1. What is Model United Nation (MUN)?

The United Nations are an international body comprising of representatives from different countries to deal with the problems of our world. A MUN is a platform for the students to experience the task of being a delegate representing their allotted country to tackle the agenda of the committee.

2. What are the benefits of registering for the SIESGST MUN?

SIESGST MUN presents you with an opportunity to overcome any fears of public speaking and showcase your prowess over the current happenings around the globe. It provides you with a platform to learn and grow in the art of diplomacy and negotiation.

3. What skills will I need to participate?

As a delegate it is important to have done proper research on the committee. You could improve your confidence by practicing in front of a small audience.

4. What do I need to prepare?

Researching is the first and most important step in preparing for a conference. Not only is it necessary to have a grasp on information about the country you are

representing and its position on the policies being discussed, it is also important to understand the UN body that your committee is representing.

5. What should I research about the Committee?

It is very important to have researched the purpose, power, membership and procedure of the committee.

6. Will I be required to present a Position Paper at the start of the conference?

Yes, it is recommended that a position paper be prepared for the conference. Before attending a conference, it is necessary to have a clear understanding about the workings of your country, as well as its position on the issues that are being discussed. Position papers should contain your country's relation to the topic, as well as its suggestions for how to solve the issues discussed.

7. What are the tips to perform well in an MUN as a first timer?

The first step is to have to done proper research on the agenda, which you could note down in a notebook for reference. Frame your points and speeches in such a way that it highlights the issues that matter the most to your country or your position. Speeches that try to cover too many ideas at the same time are incoherent, hence focus on one idea at a time. Most importantly, do not get nervous. Ask questions if you do not understand something.

8. What should I wear?

Since you will be representing your country at an International platform, the dress code will be strictly formal attire. Abiding by the UN convention, you can also wear the national attire of the country you are representing.

9. What is the code of conduct during a MUN?

The language spoken/written should always be respectful. No foul language or aggressive behaviour will be accepted. The contestants need to be courteous and polite towards other teams and moderators. No use of photos, videos or audios will be allowed unless approved by the chairperson in advance.

10. Who all can participate?

Students pursuing their bachelor's degree in any field, recently graduated or students who are in their F.Y.J.C/S.Y.J.C can participate. Age limit of the participants is 25 years. It is compulsory to bring you college ID on the day of the event.
