in 2019, wowing audiences and winning widespread critical acclaim, as well as a Sydney Theatre Award for Harbridge and multiple awards for Miller – including the 2020 David Williamson Award for Outstanding Theatre Writing. With the original Griffin dream team of director Lee Lewis (Gloria) and Sheridan Harbridge (The Beast), this one-woman powerhouse performance demands to be seen.

A brilliant comedy about a woman ahead of her time, Bernhardt/Hamlet offers a timeless exploration of gender and equality.

Paris, 1899: renowned stage idol Sarah Bernhardt has grown out of the ingénue roles that made her famous. She needs a new challenge, and has set her sights on the only role worthy of the greatest actress of the century – Hamlet. It's a role that could make or break her and it's outrageous, of course. A woman? Playing the Prince of Denmark! But that's of no concern for Sarah. She's more interested in Shakespeare's poetry – it has to go, and the only man for the job is playwright Edmond Rostand, whom Sarah tasks with rewriting Hamlet.

Feisty and funny, Theresa Rebeck's *Bernhardt/Hamlet* is a play about theatre – making it, loving it and watching it. But above all, it is a witty celebration of the art of the stage and an imaginative exploration of a pivotal moment in theatre history.

The inimitable Judith Lucy takes on the role of Samuel Beckett's Winnie, the determined optimist in the face of an endless existential crisis. Acclaimed as one of the best plays ever written, *Happy Days* is an absurdist, tragicomic tour-de-force – that just happens to be a pitch-perfect commentary on our times.

Buried up to her waist, but never questioning why, Winnie is determined to carry on as best she can. Awoken by a piercing bell, she begins her day with a prayer before waking her husband, Willie. Willie does not share Winnie's predicament, but he is just as stuck. Despite the unrelenting sun and the limitations of her current – and eventually, sinking – situation, Winnie remains adamant that this is a happy day; these are all happy days.

A 20th-century classic, *Happy Days* was written more than 60 years ago but has never been more resonant, its absurdity acutely reflecting our reality. Making her Melbourne Theatre Company debut, actor and comedian Judith Lucy will team up with director Petra Kalive (*Laurinda*), making this Beckett masterpiece wildly funny, and not to be missed.

The widely acclaimed debut play from London Laureate and poetry slam champion Zia Ahmed, *I Wanna Be Yours*, is a modern-day romance that asks whether love really is all you need.

Haseeb and Ella meet at a performance workshop. From opposite sides of the Thames, he's a poet and she's an actor hired to help him with his enunciation. Their attraction is immediate. They start dating, get serious and fall in love. Soon there is each other's family and friends to navigate, and then big questions about the future – moving in together, marriage, children. Does it matter that Haseeb is British–Pakistani and Ella's a white girl from Yorkshire? Can their love surpass the cultural and physical boundaries between them?

Through short, striking vignettes, Zia Ahmed builds an authentic and insightful picture of contemporary, cross-cultural courtship. Ahmed's performance poetry background is evident in his evocative and playful use of language, imagery and symbolism, which combine for a delightful mix of humour, heartbreak and hope. A compelling and topical work of extraordinary vitality, this production of *I Wanna Be Yours* for MTC's Education and Families Program stars Oz Malik and is directed by Melbourne Theatre Company Resident Director Tasnim Hossain. It promises to be a powerful, lyrical and big-hearted night of theatre.

Award-winning playwright Declan Furber Gillick brings his bold and dynamic voice to Melbourne Theatre Company's mainstage for the first time with *Jacky*. A sharp, quick-witted play about family, community, work and culture, this ambitious world premiere examines the personal costs of navigating it all in contemporary Australia.

Jacky is a smart, enterprising young blackfella in the big city. He skilfully negotiates the gig economy, skipping neatly from office internships to cultural performances to sex work. Glenn is a white middle-aged record dealer, finalising a divorce and indulging a fantasy that leads him straight to Jacky. When Jacky's unemployable little brother Keith rolls into town, Jacky's carefully compartmentalised lives are set to collide. Will he tear at the seams, or can Keith hold him accountable and remind him what really matters?

Directed by Mark Wilson, this MTC NEXT STAGE Original follows Furber Gillick's multi-award winning play *Bighouse Dreaming* and features Helpmann Award winner Guy Simon (*Jasper Jones*) in the title role alongside Greg Stone (*A Doll's House, Part 2*). A whip-smart new work from a fresh Aboriginal voice, *Jacky* is a disarming and original play that asks what it takes to live a meaningful life.

