Hailed a 'brilliantly tense' (The Independent) triumph in its celebrated West End run, this witty interrogation of identity, power and integrity conjures a real encounter from Poitier's past, ten years before he would become the first Black man to win the Best Actor Oscar. Retrograde exposes the racial fault lines beneath Hollywood's glossy facade and the choices faced by those who dared to cross them.

Told with wicked humour and deep emotional truth, Before I Forget celebrates the strength of an ancestral line steered by a revered and accomplished matriarch determined to hold on to her legacy as her memory slips away. This compelling new work is a testimony to healing, forgiveness and the unconditional love of family.

Faith Wells (Roxanne McDonald), a prominent First Nations linguist, activist and academic, has spent her life being fiercely independent - until now. As Faith's dementia escalates, her daughter Karma (Melodie Reynolds-Diarra) finds herself in the unwinnable position of relocating Faith into aged care and selling her home to fund it. Joined by her daughter, Hope (Tyallah Bullock), who is dealing with her own personal struggles, Karma faces the unstoppable force of her mother, who refuses to go quietly.

As boxes are packed and memories picked over, the women are forced to navigate the fraying edges of their lineage as they reckon with the loss not just of a mother, but a cultural leader.




