THE MEANING OF MARRIAGE - GEN. 2:22 –25

- '.....and the rib which the LORD God had taken from the man he made into a woman and brought her to the man. ²³ Then the man said,
- "This at last is bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh; she shall be called Woman,
 because she was taken out of Man.
- Therefore a man leaves his father and his mother and cleaves to his wife, and they become one flesh. ²⁵ And the man and his wife were both naked, and were not ashamed.'

THE MEANING OF MARRIAGE - EPH. 5:21-31.

"For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh."



MEANING OF MARRIAGE

 Marriage is the union of a man and a woman directed towards the procreation and upbringing of children

■ There is no such thing as same-sex marriage

TYPES OF MARRIAGE.

- Statutory marriage/Marriage by ordinance
- Traditional marriage
- Religious marriage



STATUTORY MARRIAGE/MARRIAGE BY ORDINANCE

- Marriage according to civil law
- Does not admit of polygamy
- Carried out before a magistrate or a local government official
- Involves the exchange of ring

TRADITIONAL MARRIAGE

- Marriage according to the tradition of the bride
- Involves bride price contained in a list provided in a lip provided by the bride's family
- Carried out in the home or hometown of the bride
- Conducted by an elder in the family



RELIGIOUS MARRIAGE

- Marriage according to ones religion
- This is where Christian marriage falls under



CHRISTIAN MARRIAGE

- Marriage according to the laws of God
- One man, one wife
- Involves the exchange of rings as a sign of fidelity
- Involves the exchange of vows
- Vows are bounding until the death of one or both of the couples
