## CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- Made 15 FGs in a three-game span [5 for 5 at Chi. (12/3/17); 4 for 4 at Houston (12/10/17); 6 for 6 vs. Ten. (12/17/17)]. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Gould is the 1st player in NFL history to make 15 FGs in the three-game span.
- In 2017, made 5-or-more FGs in three games [5 for 5 at Arz. (10/1); 5 for 5 at Chi. (12/3); 6 for 6 vs. Ten. (12/17)]. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is 1 of 3 players in NFL history to make 5-or-more FGs in three different games in a single season, joining Min. K Rich Karlis [7 for 7 vs. LAN (11/5/89); 5 for 5 vs. Atl. (12/10/89); 5 for 6 vs. Cin. (12/25/89)] and KC K Harrison Butker [5 for 5 at Hou. (10/8/17); 5 for 5 vs. Den. (10/30/17); 5 for 6 vs. Mia. (12/24/17)].
- Ranks 5th in NFL history in career FG pct. (86.9) (min. 100 FGM).

## GOULD'S GOLDEN NUGGETS

- His last name is pronounced GOLD.
- Ranks as the Chicago Bears franchise leader in total scoring (1,207 points), made FGs (276), made FGs of 50-or-more yds. (23) and FG pct. (85.4).
- In seven career postseason games, has converted 8 of 8 FGs and 20 of 20 PATs.
- Founded The Goulden Touch Foundation in 2011 to help those in need. An avid golfer, he has hosted charity golf events through his foundation. In June of 2017, the Goulden Touch Foundation held two golfing events that benefiting the Ann & Robert H. Lurie Children's Hospital of Chicago in addition to the raising of funds in Gould's hometown of Lock Haven, PA.
- Named the recipient of the 49ers 2017 Perry/Yonamine Unity Award which is presented to the 49ers player who exhibits an exceptional commitment to promoting unity within the team and in their community. The Perry/Yonamine Unity Award is named for the former 49ers players and pioneers of unity and diversity, Joe "The Jet" Perry and Wally Yonamine, and is voted on by the players.



- Finished the 2017 season with a career-high 145 points. His 145 points ranks 2nd in franchise history for most points in a season.

- Connected on a career-high 6 FGs (38, 48, 28, 50, 48 & 45) vs. Ten. (12/17/17), including the game-winning 45-yd. FG as time expired. His 6 made FGs tied the 49ers franchise record for most made field goals in a single game [K Ray Wersching - 10/16/83 at NO (6 for 6); K Jeff Wilkins - 9/29/96 vs. Atl. (6 for 6)].



## CAREER HIGHLIGHTS (CONTINUED)

- Has made at least 1 FG in 20 consecutive games, dating back to 12/11/16, marking the 2nd longest stretch of his career. He made a FG in 22 consecutive games from 10/23/05 through 11/26/06.
- Ranks as the Bears franchise leader in scoring (1,207 points), made FGs (276), 50-or-more yd. made FGs (23), consecutive made FGs (26) and FG pct. (85.4 pct.).
- Between 12/18/05 vs. Atl. and 9/22/13 at Pit., Gould converted 275 consecutive PATs, the longest streak in Bears franchise history.
- Set the Bears franchise record with 26 consecutive made FGs across the 2005 and 2006 seasons [12/25/05 - 11/19/06].
- In 2015, set a Bears single-season franchise record with 33 made FGs. He broke the record of 32 made FGs, which he set in 2006.
- Converted a 58-yd. FG vs. Cin. (9/8/13), the longest made FG in Bears franchise history.
- In 2015, established a Chicago single-season franchise record with 7 made FGs of 50-or-more yds. He previously set the record in 2011 with 6 made FGs of 50-or-more yds.
- From 12/20/15 to 10/15/17, Gould made 32 consecutive FGs, the longest streak of consecutive made FGs of his career. His previous longest streak was 26 consecutive made FGs from 11/25/05 to 11/19/06, as a member of the Chicago Bears.
- In 2017, made each of his first 15 FGAs on the season, setting the 49ers franchise record for most made FGs to start a season. The previous record was held by K Wade Richey (13 FGs in 1999).
- Connected on a 40-yd. FG at Ind. (10/8/17), becoming the 31st player in NFL history to make 300 FGs in his career.

## GOLDMINE

- During all Week 13 games in 2017, NFL players had the chance to share the causes that are important to them as part of the NFL's My Cause, My Cleats campaign. "Supporting the Lurie Children's Hospital allows me to help children and families going through difficult times," said Gould. "My message to those battling illness: Tackles your fears and fulfill your dreams!"



## GOLDMINE (CONTINUED)

- As part of the 49ers annual Thanksgiving celebrations, Gould and his teammates visited Cityteam San Jose to serve a holiday feast to over 300 people in need. Guests enjoyed turkey along with all of the usual holiday sides, while getting to know the 49ers.



