## **Entrepreneurial Perspective – Tracy Stanhoff**

Tribal governments may use SSBCI funds to support eligible small business financing on tribal lands, small businesses in states where tribal lands or tribal members are located, and small businesses owned by tribal members anywhere within the United States.

In addition - State government SSBCI program funds can be deployed in Indian Country or to support Native American businesses.

Tribal governments may also want to determine what resources are available to through federal partners who have been specifically designated assist Native American business-owners, such as the Procurement Technical Assistance Centers and Small Business Development Centers.
