A community is a group of people with a common interest or who share the same environment or locality.

Examples of communities are villages, towns, tribes, clans.

People in a community might share the same religion or profession, e.g., the Christian or church community.



Identification of the names of community leaders.

For a community to function properly, it must have leaders. Leaders In different communities are called different names.

- In a Yoruba community, the leader is called an Oba,
- Eze or Obi or Igwe in Igboland,
- Olu in Itsekiri, Oba in Benin,
- Obong in Efik/Ibibio,

- Ovie in Warri,
- Amayanabo/Amananaowei in Ijaw,
- Serki or Emir or Sultan in Hausa/Fulani

Identification of the names of community leaders.

- Other communities, like the church community, also have name for their leaders, e.g
- Pope or Bishop (Catholics),
- Prelate, Primate(Anglicans, Methodists),
- Pastor(Pentecostals),
- Imam (Muslims) etc.

Identification of the names of community leaders.

- Apart from the school, church and ethnic community leaders, other leaders also exist.
- For a country, the President is the leader,
- For a state, we have the governors,
- Chairmen for local governments
- We also have senators, members of House of representatives.

Ways of sustaining relationship in the community Rom 13: 1-7.

- Respect for elders and leaders.
- Obeying the laws of the land.
- Participate in community development programmes
- Caring for the needy and religious tolerance. Mtt.25:31-46.
 Relationship in the Church.
- Love your Christian brothers and sister etc. Rom.12:9-21. -

Maintaining relationship in the church; (Romans 12: 9-21):

St Paul urged the Roman Christian community:

- 1. To love one another and hate evil
- 2. To honour all members of the church
- 3. Not to be lazy at work
- 4. To receive visitors into our home joyfully
- 5. To be at peace with everyone

- 6. To be kind to those who hurt them
- 7. To love as Christ loved them

We too should conduct ourselves in the ways above.



Maintaining relationship in the church 1 Pt. 3:8-13

We can maintain good relationship with our Christian brethren in the ways highlighted by St Peter (1 Peter 3:8-13):


- 1. Unity of spirit