- Founded The Goulden Touch Foundation in 2011, which has partnered with several key organizations in education, social services, health and wellness, and medical research to help those in need. Annually, The Golden Touch hosts the Windy City Kicker Golf Classic in Gould's hometown area of Clinton County, PA and has raised over \$285,000 for Clinton County area programs. In 2016, Gould hosted a Celebrity Golf Invitational, which raised over \$940,000 for The Ann & Robert H. Lurie Children's Hospital of Chicago.



- Following 11 seasons with the Chicago Bears, Gould formed a special bond with the city of Chicago. Despite being removed from the city for more than a year, the Chicago Cubs invited him to throw out the ceremonial first pitch and sing the seventh inning stretch in July of 2017.



- In 2012, The Goulden Touch launched its annual event, "Kicking Hunger," which provides meals and raises funds for the Northern Illinois Food Bank. To date, The Goulden Touch has raised over 36,000 meals for their backpack program.

## 2017 (SAN FRANCISCO)

- Played in all 16 games and connected on 39 of 41 FGAs and 28 of 30 PATs. He set career highs in points (145), made FGs (39) and FG pct. (95.1 - min. 16 atts.).
- His 39 made FGs ranks 2nd in franchise history for most made FGs in a season (K David Akers - 44 made FGs in 2011).
- Dating back to 10/29/17, has made 23 consecutive FGs, the 2nd-longest streak in franchise history [K Phil Dawson - 27 consecutive FGs (10/6/13 through 12/29/13)].
- Made each of his first 15 FGAs on the season, setting the franchise record for most made FGs to start a season. The previous record was held by K Wade Richey (13 FGs in 1999).
- Connected on FGs from 49, 39, 47, 48 and 23 yds. at Arz. (10/1). It marked his 1st career game with 5 made FGs and he is the 1st 49ers kicker to make 5-or-more FGs in a single game since K Phil Dawson (5-5) vs. KC (10/5/14).
- Made all three FGAs (28, 43 and 40) at Ind. (10/8). His 40-yd. FG marked his 300th made FG in his career.
- In his first game back in Chicago, tied his career high at the time with 5 made FGs [5-5 at Arz. (10/1/17)], including the 24-yd. game-winning FG with 0:04 left in the game at Chi. (12/3). He became the 1st player to make 5 FGs at Soldier Field since 12/28/12 (Car. K Justin Medlock - 5 for 5).
- Made a career-high 6 FGs on the day (38, 48, 28, 50, 48 & 45) vs. Ten. (12/17), including the game-winning 45-yd. FG as time expired. His 6 made FGs tied the franchise record for most made field goals in a single game [K Ray Wersching - 10/16/83 at NO (6 for 6); K Jeff Wilkins - 9/29/96 vs. Atl. (6 for 6)].

## 2016 (NEW YORK GIANTS)

- Signed with the Giants on 10/20, where he finished the season converting each of his 10 FGAs along with 20 of 23 PATs.
- Connected on all 4 FGAs (35, 35, 29 & 41 yds.) at Phi. (12/22), as well as 1 PAT.

## 2015 (CHICAGO)

- Made 33 of 39 FGAs (84.6 pct.), including 7 of 9 from 50-or-more yds. in addition to 28 of 29 PATs for a total of 127 pts.
- Broke the Bears franchise single-season record for FGM (33) and FGM of 50-or-more yds. (7).
- Extended his franchise record with his 10th season with 20-or-more FGM.
- With 2 FGM (44 & 30) at KC (10/11), set the record for most pts. in franchise history.

## 2014 (CHICAGO)

- Appeared in 12 games, making 9 of 12 FGAs (75.0 pct.) and 28 of 29 PATs for 55 pts.
- Converted a 38-yd. FG with 8:41 remaining in OT to give his team a 23-20 win vs. Bal. (11/17).

## 2013 (CHICAGO)

- Tied his franchise single-season record, making 89.7 pct. of his FGAs (26 of 29) in 16 games played. Added 45 of 46 PATs for a total of 123 pts. scored.
- Connected on 3 of 4 FGAs of 50-or-more yds. vs. Cin. (9/18), including a franchise-record for longest FGM (58 yds.).

## 2012 (CHICAGO)

- Converted 21 of 25 FGAs (84.0 pct.) and 33 of 33 PATs for a team-leading 96 points in 13 games played.
- Made a game-winning 41-yd. FG as time expired to give his team a 23-22 win vs. Car. (10/28). The FG also marked the 200th FGM of his career.
- Connected on 3 of 3 FGs and 6 of 6 PATs for a season-high 15 points at Ten. (11/4).

