A consonant cluster is a group or sequence of consonants that appear together in a syllable without a vowel between them. When two consonants appear next to each other it is called a consonant cluster. Consonant cluster before a vowel is called onset while the one after a vowel is called, coda

Onset consonant clusters may occur in two or three initial consonants, in which three are referred to as CCC, while coda consonant clusters can occur in two- to four-consonant groups.
