

Dear Tribal Leaders,

The excitement is building for the historic 20th Anniversary Sovereignty Run, and NCAI is calling on all who believe in defending our sovereignty, getting out the Native Vote, continued awareness of Boarding School issues and celebrating our successful partnership with <u>Bright Path Strong</u> for the International Olympic Committee's reinstatement of Jim Thorpe's 1912 winning records for his Gold Medals. These issues will be highlighted along the route of the run which will begin in Tahlequah, Oklahoma, on October 3, 2022 and conclude at this year's 79th Annual NCAI Convention & Marketplace in Sacramento, California, on October 31.

As you can imagine, the planning and logistics for an event which spans five states and over 1,800 miles is an enormous task; however, we know **Indian Country is strongest when we work together.** We humbly ask for your partnership and hope you will join us in making this a truly memorable, celebrated, and successful event.

As such, we are asking Indian Country to help this cause with any financial sponsorship (preferred) or in-kind support (welcomed and appreciated) that your Tribal Nation may afford to give.

As this run moves through Oklahoma, Texas, New Mexico, Arizona and California, there are many other ways to provide support for the event. Additionally, hotel rooms for runners and those supporting the efforts on the ground are also needed.

NCAI 20th Anniversary Sovereignty Run

In 2002, Tribal Nations, leaders, and Indian Country advocates embarked upon a <u>cross-country</u> <u>run</u> from Washington state to Washington, DC to speak up against harmful Supreme Court precedents restricting tribal jurisdictions. Now, twenty years later, the National Congress of American Indians is reviving this powerful journey to meet the call of today's pressing challenges to tribal sovereignty.

The first week of October will mark the beginning of a 1,787-mile relay from Oklahoma to California geared to unite Tribal Nations, partners, and allies in heightening awareness and support of tribal sovereignty on a national level. This Sovereignty Run will be led by Fawn Sharp, the National Congress of American Indians (NCAI) President and Vice-President of the Quinault Indian Nation, and will include participants from Tribal Nations, Native organizations, and other partners.

Why Run for Tribal Sovereignty?

Twenty years ago, the mission was to speak out against harmful precedents restricting tribal jurisdiction. This year, organizers were moved to action by another Supreme Court ruling negatively impacting tribal sovereignty—<u>Castro-Huerta v. Oklahoma</u>.

Inits ruling, the Court held that "the Federal Government and the State have concurrent jurisdiction to prosecute crimes committed by non-Indians against Indians in Indian country" which strikes against tribal sovereignty and jurisdiction to protect tribal citizens. The consequences of the decision–for Tribal Nations, the federal government, and states–will take time to unravel.

Inspired by the recent history-making <u>reinstatement</u> of athletic great Jim "Bright Path" Thorpe's (Sac and Fox Nation and Potawatomi) 1912 Olympic Gold Medals winning records, Tribal Nations will once again run to raise awareness for sovereign rights. Oklahoma was chosen as the starting point this year in honor of Jim Thorpe who hailed from Oklahoma, and in response to the Supreme Court's decision that had a significant impact on Tribal Nations there.