## 2011 (CHICAGO)

- Led Bears in scoring with 121 points for the 7th consecutive season after connecting on 28 of 32 FGAs (87.5 pct.) and 37 of 37 PATs in 16 games played.
- Set a then-franchise record with a 57-yd. FG at Den. (12/11), his longest FG of the season.

## 2010 (CHICAGO)

- Appeared in all 16 games and connected on 25 of 30 FGAs (83.3 pct.) and 35 of 35 PATs to lead the team in scoring with 110 points.
- Converted a game-winning 19-yd. FG with 3:59 remaining in the 4th Qtr. to give his team a 20-17 win vs. GB (9/27).

## 2009 (CHICAGO)

- Made 24 of 28 FGAs (85.7 pct.) and all 33 PATs to lead the Bears in scoring with 105 points, his 4th consecutive 100-or-more point season.
- Converted a 44-yd. FG with :15 remaining to give his team a 17-14 win vs. Pit. (9/20).

## 2008 (CHICAGO)

- Connected on 26 of 29 FGs for a franchise-best 89.7 pct., breaking the record he previously set in 2006.
- Led the Bears in scoring with 119 points, his 3rd consecutive 100-or-more point season.
- Kicked a 35-yd. FG in OT vs. NO (12/11), his 4th career game-winning kick in OT.
- The following week, he became the 4th player in NFL history to make game-winning field goals in OT in consecutive weeks, knocking through a 38-yd. FG in OT vs. GB (12/22).

## 2007 (CHICAGO)

- Led the Bears and ranked 4th in the NFC in scoring with 126 points, his 2nd consecutive 100-or-more point season. Converted 31 of 36 FGAs (86.1 pct.) and 33 of 33 PATs in 16 games played.
- His 31 FGs tied for the most in the NFC (GB K Mason Crosby - 31 FGs) and ranked tied for 2nd in the NFL (Ten. K Rob Bironas - 35 FGs).
- Connected on 3 of 3 FGAs and 4 of 4 PATs for a season-high 13 points vs. Den. (11/25). including a 39-yd. FG in OT to give his team a 37-34 win.



## 2006 (CHICAGO)

- Earned his 1st Pro Bowl selection and was First-Team All-Pro after finishing 2nd overall in the NFL in scoring with 143 points. He converted 32 of 36 FGAs (88.9 pct.) and 47 of 47 PATs.
- Tied for NFL lead with 32 FGs (StL K Jeff Wilkins - 32 FGs) and connected on franchise record 24-consecutive field goals to start the season.
- Connected of 4 of 4 FGAs [42, 43, 32 and 41 yds.] and 4 of 4 PATs for a career-high 16 points vs. Buf. (10/8).
- Made a 25-yd. FG with 3:37 remaining in OT to give his team a 34-31 win vs. TB (12/17).
- Converted a 49-yd. FG in OT vs. Sea. (1/14/07 - NFC - D) to give his team a 27-24 win.

## 2005 (CHICAGO)

- Signed with the Bears on 10/8 and converted 21 of 27 FGAs (71.8 pct.) and 19 of 20 PATs for a total of 82 points, becoming the 1st Bears rookie to lead the team in scoring since Paul Edinger in 2000.
- Appeared in his 1st NFL game at Cle. (10/9) and converted his 1st att. from 44-yds. in the 2nd Qtr.
- Made a 28-yd. FG with :06 remaining in the 4th Qtr. to give his team a 20-17 win at NO (11/6).

## COLLEGE

Appeared in 47 games for the Nittany Lions and scored 232 points, connecting on 39 of 61 FGAs and 115 of 121 PATs. Finished his collegiate career ranked 5th on Penn State's all-time scoring list. As a senior, played in 11 games, hitting 7 of 13 FGAs and 22 of 23 PATs for 43 points. In 2003, was named one of two recipients of the Frank Patrick Memorial Total Commitment Award, which is presented annually to a junior who dutifully complete responsibilities in all facets of the football program and do so in an exemplary manner. Appeared in 12 games and scored 49 points, connecting on 9 of 16 FGAs and 22 of 24 PATs. As a sophomore, played in 13 games and hit 17 of 22 FGAs and 42 of 45 PATs for 93 points. In 2001, played in 11 games and scored 47 points, connecting on 6 of 10 FGAs and all 29 PATs.

- Attended Central Mountain (Lock Haven, PA) HS, where he won 3 letters each in soccer, football and basketball and another in track.
- Son of Robert and Cheryl Gould, and has one brother, Christopher, who was a punter/placekicker at the University of Virginia and is currently the assistant special teams coach for the Denver Broncos.
- His father, Robert, was a three-time All-American soccer player who led Lock Haven University to a Division II national championship in 1980 and played professionally for the St. Louis Steamers (1980-83).