Drawing on the ancient, the Spaghetti Western and Afropunk, Aleshea Harris's *Is God Is* packs an almighty wallop. Winner of the Obie Award for Playwriting and the American Playwriting Foundation's Relentless Award, it's an electrifying breath of fresh air that examines the insidious, cyclical nature of violence through a contemporary tale as old as time.

Twin sisters Racine and Anaia bear the scars of their deadbeat dad's long-ago brutal attack – an act of incendiary ruthlessness that left the girls' mother dead. Or so the twins believe ... until they receive a letter, beckoning them to their mama's bedside. Now that she is actually dying, she has but one task for her daughters – make your daddy dead.

Featuring Henrietta Amevor and Masego Pitso in its Australian premiere, *Is God Is* will be co-directed by Zindzi Okenyo (*An Ideal Husband*) and Shari Sebbens (*The Sapphires*), whose previous directorial collaboration, *seven methods of killing kylie jenner*, has been selling out seasons around the country. Bold, brash and darkly comic, *Is God Is* takes vengeance to levels that would make Greek tragedians proud.

Collaborating with singer, actor and composer Katie Weston (Falling Forward, Sugartown) and directed by Dean Bryant (Fun Home), they have crafted a heartwarming, uplifting and joyful musical that reminds us that there is always something to learn, no matter how old we are.

ONE EVENING, TWO SHORT PLAYS

An Obie Award-winner several times over, Caryl Churchill (*Top Girls*) is widely considered one of the world's greatest living playwrights. In this world-first theatrical experience, Melbourne Theatre Company Artistic Director Anne-Louise Sarks directs two separate Caryl Churchill works: *What If If Only*, the micro-meditation on grief and possibility starring Alison Bell; and *Escaped Alone*, a visionary play starring Helen Morse about afternoon tea and the apocalypse.

In Escaped Alone, a woman joins her three neighbours for an afternoon of swapping memories and sharing secrets, in between the telling of catastrophic events, bleak but blackly humorous. In What If If Only, a partner laments their lost love and conjures up countless possible futures, with and without love. In both works, the characters' hopes, fears and dreams are palpable, visceral and remarkable.

Showcasing the dazzling alchemy of Churchill's writing, these two short works are separate plays that share some deep thematic parallels. Their combination in Sarks's hands promises a profound, surreal, funny and thrilling theatrical experience.

Against the backdrop of 1950s and 60s suburban Melbourne and in the wake of the Second World War, multi-award-winning writer Patricia Cornelius delivers a poetic, heart-rending tale that unpacks the shadow of war, and the trauma it leaves behind.

The youngest of Jack and Martha's five children, Christine idolises her father, especially his stories of wartime heroics. She cannot understand why her siblings – Jill, Johnnie and twins Door and Mouse – don't share her love for their dad. Jill, meanwhile doesn't understand why their mum puts up with him. As Christine watches on, one by one her siblings start to rebel against the tumultuous environment they are growing up in. Once fascinated by her father's war stories, they slowly start to lose their shine as the conflict in Vietnam intensifies and war once again becomes front of mind for the family.

Adapted from her own novel for the stage, *My Sister Jill* is an MTC NEXT STAGE Original from one of Australia's most revered writers. Working with her long-time collaborator Susie Dee (their previous collaboration, *SHIT*, was celebrated at the Teatro Biennale di Venezia in 2019) and starring Sophie Ross (*What Rhymes with Cars and Girls*), Patricia Cornelius has crafted a moving family drama that elegantly captures the spirit and struggle of a generation of Australians postworld war. A compelling and ultimately hopeful coming-of-age story, it has all the makings of an Australian classic.

Zahra Newman stars as the great Billie Holiday in an extraordinary showcase of acting and vocal mastery. Featuring several of Holiday's most beloved songs amid a personal, spoken-word tour of her life, Lady Day at Emerson's Bar & Grill is an iconic and intimate snapshot of one of the world's most revered jazz voices.

March, 1959, around midnight. The one and only Billie Holiday – known widely as Lady Day – is on stage in a small, run-down bar in South Philadelphia. Struggling with addiction and ill health, the audience is about to witness one of her final shows, singing a selection of her most loved hits. Accompanied by a jazz trio, Holiday shares a collection of revealing anecdotes about her life.

Be in the room with Lady Day as the Fairfax Studio transforms into a cabaret venue, with Newman (*Miss Julie*) embodying the jazz great and singing many of her most iconic songs – among them 'God Bless the Child', 'What a Little Moonlight Can Do', 'Somebody's on My Mind' and 'Strange Fruit'. Directed by Mitchell Butel, it promises to take audiences back in time to an electrifying night in the life of an extraordinary woman.
